

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66-kilometre standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland CPB Ghella (JHCPBG) is building the 15.5-kilometre-long twin railway tunnels between Chatswood and Sydenham and excavating six new metro stations. Systems Connect (a joint venture between CPB contractors and UGL Limited) is delivering line-wide work to turn the excavated tunnels into a working railway between Chatswood and Sydenham.

Upcoming JHCPBG out-of-hours work - Edinburgh Road


As part of JHCPBG’s finishing work, out-of-hours road work will take place along Edinburgh Road during April. This work is scheduled to start from Thursday 1 April and is expected to take up to four weeks to complete. Out-of-hours work is required for these activities due to restrictions on road use during the day, high daytime traffic volumes and to ensure pedestrian safety. The work is site condition and weather dependent and dates may change.

Edinburgh Road, between Sydney Steel Road and Railway Parade Up to 3 nights a week 6pm-7am	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Realigning concrete barriers along Edinburgh Road • Repairing and replacing the road surface between Sydney Steel Road and Railway Parade, including asphaltting • Constructing a new roundabout at the intersection of Edinburgh Road/Murray Street • Completing work on the stormwater inlet and watermain on Edinburgh Road • Commissioning (testing) the watermain • Upgrading gas pipeline near the intersection of Edinburgh and Edgeware Roads • Removing old kerbs, gutters and footpaths and installing new ones • Line marking

What to expect

- Delivering and unloading plant and equipment and establishing the work areas.
- Installing traffic barriers and directional signage, and implementing temporary lane and footpath closures and setting up detours with appropriate traffic controls.
- Breaking up surfaces with excavators, saw cutters and rock hammers.
- Reforming the roundabout, which will include concrete pours.
- Installing lane markings and signage.
- Backfilling, compacting and reinstating work areas.
- Equipment used during these works will include but is not limited to rock hammers, concrete saws, excavators, asphaltting, line marking equipment, grinder, cranes, vacuum truck, concrete trucks, vibratory compactors, light vehicles, and lighting towers.
- Due to the nature of this work, some of these activities may be noisy. The project team will limit these impacts wherever possible including turning off equipment when not in use, directing lights away from residences, instructing workers to keep noise to a minimum and completing noisier works by midnight.
- Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times.
