For **SMTF North**, the key issues discussed were:

- Christmas close down procedures were successful in maintaining site stability during Christmas close down when approximately 50mm of rain was recorded at the BOM site at Richmond
- Site clean-up works and site levelling well underway at Snake Mountain.
- Earthworks for landscaping works underway on northern boundary of Snake Mountain.
- Application of mulch adjacent to Depot Signal Equipment Room (DSER2) access road completed.
- Fit-out of expanded maintenance shed continuing.
- Fencing installation has been completed along access track/test track removing the access short cut.
- TSOM activities are continuing in the depot signals equipment room (DSER2) along with trackside installations.

For Chatswood Dive Site, Northern Connection, Blues Point Access Site, Artarmon TSS, Crows Nest Station, and St Leonards Storage Area the key issues discussed were:

- Evidence from the sites indicates that Christmas close down stabilising actions were successful in preventing sediment run-off from any sites during heavy rain over Christmas / New Year close down
- Chatswood Dive track laying has commenced in the down tunnel towards city and track slab construction underway in up tunnel. Track laying activities on-going in tunnels.
- Northern Connection Earthworks progressing country side of TSE bridge and capping placement city
 side
- No further graffiti issues with recently installed hoarding along Valetta Lane.
- Shaft cutting has commenced at Artarmon TSS site. Hoarding along Reserve Road side remains free of graffiti.
- Line Wide works at Crows Nest completed. Site handed over to ISD contractor on 11/01/21.
- Recently installed elevator at Blues Point in operation to transport personnel and small equipment items to track level in the tunnels.
- Erection of overhead wire structures for upcoming down-track slew has commenced at Northern Connection
- Regular cleaning and sweeping of the western access of Northern Connection to Brand Street is minimising mud and dirt tracking onto Brand Street from the construction site.
- Recent testing of stockpiles at Valetta Lane and St Leonards has confirmed that they are not suitable for re-use on the project and will be removed from the site for disposal at an appropriately permitted location. Relocation expected end of February / Early March.
- Recent stockpiles at Valetta Lane have not been covered. They are located behind hoarding and acoustic curtains so they are not visually intrusive. Low risk of dust generation under current conditions. However, will require monitoring if hot, dry windy weather develops prior to permanent removal from site.
- Two spill management wheelie bins located in obscure / partly hidden location. Recommended that they are relocated to more visible sites to be more quickly accessed in case of an emergency.
- Northern Dive Site is very busy with movement of plant and machinery and delivery of critical materials to the site. Key OHS focus on awareness of movements while on site.

For Civil and Track Work Areas (South) the key issues discussed were:

- Discuss secondary containment for Fosroc Form Release Agent (hazardous substance). SC Enviro staff to discuss requirements with Site Supervisor, where significant amount is due on site soon
- Ensure concrete washout bay or bins available for all concreting works, ensuring ongoing concrete waste management remains compliant

For **Bulk Power Supply Work Areas (South)** the key issue discussed were:

- Trenching under around significant utilities in Lilian Lane. No damage to stormwater and sewerage utilities
- Site Supervisor and Engineer very wary of Community and Environmental aspects where working in the narrow residential streets of Surry Hills
- Post Project Signage including contact information (enquiry and complaints line 1800 number etc) on Albion St and Foveaux St approaches as a minimum, where immediately visible to community and businesses
- Tree Protection Controls in place for significant street trees in Belmore St, Surry Hills

Stakeholder expressed there was not adequate advice for the road work and signage, and was concerned this could affect food deliveries. Community Manager followed up with the Stakeholder and reassured them that the deliveries would reach the stakeholder. Site supervisor is also adjusting some of the site signage to ensure even greater clarity to delivery vehicles that they will be able to access the street.

Northern Connection 14/01/21

Caller advised that doors and windows are rattling, and that the caller is very disturbed. Vibration monitoring was conducted at the property whilst works continued to take place. The stakeholder was advised that the vibration was caused by the vibratory roller being used on site and the interim levels measured during the attended vibration monitoring have recorded a level well below structural damage. Systems Connect Community Manager reassured the resident that the equipment is only used when necessary, and committed to providing a specific notification before this activity occurs in the future.
