

## Project update

April 2021

### Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 kilometre standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

The new Waterloo integrated station development includes construction of the new Waterloo metro station by John Holland, while a joint venture between John Holland and Mirvac will deliver the Waterloo Metro Quarter, including buildings above and next to the station.

### Out-of-hours work activities at Waterloo Station

John Holland standard construction hours are Monday to Sunday, 7am to 6pm but some work at the site will be carried out 24 hours a day, as stated in the April monthly notification.

Some precast elements need to be delivered to the Waterloo Station site outside standard work hours due to the size of the elements and to ensure the safety of the public and workers. The table below lists the dates and locations of oversize precast element deliveries. There will be multiple precast deliveries on each of these nights.

If there are any changes to these dates an email update will be sent. Please ensure you are signed up to our email distribution list to receive updates.

## What to expect

- Equipment used will include, but is not limited to, hand-held and electric tools, cranes, light and heavy vehicles. A mechanical hoist will be used to lift workers up and down, inside the station box.
- While some work will be noisy, the project team will take every step possible to minimise noise impacts. A range of mitigation measures are in place to meet the project's approval conditions and reduce noise, including using only the necessary equipment for each task, turning off equipment when not in use and, where possible, equipping machinery with non-tonal movement alarms.
- Temporary traffic changes will be in place for the safety of workers and the community during this work, including reduced speed limits, traffic diversions, footpath and lane closures.
