

## Notification – Sydney Olympic Park

17 March 2021

### Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

New metro rail will become the fastest, easiest and most reliable journey between the Sydney and Parramatta CBDs. Sydney Metro West will service the key precincts of Greater Parramatta, Sydney Olympic Park, The Bays and the Sydney CBD.

Metro services started in 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. Sydney Metro includes new underground CBD stations at Barangaroo, Martin Place and Pitt Street with new metro platforms under Central.

In 2024, Sydney Metro will have 31 stations on a new 66km standalone metro rail system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history with ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

### Geotechnical investigations: Sydney Olympic Park

Essential geotechnical investigation work will be undertaken by Sydney Metro West to the south-east of Tom Wills Oval. This work is required to determine the underlying ground conditions and inform early design work surrounding the proposed metro station at Sydney Olympic Park. The work will start on **24 March 2021** and is expected to continue for two to three days, weather and site conditions permitting. Work is being done during standard construction hours Monday to Friday 7am-6pm and Saturday 8am-1pm. Please see map overleaf for work location.

#### The work will involve:

- Establishing a temporary site with site fencing
- Using a truck mounted drill rig to bore below ground level
- Removing soil from site using a vacuum excavation truck as required
- Survey work and marking out utility locations
- Reinstating the area at completion of the work.

#### What to expect:

- The work will generate noise and the team will minimise impacts where possible
- Traffic control and directional signage may be used for the safety of works and the community
- Access to pathways and buildings will be maintained at all times
- Parking may be temporarily restricted.

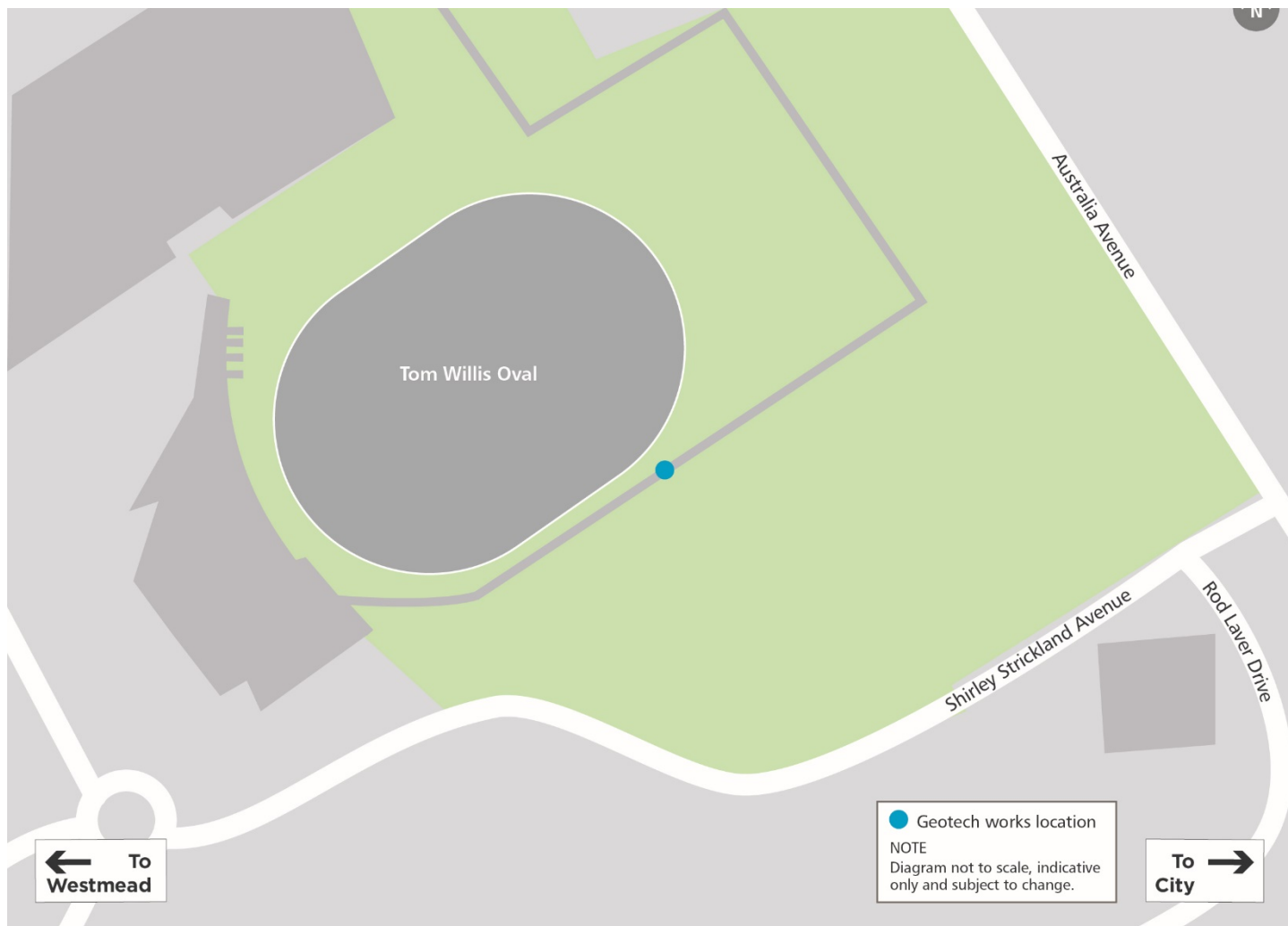
#### Equipment used:

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to: drill rig, specialised ground penetrating equipment, vacuum trucks, hand tools, temporary fencing, light vehicles and generators.

#### Changes to traffic pedestrian and cyclist routes:

During the work, traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists with any changes to traffic conditions. This may include contraflow traffic flow, stop-slow traffic controls, or partial road closures.
