

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services start in 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms under Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

The T3 Bankstown Line is being upgraded and converted to metro standards between Sydenham and Bankstown with all stations to be fully accessible with lifts and level access between platforms and trains. The upgrade of the T3 Bankstown Line to metro standards received planning approval on 19 December 2018.

Geotechnical investigations

Geotechnical investigations including surface scanning, underground digging and drilling will be carried out as follows:

New work

New work will involve:

- Scanning and digging for underground services
- Drilling of boreholes for geotechnical sampling and testing

Out of Hours Works

Due to high daytime traffic volumes and the need to ensure worker safety, geotechnical works on the Hume Highway from 5 to 7 May 2019 will need to be completed outside of standard construction hours, from 11pm to 5am.

What to expect

- Equipment will include hand held scanning equipment, drilling rigs and vacuum trucks
- Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community
- Access to the rail corridor will be via existing rail corridor gates along the alignment
- Access to car parks and driveways will be maintained at all times.
