# **Key Construction Activities During the Period**

Works conducted during the reporting period included:

- Metro Box Truck movements; metro box ventilation. Ongoing construction activities for the Chillers and Ventilation Building. Installation of some platform Canopies. Fit out of the Platform and other levels. Various FRP works.
   Completion of drilling for CSR bores. New ventilation fans installed and operating in Mole Hole 3, largely for Linewide requirements.
- Central Walk Excavating for Central Walk ongoing for remaining escalator voids. FRP works for columns, shotcreting.
- Works within hoarded work zones on suburban Platforms 16-23 and platform surface excavation during rail
  possession weekends. Ongoing installation of final panels around the new escalators. Platforms (southern side) 16-17
  mostly complete.
- Sydney Yard Water Treatment Plant Operation; truck access; laydown. Stockpiling, processing and loadout of excavated material from other areas of site. Delivery of OSOM for station canopies ongoing.
- Northern Concourse Ongoing works at intersection of Northern Concourse and Metro Box area.
- Eastern Entrance FRP for walls; floor slabs and columns inside the shaft.
- Devonshire Street Tunnel- In operation and used by commuters.
- CSR works Rail Institute Compound area to support drilling of bores for CSR between Ghost Platform and Metro Box still being demobilised after completion of drilling works.
- ESR Concourse New lift in operation. Ongoing use of the area for laydown and construction support. Fit out and other construction activities ongoing.
- Ghost Platforms (above ESR Platforms 24-25) Ongoing electrical and other fit out.

# **Key Construction Activities Look Ahead**

- Ongoing activities as described above
- OSOM deliveries continuing due to reduced space in the metro deck and Yard area, trucks will be reversing over SYAB.
- Ongoing planning for works in Randle Lane for the HV connection.
- Platform works on Platform 0 and 1 LOR are working with YHA who are close to these platforms.
- Possession works between Christmas and New Year

### **ER Inspections**

There were two ER inspections (03/11/2021 and 17/11/2021) conducted during the reporting period. The key issues raised were:

- Housekeeping and storage of materials could be improved near the Water Treatment Plant. A 205 L drum and 20L containers were stored without bunding. Litter was observed on the ground in the area.
- LOR indicated that no noise modelling had been completed to assess the impacts of the ventilation unit on Station staff and commuters indicating this was possibly a Line wide responsibility as the fan unit was for their purposes. During a later inspection on 1 December the fans were observed to be in place and monitoring conducted showing lower noise levels from this fan which has silencers.

# **Key Construction Activities During the Period**

- Fraser Park Ancillary Facility: Offices, crib rooms and amenities
- Bankstown curve: Security fencing, GST and defects work complete
- Geotechnical Office Area: Installation of electrical conduit ongoing; Completion of fencing
- Burrows Ave / Southern Station Plaza / Bolton St / Hogan Ave: Excavation for Transgrid defects at Southern station plaza. Works on Burrows Avenue, Bolton Street and Hogan Avenue complete
- Sydenham Station / Development Area: Earthworks, waste classification and spoil load out to Gateway Project commenced from the Development Area. Asphalting of the secondary plaza commenced
- 11 Sydenham Rd (main site, including Garden Street): Track install complete, GST and security fencing complete. Heavy vehicle ramp scheduled for removal once Retaining Wall 4 (RW4) works are complete.
- Sydenham Pit and Pumping Station / Confluence Area: RW4 mostly complete (small section on hold pending final design). Cess drainage complete; infill and levelling / finishing works ongoing.    Waste classification testing ongoing to determine beneficial reuse options.

- Carrington Rd Laydown: Stockpiling. Waste classification testing ongoing to determine beneficial reuse options. Spoil load-out to Gateway project commenced.
- **Bedwin Road**: Track slab defects complete. Trackside fencing and handrail installation ongoing. Throw screens complete along Bedwin Road Bridge. Additional fencing, including solution for Edgeware Road apartments ongoing.

### **ER Inspections**

There were five ER inspections conducted by the ER in November 2021 (02/11/21; 09/11/21; 16/11/21; 23/11/21; 30/11/21). The key issues raised were:

## <u>Canterbury to Campsie BPS - Pat O'Connor Reserve (Canterbury):</u>

# ER Inspection #87 - 02/11/2021

- SC Ancillary Facility stabilised access, sediment fence and tree protection measure remains in place.
- Cable Bridge worksite flagging observed around trees to be retained along fence line and batter was protected.
- Cable Bridge worksite observed good control measure (plastic sheet) installed under bridge formwork to capture any potential spills/leaks from concreting works, into Cup & Saucer Creek.

