

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms under Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

The upgrade of the T3 Bankstown Line to metro standards received planning approval on 19 December 2018.

Throughout September, early work will continue along the Bankstown Line between Sydenham and Campsie stations (weather and site conditions permitting).

Bridge crossing work

We will be installing underground services to the bridge crossing located on **Albermarle Street, Marrickville**. Work activities include concrete sawing on the road and trenching at the road crossing. Equipment such as hand tools, fork lift, concrete truck, vacuum truck and excavator will be in use.

The activities will be carried out during daytime work (**weekdays from 7am to 6pm and on Saturdays and Sundays) between 8am-6pm.**

Road closure

Due to the nature of activities and for the safety of workers and the community, **there will be a road closure on Albermarle Street (at the rail overbridge section near Challis Avenue) between 1am on Monday 2 September through to 11:30pm on Thursday 12 September.** Please see map overleaf for location of work and traffic detours.

What to expect

- Increase in light traffic movements around the local area
- Traffic detours will be in place during the road closure. Alternate route signage will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians.
- Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times.
- Some of this work may be noisy, however we will take every possible step to minimise noise such as switching off equipment when not in use and installing non-tonal reversing beepers on vehicles.

Keeping you informed

Properties close to the rail corridor will receive notifications when work is scheduled to occur. Sydney Trains will deliver notifications for work done during scheduled rail maintenance periods and Sydney Metro will keep you informed of all other work.
