

# Notification – Southwest Metro

Campsie - May 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre. The upgrade of the T3 Bankstown Line to metro standards between Sydenham and Bankstown received planning approval on 19 December 2018.

In February 2021, a contract was awarded to Downer EDI Works to upgrade Dulwich Hill, Campsie and Punchbowl stations to metro rail standards. You will notice work taking place around the station in the coming months.

**In May, work will continue along the rail corridor and at Campsie Station** (weather and site conditions permitting). Access to the rail corridor will be via existing rail corridor/pedestrian access gates. **Day work will be undertaken during project standard construction hours Monday to Friday 7am-6pm and Saturday 8am-6pm.** All work activities are subject to relevant approvals. 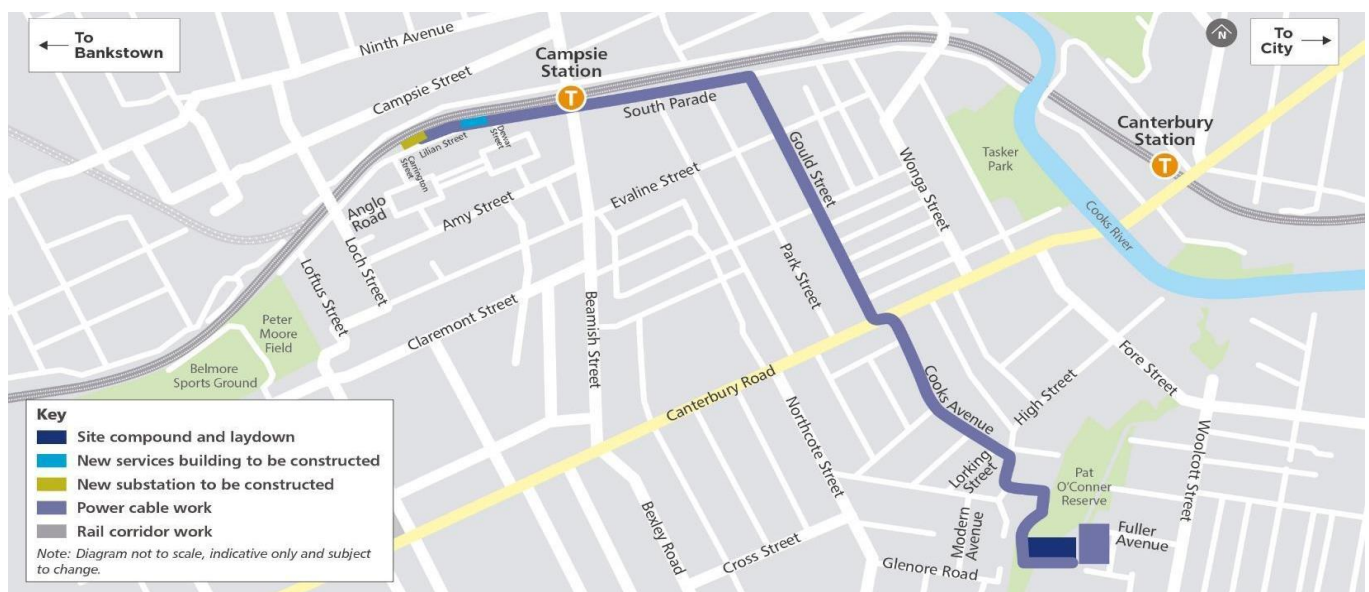
### Out-of-hours work

Due to the nature of some activities and for the safety of workers, some work will occur outside standard construction hours when trains are not running. Some equipment will also be delivered outside standard construction hours in line with Transport for NSW requirements for the movement of oversized vehicles. Properties in proximity to scheduled works will be notified prior to work starting. More details about upcoming out-of-hours work is provided on page 2.

During the scheduled rail shutdown weekend:  Between <b>10.30pm Friday 28 May to 2am Monday 31 May 2021</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Investigation activities including non-destructive digging</li> <li>• Installation of signal equipment, cabling and service routes</li> <li>• Installation of temporary fencing</li> <li>• Installation of track drainage</li> <li>• Installation of overhead wiring structures</li> <li>• Removal of redundant overhead wiring structures</li> <li>• Trial demolition of platform 1 and 2</li> <li>• Piling activities</li> <li>• Underline crossing installation</li> <li>• Installing storm water drainage</li> <li>• Service investigations</li> <li>• Potholing in the tracks at Campsie Substation site and building batter chute for drainage</li> </ul>

Equipment used for all the above work will include excavators, jackhammers, vacuum trucks, slashers, motorised saws, concrete trucks, sucker trucks, other trucks, delivery vehicles, borehole drillers, rollers, generators, whacker packers, dump trucks, wood chippers, mulchers, grass cutters, telehandlers, drilling rigs, lifting machinery, elevated work platforms, bobcats, concrete pumps, cranes, cable pulling equipment, road sweeper, compactors, chainsaw, lighting towers, forklifts, water carts, vibrating plates, and hand and power tools.

Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times. Some of this work may be noisy, however we will take every possible step to minimise noise such as switching off equipment when not in use and using non-tonal reversing beepers. Where temporary footpath changes, car parking removal or lane closures are required for works, traffic control, pedestrian detours and signage will be in place to assist the community.
