

Notification – Southwest Metro

Campsie – July 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre. The upgrade of the T3 Bankstown Line to metro standards between Sydenham and Bankstown received planning approval on 19 December 2018.

In February 2021, a contract was awarded to Downer EDI Works to upgrade Dulwich Hill, Campsie and Punchbowl stations to metro rail standards. You will notice work taking place around the station in the coming months.

Following the rail shutdown period, work will continue along the rail corridor and at Campsie Station throughout July (weather and site conditions permitting). Access to the rail corridor will be via existing rail corridor/pedestrian access gates. **Day work will be undertaken during project standard construction hours Monday to Friday 7am-6pm and Saturday 8am-6pm.** All work activities are subject to relevant approvals. Campsie (along the rail corridor)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Various site investigations and surveys including but not limited to non-destructive digging, soil assessments and soil waste classification, geotechnical investigations and surveys for drainage, utilities and fencing • Devegetation and tree clearing throughout the rail corridor where required • Cabling work and installation of fencing, cable service routes and galvanised steel troughing (GST) • Installation and removal of haul roads, access routes and temporary fencing throughout the rail corridor • Piling work activities will take place in the rail corridor located at Loch Street Bridge, Campsie. Alternate lane and footpath closures will be in place along Loch Street Bridge and Wilfred Lane for the safety of the workers and local community • Piling work activities will be carried out at Wairoa Street Bridge (alternate lane and footpath closures will be in place for the safety of the workers and local community) • Installing high voltage cables inside the rail corridor at the city end of Campsie Station

Services building site at Lillian Lane opposite Dewar Street	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Survey work • Bulk and detailed earthworks • Various site investigations and soil waste classifications • Continuing footings and drainage works • Continuing relocation of services and utilities
Substation site (Off Lillian Street)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tree trimming • Continue with bulk excavation including jack hammering • Installation of conduits and drainage pipes and pits • Formwork Reinforcement and concrete pouring • Install drainage batter to rail corridor • Traffic controllers to facilitate trucks movements on Lillian Street
Bulk power supply work, Lillian Lane and Lillian Street	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establishing temporary traffic changes, temporary diversion of pedestrian, removing street parking • Tree trimming as required • Cutting road pavement, excavating a trench and removing spoil, installing conduits in the trench, backfilling the trench, conduit testing and restoring the road surface

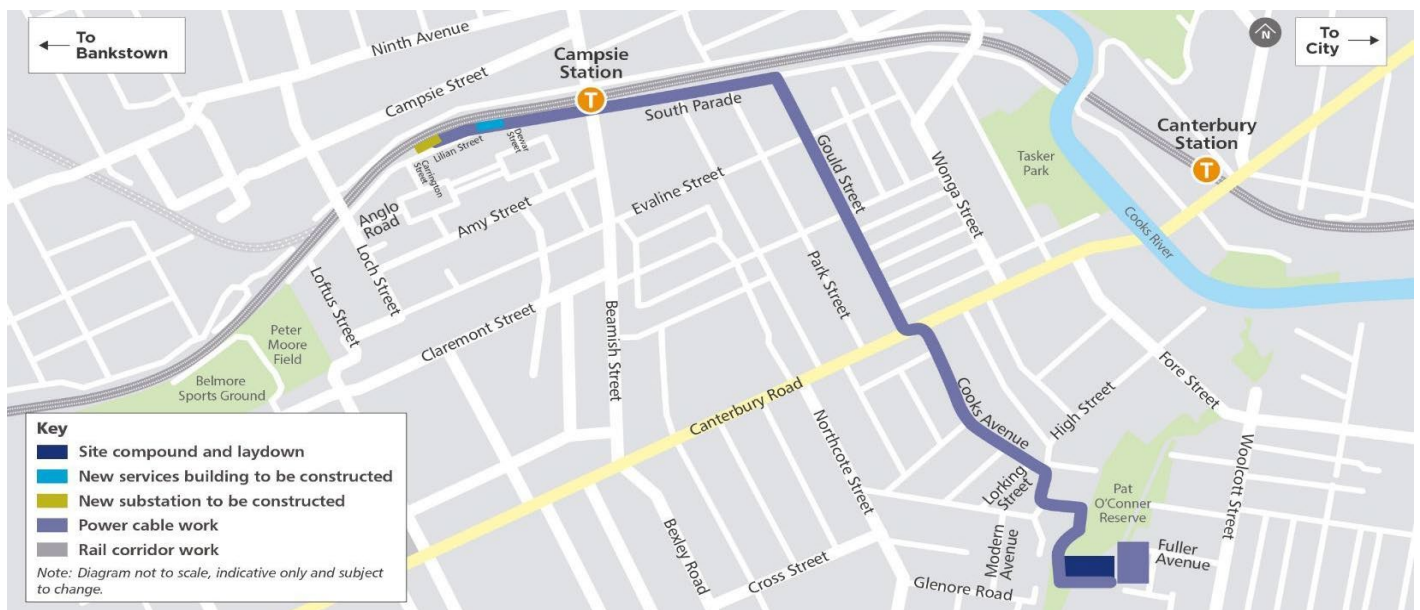
Out-of-hours work

Due to the nature of some activities and for the safety of workers, some work will occur outside standard construction hours when trains are not running. Some equipment will also be delivered outside standard construction hours in line with Transport for NSW requirements for the movement of oversized vehicles. Properties in proximity to scheduled works will be notified prior to any additional out-of-hours work starting.

Date / time	Detail of work and location
Mid-week works between 6pm and 7am Monday 12 July to Saturday 31 July 2021 for no more than 3 nights per week (in addition to daytime work)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Installation of signal equipment • Cable pulling activities • Investigation work including non-destructive digging and footing work • Tree removal within the rail corridor • Deliveries of materials • Spoil classification, disposal and removal off-site at the concourse, platforms and services building • Precinct work for new bike racks and kiss and ride • Platform investigation work, demolition activities and refurbishments • Station concourse demolition work





Equipment used for all the above work will include excavators, jack hammers, vacuum trucks, slashers, motorised saws, concrete trucks, sucker trucks, delivery vehicles, borehole drillers, rollers, generators, whacker packers, dump trucks, wood chippers, mulchers, grass cutters, telehandlers, drilling rigs, lifting machinery, elevated work platforms, bobcats, concrete pumps, cranes, cable pulling equipment, road sweeper, compactors, chainsaw, lighting towers, forklifts, water carts, vibrating plates, and hand and power tools.

Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times. Some of this work may be noisy, however we will take every possible step to minimise noise such as switching off equipment when not in use and using non-tonal reversing beepers. We recommend that residents in the area keep their windows closed to further limit noise. **Where temporary footpath changes, car parking removal or lane closures are required for works, traffic control, pedestrian detours and signage will be in place to assist the community.**
