

Project update – Barangaroo Station

June/July 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66-kilometre standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

John Holland CPB Ghella (JHCPBG) is building the 15.5-kilometre long twin railway tunnels between Chatswood and Sydenham and excavating six new metro stations, including one at Barangaroo.

Barangaroo Station – upcoming work

In June and July, the Barangaroo Station team will continue installation of the precast super-T beams that will form the roof of the future station. Deliveries of these beams will be ongoing during normal construction hours. Beam installation may take place up to midnight Monday to Friday, with tower crane operations until 10pm. Installation will also continue Sundays from 8am to 6pm.

Other key activities in the station include building stairwells and concrete structures, which will house operational systems for the new station and metro trains. Concreting activities will also continue in the underground crossover cavern.

The Hickson Road footpath will remain closed to pedestrians between High Steps and beneath Munn Street to allow for finishing works to continue in the Barangaroo station box.

At the end of June there will be some out-of-hours work on the bridge structure in Hickson Road. A temporary closure of Hickson Road will be in place between Towns Place and Napoleon Street during this work. The following tables provide more information about this and other activities planned for June and July 2021. All activities are weather and site conditions permitting.

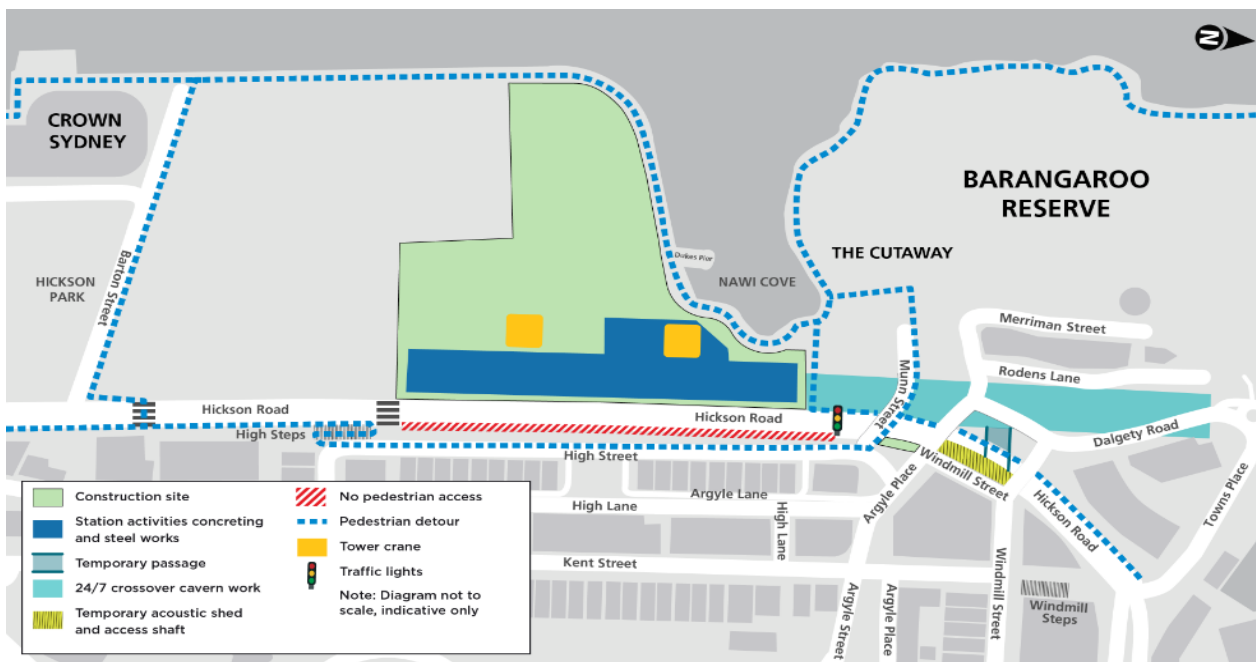

What to expect

- There will be intermittent periods of noisy work at the Barangaroo site in June and July. If high impact noise activities such as saw cutting and hammering are required at night, they will be carried out as early as possible and will stop before midnight.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used where feasible, and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum. Temporary lighting may be used to ensure a safe work site and will be directed away from properties.
- There will be increased light vehicle and truck movements.
- Equipment used includes but is not limited to, drills, tower cranes, vacuum excavation trucks, mobile cranes, elevated work platforms, concrete saws, grinders, concrete pumps, hydraulic pumps, excavators, compactors, and hand tools.
- There will be temporary lane closures on Hickson Road during out-of-hours work. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- Access to the High Steps, Nawi Cove and Barangaroo Reserve will be maintained at all times.
- Access to properties and driveways will be maintained at all times.
