

Monthly Update - Sydenham Station

July 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland Pty Ltd and Laing O'Rourke Australia Construction Pty Ltd have been awarded the contract for major railway work at Sydenham as part of Sydney Metro, including the upgrade of Sydenham Station.

Upcoming Work

Work to upgrade Sydenham Station to metro standards is underway with work zones set up on Sydenham Station Platforms 4, 5 and 6, as well as Hogan Avenue, Sydenham Road, Burrows Avenue, Bolton Street, Railway Parade, Lower Railway Parade, Bedwin Road Bridge, Edgeware Road and Garden Street.

Standard Work Hours

The following activities will be undertaken during standard construction hours - Monday to Friday (7am to 6pm) and Saturday (8am to 1pm).

- Footpath upgrades, kerb installation, potholing and line marking work along Railway Parade, Burrows Avenue and Hogan Avenue
 - Periodic lane closures and pedestrian diversions will be in place
- Sydenham Station footbridge upgrades, including balustrade glazing, fitout, tiling, ceiling cladding, electrical, lighting, line marking, pavement, drainage, backfilling and platform 1 and 2 extension work
- Retaining wall, security fencing, backfilling, earthwork, drainage and aqueduct façade upgrade work
- Potholing works on Burrows and Hogan Avenue
 - Periodic lane closures and pedestrian diversions will be in place
- Underbore and excavation work along Railway Parade
 - Periodic lane closures and pedestrian diversions will be in place
- Track slab concreting, anti-throw screen and security fence installation along Bedwin Road Bridge
 - Periodic lane closures and pedestrian diversions will be in place along Edgeware Road and Railway Parade
- Installing posts along Bedwin Road Bridge and Bedwin Road Bridge improvement work
 - Periodic lane closures and pedestrian diversions will be in place along Edgeware Road, Railway Parade and Bedwin Road Bridge
- Street light upgrade work along Sydenham Road
 - Periodic lane closure and pedestrian diversions will be in place
- Road pavement replacement work along Sydenham Road and Railway Parade
 - Periodic lane closure and pedestrian diversions will be in place
- Inaudible tiling and services night work at Sydenham Station
- Service route and fencing work along the Bankstown curve line

Out-of-hours work

Due to the nature of some activities and for the safety of workers, some work will occur outside standard construction hours, when trains are not running. Some equipment will also be delivered outside standard construction hours in line with Transport for NSW requirements for transporting oversized vehicles.

What to expect

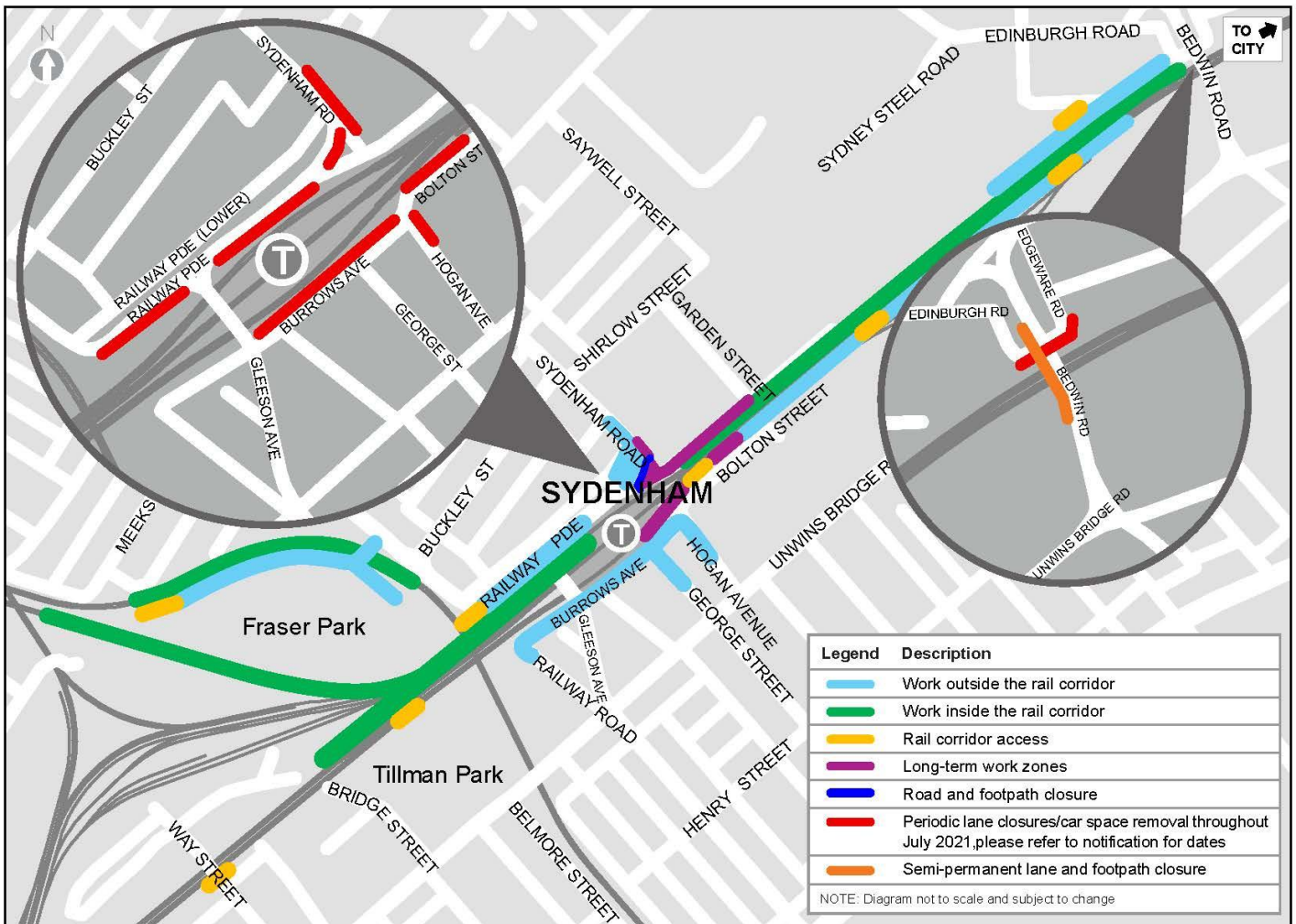
- Workers will access the rail corridor via designated rail access gates at Tillman and Fraser parks, Railway Parade (Bedwin Road Bridge), Railway Road, Burrows Avenue, Bolton Road, Lord Street, Way Street and Sydenham Road intersection with Railway Parade.
- During delivery of plant and material, periodic removal of up to six parking spaces may be required alongside above-mentioned rail access gates. Signage will be installed to notify motorists.
- Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- Oversized equipment will be delivered to work areas.
- Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times.
- Some work will be noisy. Equipment is fitted with non-tonal reversing beepers, which will be switched off when not in use.
- Watercarts will be used to manage dust.

- Equipment will include lighting towers, vacuum suction trucks, dump trucks, crane trucks, crane, generators, concrete pumps and trucks, excavators, hydro demolition, rollers and road sweepers.
- Lights from lighting towers will be directed away from residential properties when in use.
