- Victoria Cross South: There were minimal ERSED controls for water leaving site and going across the footpath on Miller Street
- Victoria Cross North: Raised dust during wind gusts were observed on the hardstand where the shed used to be. The area was not clean after recent demolition activities of the shed.

For **SMTF North**, the key issues discussed were:

- Road sweeping has been on-going to remove tracked mud from road surfaces.
- Requirements related to house keeping (emphasised during pre-start meetings)

- Snake Mountain sediment basin discharge in anticipation of expected heavy rainfall
- Landscaping progressing to swales in the SMTF expansion area
- Heavy rain aided establishment of vegetation upslope of the Snake Mountain sediment basin
- TSoM activities: Cable pulling (trackside), installation of trackside signalling equipment, installation of trackside communication equipment and Internal fit-out of DSER2 room

For the **Chatswood Dive Site, Northern Connection, Artarmon TSS and Crows Nest Station**, the key issues discussed were:

- Graffiti management at a number of sites. By way of example, SC has installed black shade cloth along Valletta Lane as a temporary measure pending agreement about a long term solution to the graffiti management problem. Graffiti has also been removed from hoarding at Artarmon TSS construction site
- Sediment controls along Valetta Lane are working well and it was observed that there was no sediment run-off from the site. Stockpiles inside the Valetta laydown area had been well covered with poly covering.
- Systems Connect has done a good job cleaning up Chatswood Dive Site. Mostly very neat and well
 organised. However, waste concrete storage area requires work to bring it up to the required
 standard. Actions required included clean up of fugitive concrete run-off, removal of waste concrete
 and extension of existing bunding.
- The alignment of the permanent down track has become more apparent with the completion of the dive site overpass structure.
- Improvements to erosion and sediment control measures, along with upgraded pavement cleaning, have been implemented within the Northern Connection worksite. Brand Street adjacent to the site entrance is swept on a regular basis to ensure that any dirt tracked off-site by construction vehicles is removed from public roads.
- The Artarmon TSS site has been occupied by SC following transfer from TSE.
- Site sheds have been removed (except for one) have been removed from the Crows Nest site and have been placed in storage at Chatswood Dive Site. Cranes are in place for removal of the acoustic sheds.

For Waterloo Station, the key issue discussed was:

Management of tunnel wastewater in coordination with Waterloo ISD Contractor

For **Southern Dive (Marrickville)**, the key issues discussed were:

- SC to address the habits developing in those undertaking plant maintenance on Southern Dive site, where empty chemical containers left onsite
- SC to address appropriate disposal of oily waste / spill waste from site
- It was noted that the hazardous substances container had started to be used, but still required bung or valve on second outlet. SC responded with the installation of a tap installed during ER Inspection
- Investigate cause of minor diesel spills and clean-up around diesel pod at Southern Dive
- Clean-up concrete washout on hardstand surface and provide skip bins for concrete washouts at Southern Dive

For Canterbury to Campsie – Bulk Power Supply, the key issues discussed were:

- Good traffic management and ERSED controls around active Joint Bay works at South Parade
- Local businesses communicated with and arrangements made to address impacts to property access
- Wet-Vac used to clean-up slurry during saw-cutting activity at Lilian Lane
- Run-on water from Anzac St, Canterbury draining over disturbed trench alignment and causing settlement in the clay under Tree 19 and resulting scour down through site. SC to implement ERSED controls

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

Line Wide

There were six complaints related to Line Wide works:

- Crows Nest Station 11/11 Nosie from a generator following power outage (when the power had been tuned back on)
- Northern Connection 18/11 2 complaints relating to vibration impact. A resident reported vibration in home for approx. 5 minutes at 12:20 pm and 1:15 pm. A preliminary investigation has not identified any vibratory SC work taking place at times mentioned. Investigations are ongoing, and the resident will be informed of outcome

A resident reported experiencing vibration in his property. The complaint also referred to property condition assessment report regarding cracking in walls. A preliminary investigation has not identified any vibratory SC work taking place at times mentioned. Investigations are ongoing, and the resident will be informed of outcome. Comment around property condition has been referred to the TSE contractor with the outcome to be confirmed

- Crows Nest station 19/11 A resident complained about buzzing noise from site since acoustic shed removal started. The SC environment team attended site and determined it may be caused by ventilation fans in tunnels, however unable to confirm as noise was difficult to isolate during construction. Noise monitoring will be conducted 19/11 to confirm noise levels and assess any possible mitigations. Residents were to be notified accordingly
- Crows Nest Station 20/11 –A resident reported noisy vacuum truck parked on Clarke Ln Investigation noise was from sucker truck used to pump out toilet tanks. This activity was planned as part of regular site management and it was reported that noise was in line with expected levels for this activity. SC advised resident they will give specific notice prior to future activity
- Victoria Cross South 30/11 Strata manager from Miller St building called JHCPBG Place Manager to let them know residents had been complaining about OOH noise in tunnels. The call was referred to SC who are investigating the activities. Initial review of the CNVIS has assessed any activities happening in the tunnels to be inaudible above ground

Two events have been recorded at the Waterloo Site. Initial email notification was provided to the ER and Sydney Metro. The events include:

- A forklift operator ruptured a 44 gallon drum of curing compound while moving it These events are still under investigation and will require reporting by one or both of the Contractors working at the site.
