

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services start in 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms under Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

Local communities are the focal point in Sydney Metro planning, designing and managing public spaces. Through urban design principles and place making, Sydney Metro stations will be more than somewhere to catch the train; they will be the centre of the communities through a variety of uses. Sydney Metro will work closely with communities on how to best integrate station development and deliver stations and buildings that are thriving, welcoming hubs for everyone to enjoy.

Out-of-hours utility investigations

Utility investigations are required to confirm the location of underground infrastructure surrounding the Crows Nest Station site to assist with the early planning process of the over station development (see map overleaf). Due to high daytime traffic volumes and the need to ensure pedestrian safety, investigations will be done outside standard construction hours between 9pm and 5am each night (except Friday and Saturday) from **Sunday 17 March 2019** for approximately 2 weeks, weather and site conditions permitting.

Work will involve:

- Partial road closures and pedestrian changes
- Opening the pavement with concrete saws
- Excavating trenches
- Recording underground infrastructure location
- Reinstatement of the work area.

Standard working hours

Standard working hours are Monday to Friday, 7am–6pm and Saturday, 8am–1pm, however this work will be done between 9pm and 5am each night (except Friday and Saturday).

What to expect

- Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- Some of the activities are expected to be noisy, the team will minimise impacts where possible.
- Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times.
- Parking may be temporarily restricted in some locations.
- There will be no impact to utility services in the area.
