

Monthly update – North Strathfield

29 April 2024

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, link new communities to rail services and support employment growth and housing supply.

Acciona Ferrovial Joint Venture (AFJV) has been awarded the contract to deliver 11 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate five new metro stations, including a station at North Strathfield.

Work during May

Work will continue within and around the North Strathfield Metro Station site during May. The main activities will include:

- Nozzle lining at the northern and southern ends of the station box
- Installation of graphics on hoarding around the site boundary
- Installation of tunnel boring machine services
- Removal of excavator platform decks
- Construction of tunnel boring machine traverse slabs and floor blinding
- Delivery and removal of oversized equipment
- CCTV of sewer mains on Queen Street between Gracemere Street and Nelson Road
- Taking readings from previously installed groundwater boreholes

This work will be carried out during standard construction hours:

- Monday to Friday 7am – 6pm and Saturday 8am – 6pm

Work outside standard construction hours

Some of the utility work, extended concrete pours, formwork construction and lining, demobilisation of plant, hoarding graphics installation and maintenance, as well as oversized deliveries, must be undertaken outside standard construction hours to minimise impacts on traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers. Night work will be carried out on no more than two consecutive nights, no more than three nights per week and no more than 10 nights per month at any one location.

This night work will continue to occur in the work area shown on the map overleaf between **6pm and 5am on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday nights from Monday 6 May until Friday 31 May 2024.**

What to expect

- There may be some noise associated with the work, but we will try to minimise this as much as possible
- Property and business access will be maintained at all times
- Noise blankets will be used to minimise disturbance during night work
- There will be no disruption to supply of utility services
- Saw cutting and hammering work will be completed by midnight for night work

Equipment used


Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to: trucks, light vehicles, excavators, rattle guns, watercarts, concrete saws, bobcats, jack hammers, vacuum trucks, cranes, elevated work platforms, concrete trucks and pumps, street sweeper and hand tools.

Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes

Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists at entry and exit points to the construction site. The CCTV work taking place in the surrounding streets will require some temporary footpath closures. Traffic control will be in place so access and two-way traffic can be maintained. At times electronic variable message signs will be used to advise motorists of changed traffic conditions and these may temporarily occupy parking spaces.

On **Monday 20 May between 9pm and 5am only**, Queen Street will be closed between Wellbank and Pomeroy streets for crane lifts of the HV Kiosk and equipment. Local access will be maintained. Detours will be in place via Wellbank Street, Concord Road and Beronga Street. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists.
