

Project update – Barangaroo Station

April and May 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66-kilometre standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland CPB Ghella (JHCPBG) is building the 15.5-kilometre long twin railway tunnels between Chatswood and Sydenham and excavating six new metro stations, including one at Barangaroo.

Barangaroo Station – upcoming work

In April, the Barangaroo Station team will begin installation of the precast super-T beams. These beams are made of steel-reinforced concrete and will form the roof of the future station. Deliveries will be ongoing until June during normal construction hours. Installation will also be ongoing between April and June and may take place up to midnight Monday to Friday, with tower crane operations until 10pm. Installation will also continue Sundays from 8am to 6pm.

Other key activities in the station include building stairwells and concrete structures that will house operational systems for the new station and metro trains. Concreting activities will also continue in the underground crossover cavern.

The Hickson Road footpath will be closed to pedestrians from mid-April 2021 between High Steps and beneath Munn Street. This is to allow concrete finishing works to continue in the Barangaroo Station box.

The temporary footpath closure will coincide with the reopening of the Barangaroo foreshore, which will provide continuous pedestrian access between Barangaroo South and Barangaroo Reserve. Further updates on the exact date of the reopening will be provided in weekly emails and a separate notification.

The table below provides more information about construction hours and activities planned for April and May 2021 (see map overleaf). All activities are weather and site conditions permitting.

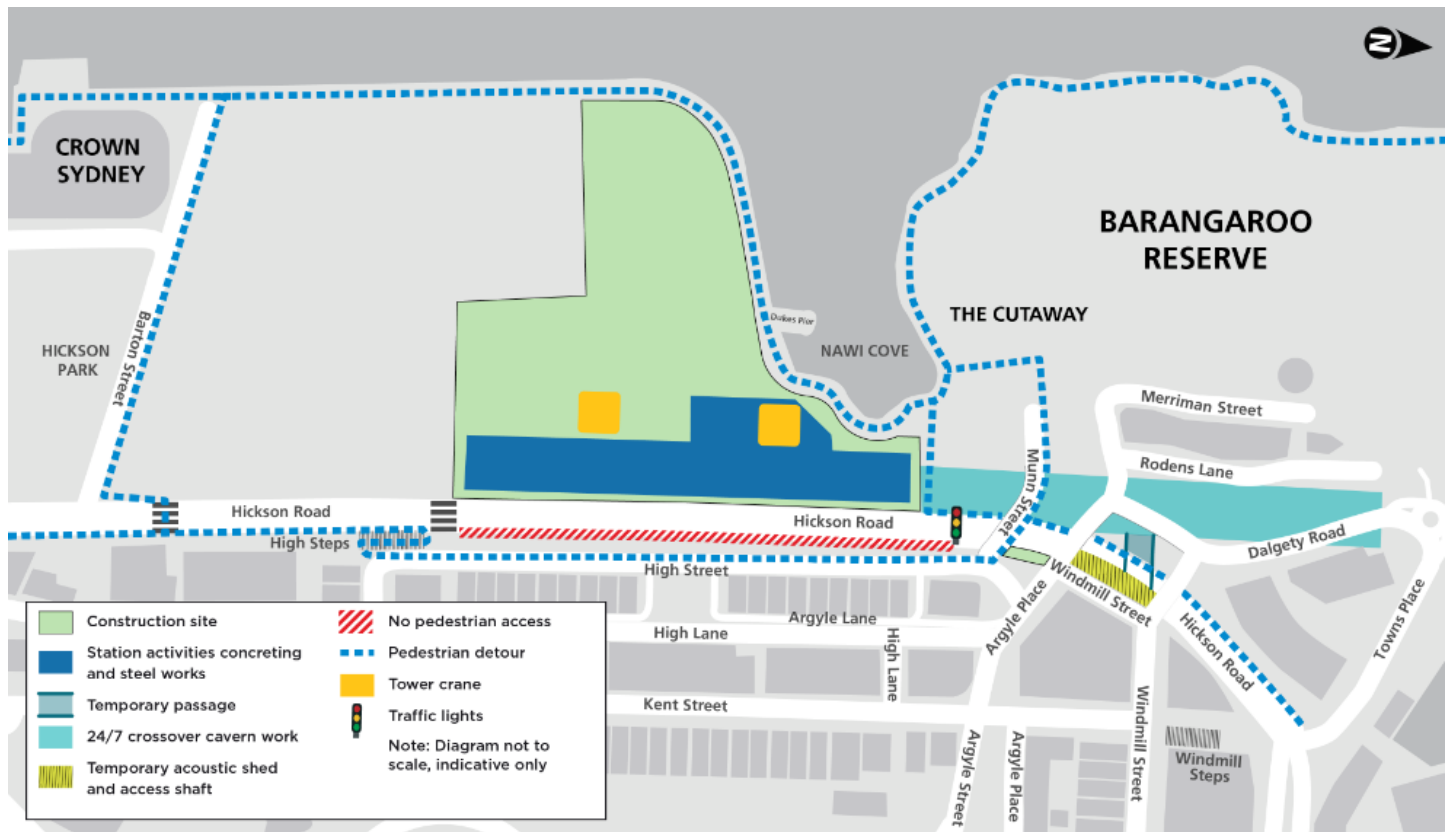
What to expect

- There will be intermittent periods of noisy work. If any high impact noise activities such as saw cutting and hammering are required at night, they will be carried out as early as possible and will stop before midnight.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used where feasible and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum.
- Temporary lighting may be used to ensure a safe work site and will be directed away from properties.
- There will be increased light vehicle and truck movements.
- Equipment used includes drills, tower cranes, vacuum excavation trucks, mobile cranes, elevated work platforms, concrete saws, grinders, concrete pumps, excavators and compactors.
- There will be temporary single lane closures on Hickson Road during out-of-hours work. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- Access to the High Steps, Nawi Cove and Barangaroo Reserve will be maintained at all times.
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times.
- Permanent restoration of roads and footpaths affected by the works will be undertaken at the end of the project.
