

Project update – Barangaroo Station

September 2020

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland CPB Ghella (JHCPBG) is building the 15.5 kilometre long twin railway tunnels between Chatswood and Sydenham and excavating six new metro stations, including one at Barangaroo.

Barangaroo Station – upcoming work

Work will start in early September to reinstate the Barangaroo foreshore area. Activities will include installing drainage, earth works, tying steel, concreting and landscaping. Reinstating the foreshore area is expected to continue until early 2021, weather and site conditions permitting.

In the station, construction of the perimeter walls is ongoing and work will soon start to install large concrete beams for the concourse level. These oversized concrete beams will be delivered to site outside standard construction hours to comply with NSW road regulations and when traffic volumes are lower. The trucks will be unloaded during standard construction hours.

Deliveries will also continue to the acoustic shed on Hickson Road for ongoing structural work in the underground crossover cavern and under harbour cross passages.

The table below provides more information about construction hours and activities planned for September 2020, weather and site conditions permitting (see map overleaf).

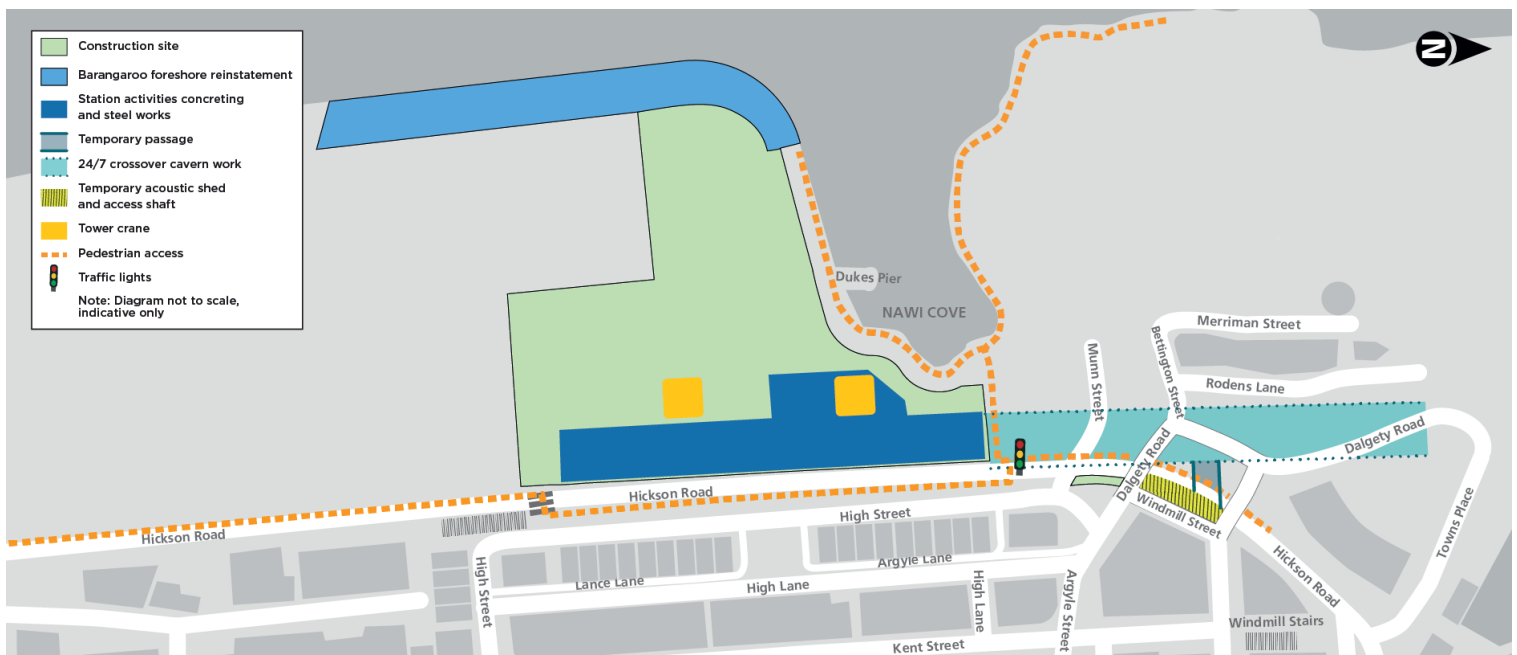
What to expect

- There will be intermittent periods of noisy work. If any high impact noise activities such as saw cutting and hammering are required at night, they will be carried out as early as possible and will cease before midnight.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum.
- Temporary lighting may be used to ensure a safe work site and will be directed away from properties.
- There will be increased light vehicle and truck movements.
- Equipment used includes drills, tower cranes, vacuum excavation trucks, mobile cranes, elevated work platforms, remote-controlled trailers, concrete saws, grinders, concrete pumps, excavators and compactors.
- There will be temporary single lane closures on Hickson Road during out-of-hours work. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- Access to the High Steps, Nawi Cove and Barangaroo Reserve will be maintained at all times.
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times.
- Permanent restoration of roads and footpaths affected by the works will be undertaken at the end of the project.
