

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s north west with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms under Central Station.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

Out-of-hours work

As outlined in the recent Southwest Metro monthly notification for July, investigation work is taking place throughout July and August on roads between Campsie Station and Canterbury for a potential new power supply route. Due to the nature and location of some activities, and for worker safety, some work will occur outside standard work hours when there is less traffic on roads.

We will doorknock residents to confirm when nightwork is starting in your area. See table below and map overleaf for nightwork locations.

Traffic control and signage will be in place and access to buildings and driveways will be maintained. Some of this work may be noisy, however we will take every step to minimise noise such as switching off equipment when not in use and using non-tonal reversing beepers on vehicles. If wet weather prevents the work occurring as planned, we will reschedule it.