# ER Inspection #91 - 30/11/2021

- SC Ancillary Facility noise blankets installed around operational generator for site sheds.
- SC Ancillary Facility no graffiti observed on shade cloth installed around the Ancillary Facility.
- Cable Bridge worksite Chemicals stored (for e.g. form oil, curing compound) without secondary containment or in designated storage container. Action raised and closed out by SC within Inspection Report.
- Cable Bridge worksite Sediment fence remains in place along bridge worksite with minor maintenance required to re-attach/cable tie section of sediment fence and remove accumulated sediment build up.
- Cable Bridge worksite Section of batter was observed to be protected with remaining section uncovered. It was agreed that remaining exposed would be covered. Action raised with Inspection Report.
- Anzac St Compound ER enquired if shade cloth was required to be installed on Anzac St Compound. SC agreed to install shade cloth around Anzac St Compound based on further use and timing of works within Reserve.
- Anzac St /Site Access -minor tracking from vehicle movement on Anzac St/ site access and some fresh
  damage (potentially superficial) was observed on tree roots. Discussed with SC and fencing was
  relocated at the time of inspection to further delineate the root area and additional barriers installed.
  SC to clean up minor tracking and report further investigation outcomes/actions to SM/ER.

# Southern Dive & SMTF South Marrickville:

# ER Inspection #87 - 02/11/2021

- Observed sediment fence along the site boundary and sediment controls around stormwater pits around various parts of the site.
- Eastern bypass area was observed to be stabilised and sediment controls installed around stormwater pits.

- Drain within future stabling yard footprint was protected.
- No visible dust generation observed during the site inspection. Evidence of dust suppression observed on-site.
- Site access gate and section of Sydney Steel Road near the site was observed to be clean during the inspection.
- Refreshed sediment controls remain in place along Sydney Steel Road. Minor build up of litter and sediment was observed around kerb drain controls. SC informed the ER that a weekly maintenance schedule is in place.

### ER Inspection #91 - 30/11/2021

- No visible dust generation observed during the site inspection.
- Mobile concrete washout bins in place at the operational phase WTP. The area surrounding the washout bins
  was observed to be tidy.
- Accessible and stocked spill kits were observed near the Bin Area.
- Graffiti observed on sections of shade cloth and hoarding installed around the perimeter fence along sections of Sydney Steel Road. SC to remove graffiti in accordance with VAMP.
- Graffiti observed on shade cloth and sediment fence along pedestrian/cyclist footpath lane. Further
  discussion/resolution required for management of graffiti in area (noted graffiti on buildings along lane) taking
  into consideration factors of visibility and cost/benefits of replacing shade cloth
- Refreshed and good sediment controls were noted along the kerb drains and gutter along Sydney Steel Road.
- Maintenance required for removal of sediment build up and leaf litter within the kerb gutter along Sydney Steel Road. Action raised and closed within ER Inspection Report.

### **SMTF North**

### ER Inspection #88 - 09/11/2021

- Stabilised access/egress maintained. Drainage swales with controls remain in place along site boundary (near Themeda Ave).
- Planting adjacent to the northern boundary fence of Snake Mountain observed to be establishing and healthy at time of inspection.
- Clean water diversion channel (stabilised with ballast) along northern boundary fence and irrigation system for planted area remains in place.
- Stabilising works are nearing completion with some mulch remaining to be applied and additional ballast to be laid in areas of concentrated flow. SC reports 70% equivalent cover is planned. A combination of mulch cover, grass patches and ballast was observed.
- It was noted that post recent rainfall, minor sections require re-work/re-application of mulch to ensure cover. SC informed the ER that these works would be undertaken once ground conditions (currently wet from recent rainfall) allow machinery to be deployed to complete remaining stabilising works.
- Infilling and decommissioning of temporary sediment basin completed.
- Large woody debris relocated from previous laydown area (near site sheds) alongside decommissioned sediment basin for sediment control/potential habitat.
- SC informed ER that pickets, sediment fencing and removal of some litter will be undertaken prior to final site clean up/demobilisation from site.
- Polymer spray observed in patches across site laydown area (DGB). SC informed ER that a final polymer spray would be applied post site demobilisation. ER requested photos on final completion of stabilising works, site clean up works and final application of polymer.

