

NOTIFICATION – MARTIN PLACE | 21 NOVEMBER 2019

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66km standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland CPB Ghella (JHCPBG) is building the 15.5 kilometre long twin railway tunnels between Chatswood and Sydenham and excavating six new metro stations.

Out-of-hours work – Martin Place South site concrete pour

Work has started on a pedestrian connection tunnel between the future metro station at Martin Place and the existing Martin Place Station.

An out-of-hours concrete pour to form the roof slab of the tunnel will be carried out on **Thursday 28 November 2019 between 7pm and 5am**. This work will take place within the Martin Place South site. Up to 25 concrete trucks will enter and exit the site via Castlereagh Street to deliver the concrete. Traffic control will be in place to ensure the safety of workers and the community.

Work will involve

- Deliveries of plant, materials and equipment
- Concrete pumping
- Concreting work

Work hours

Due to high daytime traffic volumes and to ensure pedestrian safety, this work needs to be completed outside standard construction hours and will occur between 7pm and 5am.

What to expect

- There will be an increase in truck movements on Castlereagh Street, between Hunter and King streets.
- Traffic control will be in place for the safety of workers and the community
- Traffic will be maintained around the work area
- Due to the nature of the work some activities will be noisy. The project team will limit these impacts wherever possible.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used, and equipment and vehicles will be turned off when not in use.
- Temporary lighting towers, required during night works, will be directed away from residential properties where possible.
- Equipment used during these works will include but is not limited to hand tools, concrete trucks, light vehicles, lighting towers, traffic control, concrete pump and concrete vibrator.
