Installation of platform Canopies ongoing and new canopies installed on Platform 14. Installation of skylight panels in Platforms 12 and 14 involving coring and sawing of concrete. Fit out of the Platform and other levels. Various FRP works including mole holes. Ventilation fans operating in Mole Hole 3 with silencers. Removal of concrete by sawcutting to access rail levels. Installation of escalators and fit out within the various levels. Central Walk – Last of the FRP works for wall and floor slabs occurring. Ongoing installation of new escalators and final panels around the new escalators. Other fit out activities. Works within hoarded work zones on suburban Platforms 16-23 and platform surface excavation during rail possession weekends. Sydney Yard – Removal of the main Water Treatment Plant with water directed to Line Wide WTP at Marrickville, except where capacity was not available. Ghost Platforms (above ESR Platforms 24-25) - Ongoing electrical and other fit out. 			
Key Construction Activities Look Ahead			
Ongoing activities as described above ER Inspections			
 There was one ER inspection conducted on 30/03/2022. Due to the wet weather and safety risks, LOR conducted an inspection on 2 March 2022, photos of which were shared during a meeting on the same day. Due to COVID isolation requirements, SM conducted an inspection on behalf of the ER on 16 March 2022. The key issues raised during these inspections were: Sydney Yard: Maintenance of ERSED Controls. Water management continued to be a challenge during the period with excessive rainfall on a number of days; the WTP being de-commissioned; and Line Wide not able to accept water. LOR reported that water was pumped to the surface and 			

being de-commissioned; and Line Wide not able to accept water. LOR reported that water was pumped to the surface and on to the WTP and noted there was some pooling of water on the surface where some water is likely to have overtopped controls to the environment (ballast). Discharge of water to the environment is covered under the Water Overflow Strategy. It was agreed that this document should be updated to better reflect the current site arrangement.

ER Inspections

There were three ER inspections conducted by the ER in March 2022 (01/03/22; 15/03/22; 29/03/22). Key notes/issues raised are summarised below:

Southern Dive & SMTF South Marrickville:

ER Inspection #102 SMTF S and BPS – 01/03/22 (Tuesday)

Canterbury to Campsie BPS - Pat O'Connor Reserve (Canterbury):

- Cable bridge worksite (Ausgrid side) section at top of the batter was observed to be uncovered with evidence of erosion on geofabric protecting remaining batter. Additional sediment controls in place alongside Cup and Saucer Creek. Action raised and closed out by SC, following ER Inspection on 1/3/22.
- Anzac St Compound Access sandbags installed to control sediment run-off. Discussed additional ESC required to manage minor run-off observed on pedestrian footpath (within the Reserve) during the inspection. Action raised and closed out by SC, following ER Inspection on 1/3/22.

Southern Dive & SMTF South Marrickville:

- Damaged sediment controls and minor rip noted on geofabric protecting stormwater drain within the 'Clean Water Management' Zone area SC informed the ER that it was highly likely that mobile plant had driven over drain controls. Action raised and closed out by SC, following ER Inspection on 1/3/22.
- SC informed the ER that street sweeper had been mobilised on 1st Mar 22 morning. Evidence of cleaning undertaken by SC street sweeper was observed in sections of the gutter apart from areas where cars were parked (due to restricted access). Sediment accumulated in kerb drain around parked car would be removed during scheduled maintenance. Ongoing monitoring and maintenance required.

Northern Hub, Artarmon – TSS and Blues Point Access Site

ER Inspection #103 – 15/03/2022 (Tuesday)

Blues Point Access Site

• Paint flakes (minor quantity) from concrete barrier observed in a section of the gutter, with remainder of gutter in area clean at the time of inspection. SC informed the ER that paint flakes would be removed. Note raised and closed out by SC on 15/3/22, following the ER inspection

SW Corridor Traction Substation sites

ER Inspection #104 - 29/03/2022 (Tuesday)

- **Canterbury TSS**
 - Discussed general housekeeping required at TSS worksite post WE39 possession. SC informed the ER that housekeeping is scheduled, however scheduled works on-site have been affected by Covid impacts on workforce and weather. Note raised for photos to be provided to ER following clean-up.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256. No minor incidents (Class 3 events) reported to the ER, for this reporting period.