### ER Inspection #89 - 16/11/2021

# **Northern Hub**

- Site access/ egress points observed to be generally clean. Spoil removal from site was noted during the ER inspection. SC informed the ER that street sweeper is mobilised regularly.
- Project Signage in place. No graffiti observed on hoarding around site boundary at the time of inspection.
- Spoil loadout and removal from site underway. No visible dust observed from spoil loading process and truck observed to exit the site with load covered and tailgate secured.
- Jerry cans noted to be stored within drip trays in the Northern Connection Area. A diesel jerry can without secondary containment was noted in the refuelling area at CDS and removed during ER inspection.
- Minor waste from recent possession weekend noted near Concrete Delivery Area at Hopetoun Ave. Action raised and closed out within ER Inspection Report.
- Concrete truck was observed delivering concrete to facilitate blinding pour works at the PMF Pit Area (within the rail corridor). Control in place (plastic tarp) to capture potential concrete spills/leaks.

### **Valetta Lane Access**

• Shade cloth around access gates and the fence was largely free of graffiti. Minor tagging observed on shade cloth on fence, near access gate. Action raised and closed out within ER Inspection Report.

### **Artarmon TSS Site**

• SC informed the ER that hampers were handed out (good initiative) to three properties impacted by the scheduled power outage works over past weekend, as a good will gesture.

### **Blues Point Access Site**

- Beach Access (opened to the Public) Hoarding observed to be free of graffiti. ESC remains in place along sections of Beach access.
- Shade cloth installed along pedestrian access adjacent to scaffolding.

### ER Inspection #90 - 23/11/2021

### **SW Corridor Traction Substation sites**

## **Canterbury TSS**

- Noise blankets remain installed on Hutton St side. No high-noise works being undertaken at the time of the inspection. SC informed ER that rock sawing/breaking was scheduled to occur later on during the day.
- Tree Protection Zone (with noise blankets installed) and sediment fence alongside the ATF, remain in place.
- It was observed that the chemical storage had secondary containment and plastic tarp, to prevent rainwater ingress into the portable bund. Uncontained jerry can was empty.
- Rumble grid and coir logs remain in place at site access/egress gate. SC informed ER that minor sediment at site access/egress gate is being managed by regular sweeping with hand-held brooms and street sweeper. Ongoing monitoring required.
- No graffiti observed on shade cloth installed along Hutton St side.
- Construction materials (e.g. reo) stored within vegetated strip, adjacent to the laydown area on Hutton St. It was
  agreed with SC that a TPZ would be established around 2 trees to be retained. Action raised and closed out by SC
  within Inspection Report.

### **Dulwich Hill TSS**

- Some mulch (minor) noted in kerb drain at Randall St. SC informed ER that mulch in kerb drain would be removed. Refer note and close out photo provided by SC within Inspection Report.
- ESC in place along site boundary fence (rail corridor side) and at site access/egress.

# **Campsie TSS**

• Site Access (Lillian St) - SC informed ER that minor sediment at site access/egress gate is being managed by a combination of regular sweeping with hand-held brooms and street sweeper. Ongoing monitoring required.

### Lakemba TSS

- Stabilised concrete access (positive observation) established since last inspection.
- Rumble grid remains in place and The Boulevarde was observed to be generally clean with no tracking observed at time of inspection.

### **Punchbowl TSS**

- Tree removal underway and traffic control in place. Discussed with SC regarding end of day (EOD) controls /clean-up post tree removal works. ER requested EOD clean-up evidence and close out photo provided by SC within Inspection Report.
- Stabilised access/egress (with ballast) in place.
- TPZ in place for retained tree.
- PPE recycling (good initiative) box observed on-site.
- No go zone/signage in place for threatened species (Acacia Pubescens).

# **Belmore Compound and Laydown Area**

- Site Access/ Egress Gate (Bridge Rd, Belmore) no tracking and Bridge Rd observed to be clean.
- Beams noted on TPZ barriers to be removed. Refer note and close out photo provided by SC within Inspection Report.
- SM enquired if shade cloth was required to be installed on fencing. Further discussion held for SM to provide SC advice on whether shade cloth is required to be installed.

# Non-compliances:

No non-compliances recorded for the reporting period.

