

Project Update – Pitt Street Station

February 2020

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland CPB Ghella (JHCPBG) is building the 15.5 kilometre long twin railway tunnels between Chatswood and Sydenham and excavating six new metro stations, including one at Pitt Street.

Upcoming work at Pitt Street Station sites

Excavation is planned to continue at both Pitt Street Station sites during February. The table below provides more information about activities scheduled during the month, weather and site conditions permitting.

What to expect


- Rock hammering is proceeding at both sites. A maximum of 6.5 hours per weekday and 4 hours each Saturday of high impact noise work. Other work will proceed during respite periods.
- Temporary traffic changes, lane closures, traffic control and directional signage may be in place for the safety of workers and the community during out-of-hours work. Pedestrian footpaths may be closed in some instances, with alternate routes provided.
- Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times.
