

Project update – Power supply cable installation

November and December 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project. Services started in May 2019 in the city’s north west with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street, and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central Station.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

Systems Connect (an unincorporated joint venture between CPB Contractors and UGL Limited) is delivering the Line-wide work including installing metro rail track, power systems, communications and infrastructure to turn the excavated tunnels into a working railway between Chatswood and Sydenham. Line-wide work also includes the permanent systems, services and buildings required for Sydney Metro operations between Chatswood and Bankstown.

Updated information – South Parade Campsie out of hours work in November

Further to the notification we sent earlier in November 2021, some work to complete the power supply cable installation will need to be undertaken outside of standard construction hours.

Systems Connect will excavate the joint bay within the road on South Parade Campsie. This will take one night and be on Friday 26 November between 6pm and 7am.

Doing this work will allow us to pull 33kV power cables through the previously installed conduits during the day, as advised in our November notification. During that time, traffic and parking changes will be put in place.

The cable pulling work is planned to take place during November and December. We have outlined below the full extent of our work planned for December.

Traffic controllers will change the traffic configuration into a contra flow on South Parade, with lane dividers and traffic diversions in place. Equipment used will include traffic cones, a truck, and various hand tools.

Power supply cable installation work in November and December

The work on the South Parade joint bay is part of Systems Connect’s work to re-excavate the four joint bays at Anzac Street, Cooks Avenue, Gould Street and South Parade to pull 33kV power cables through the previously installed conduits. **The sites will be readied in late November and early December, with work expected to finish in the new year.** During that time, traffic and parking measures will be put in place. Most of this work will be carried out during standard construction hours and we will not be working during public holidays.

Day work

Project standard working hours are Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm, and Saturday 8am to 6pm (excluding public holidays)

The site compound will be used predominantly during the day, with occasional night access. • Some tree trimming and mulching • Temporary traffic changes, including temporary diversion of pedestrians within Pat O'Conner Reserve and Hughes Park and heavy vehicle / plant movements in the parks • Installing a new bridge across the stormwater channel that will contain power cables leading into the Ausgrid substation, this bridge will not be accessible to the community • Concreting and installation of bridge structures • Park restoration • Establishing temporary traffic changes and contra flows, setting up safe work areas with barriers and fencing around the sites • Cutting road pavement, excavating pits and removing spoil, pulling cables from pits, backfilling the pits, and restoring the road surface.

Equipment used for the work in the table above will include road saws, vacuum suction trucks, spoil trucks, excavators, mobile cranes, elevated work platforms, water carts, compactors, concrete trucks, boom pumps and pumps, drilling rigs, cable pulling equipment, lighting towers, generators, dump trucks, large trucks and light vehicles, wood chippers, chainsaws and various powered hand tools.

Some work may be noisier than normal. Every step will be taken to minimise noise such as switching off equipment when not in use, using noise barriers wherever possible, and non-tonal reversing beepers. Where lights are required, they will be directed away from residences.

The site compound will be used predominantly during the day, with occasional night access.

Temporary changes during the work may include potential delays or changes to property access as work progresses, traffic detours in some locations, lane or footpath closures, and temporary loss of street parking. During these changes, signage and detours will be in place to direct motorists and pedestrians.

We will liaise with directly impacted residents as work progresses.

Pedestrian changes

A section of Pat O'Conner Reserve near the cable bridge will again be closed off during the work, for the safety of pedestrians. Traffic controllers and signs will help direct pedestrians to alternative routes. The park will reopen outside standard working hours.