### LW North Complaints (excluding property damage related complaints):

- 1/11/21 Blues Point resident called stating that in her opinion SC concrete trucks were driving too fast on Blues Point Road. Resident notes that while they were travelling at the speed limit, it is still too fast for the residential area.
- 8/11/21 Blues Point Resident called to complain about a vacuum truck onsite clearing out the water from the weekend rain. Resident also mentioned that it had no noise suppression and was running from 7:35am-8:12am. Caller described the noise as a constant high pitch noise.
- 11/11/21 Resident emailed to express concerns about the number of trucks per hour driving down Blues Point Rd and alleged continuation of illegal parking bus stops, no stopping zones and trucks idling.

# LW South Complaints s (excluding property damage related complaints):

There was one ER inspection conducted by the ER on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2021. No issues were raised at this inspection.

#### VC-ISD

There were two ER inspections conducted by ER on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2021 and 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2021. The key issues raised at these inspections were:

- Some side noise blankets on pump enclosure were hanging loose and unsecured (Closed)

- High impact noise activities, including sheet piling and concrete breaking/pecking continued into the agreed respite period with the childcare centre on High Street of 9.30am-10.30am (an additional hour of respite is offered from 12.30-1.30pm) The activities appeared to be noncompliant with the agreed respite periods and CoA E37 and/or E38.
- A large area of water had pooled in the centre of the site. It was not clear why the issue had occurred. A pump was being organised to divert the water to the Water Treatment Plant (WTP). TSE is understood to have been issued a defect notice for clean-up of the site, with a lot of litter and other materials discovered after their demobilisation.
- Two full IBCs of Potassium Permanganate were stored next to the WTP without bunding.
- Builders sand had been used as a bund to prevent water ingress into open penetrations. This is assumed to have been in response to recurring groundwater overflow from the sump on Level B3.

   Dewatering post-rainfall
- Gate PB10 (BEW), South Terrace Punchbowl: NDD for tree roots; Buried route to ULX commenced
- Gate PB15, South Terrace Punchbowl: CSR and piling for GST bridge
- Bankstown Early Works (BEW) Metro Services Building (MSB): Piling for the MSB commenced; Asbestos removal at southern platform area underway; Fencing for southern platform work zone established in part of the bus layover area; Steel fixing upon the piling pad; Spoil loadout; Maintenance of boundary controls, hazardous chemical storage
- BEW Southern down platform: Piling for platform commenced; Surface stripped and controls placed during wet weather

### **ER Inspections**

There were three ER inspections conducted by the ER in November 2021 (02/11/2021; 17/11/2021 and 30/11/2021). The key issues raised were:

- Cess drainage pits were unprotected and required maintenance after rainfall in the vicinity of two GST installation work areas
- Jerry cans of diesel and ULP were stored without secondary containment in some areas
- A covered stockpile of unknown material was located at the base of the batter chute below RW21, Lakemba. The final design of the batter chute was questioned (geofabric hanging out the edge etc.); awaiting response to RFI
- A generator and 1,000L diesel fuel cell were located adjacent to an open stormwater culvert at the BEW North Terrace Site Compound. While the generator and fuel cell are likely to be self-bunded, there was a risk of fuel leakage or spill via the transfer process. A nearby spill kit bin was almost empty.
- Excess cement mix was observed in a grassed area, which should be moved to a designated waste storage area
- Minor tracking and sediment was observed in the gutter at the site access to the Belmore AMZ. While there was
  evidence of street sweeper use, the access had not been attended.

Actions were raised for the above issues, and all actions were in the process of being closed-out by JHLOR.

### Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

The ER is not aware of any non compliances for SMC for the period.

There were no incidents for SMC reported to the ER under conditions A36 of SSI 8256.

There were two Class 3 environmental incidents reported during the period:

- SMC-INC-008 (3/11/2021): A number of small tree branches had been trimmed without a Vegetation Removal/Trimming Permit in place. Barricades and signage were in place around the tree. An investigation found less than 5% of the overall live crown has been removed and the pruning has not significantly impacted the condition or amenity value of the tree.
- SMC-INC-009 (7/11/2021): A subcontractors 42t Kolmar Hi-Rail Excavator came off the tracks. At the time of derailment a hydraulic hose split, spilling approximately 3-5 litres of oil. Most of the oil was captured following the deployment of a spill kit. JHLOR sprayed Oil-Gone over the impacted ballast. The spill kit material has been cleaned up.

The ER is not aware of any complaints received during November 2021 related to the SMC works.