Non-compliances: Two non-compliances reported to the ER in this reporting period:

On 21/03/22 NCR (Blues Point) recorded, following a complaint received on 18/03/22 (refer below Complaint section) and further investigation of the complaint by SC found that the truck was a SC subcontractor's (P&M Galea) vacuum truck that had failed to comply with road rules and the Blue's Point CTMP/site access protocols. The vacuum truck had been observed by complainant to be parked in excess of 30 minutes in East Crescent St (6m off Blues Point Rd) and in a 'no stopping zone' facing the wrong way on a one-way street. Actions were raised and closed out/in the

process of being closed out including toolbox delivered to P&M Galea operators to reconfirm requirements for access in/ around the Blues Point project and reminder letter sent to suppliers on the back of this NCR of BP's CTMP key requirements /site access protocols.

1/03/22 - SMTF South - SDPP- NCR recorded for finalisation and works that have commenced on installation of external facades of the Covered Store building at SMTF S, prior to the SMTF South Precinct SDPP being approved by DPE (CoA E101). The draft SDPP has been subject to numerous iterations and review by the DRP with most recent advice and action record (dated 19 Nov 21) stating *"The Panel supports the presented visual impact assessment and notes that Viewpoint 11 could be considered to have a minor positive impact as opposed to a minor adverse."* All outstanding comments from the DRP relate to minor landscaping recommendations which are currently being addressed before the SDPP can be finalised, endorsed by the DRP and submitted to DPE for approval. Furthermore, the Covered Store (building in question) is located within the central portion of a 6-hectare SMTF industrial facility with minimal opportunity for direct public visibility and will be used as a material storage shed during construction of SM works and then be modified to be incorporated as part of a permanent materials storage facility to support SM's infrastructure maintenance operations. The construction of the architectural finishes for the building will therefore only be finalised after the SDPP is approved. The building sits alongside several temporary structures as part of the extensive SM construction site in the Marrickville industrial area.

Actions were raised and closed out including most recent draft version of the SDPP and the most recent DRP advice to be provided to DPE immediately to allow for the review process to begin; endorsement of SDPP by DRP and final SDPP and DRP advice to be provided to DPE for approval (submitted on 4 Apr 22).

LW Northern Sites - Complaints:

- 2/3/22 Blues Point (BP)- noise (standard /OOHW)- Resident responded to EDM about urgent dewatering work
 required on-site and complained that on-going work had been of great disturbance to the residents at BP, especially
 concrete breaking activities over the past two weeks. Resident further stated she was not offered any compensations
 or respite to help reduce the impacts. SC further investigated the complaint, noting respite hours implemented for
 high impact noise works and responded to resident outlining criticality of the works and noting endeavours to
 complete these works ASAP, while minimising impact.
- 18/3/22 Blues Point -traffic, transport & parking Resident complained about a dewatering truck parked on East Crescent St in a non-stopping zone, more than 500m away from BP Site; truck idling for more than 30 min, facing the wrong way in a one-way street - supplying photo evidence. Refer NCR recorded above.
- 22/03/22 Blues Point –noise /notification of work resident complained about commencement of works in the area (operating since 6:45am) and enquired about duration/ completion dates of the work. SC investigated and confirmed that the daily pre-start was held at 6:45am and work started at 7am with first truck arriving on-site between 7 and 7:15am. SC contacted resident regarding investigation and enquiry but resident stated will call SC back when suitable.
- 25/03/22- Blues Point noise (standard hours) and dust complaint Resident complained that her building block is
 losing tenants due to on-going works; amount of dust she witnessed from a truck while being loaded was excessive
 and she mistook it as fire (supplied image of truck within site boundary) and that noise from recent transformer
 demobilisation was "horrendous". SC investigated further regarding dust and that removal of transformer was not
 impactful activity and beyond standard construction noise. SC informed the resident that trucks are allowed to idle
 within site boundary as they wait to be loaded and drive away from site. Due to the on-going wet weather, the dust is
 contained however, spotters are in place to wet any concrete or other material before loading into the trucks to
 ensure dust is minimised as much as possible.
- 25/03/22 -Northern Connection noise (standard construction hours) resident complained about recent noisy day work. SC investigated and confirmed that the work was standard day time work in the rail corridor (not out of the ordinary), had been ongoing for months and will continue till about June. SC responded and apologised for the construction noise, explaining what the work was and how long it would go on for and offered to discuss further.

LW Southern Sites - Complaints:

- 21/03/2022 Lakemba substation utility supply interruptions resident informed SC SEM that Mains power had not been returned to the property after property was on generator power. SC SEM investigated further and informed the resident the power would be switched over from the generators to the Mains and to be in contact if it had not.
- 26/03/2022 Canterbury substation traffic, transport & parking resident complained about traffic impacts at Hutton St (Canterbury) and that temporary measures (referred to "road closure") are unsafe and obstructing traffic in case of an emergency. SC investigated and explained to the resident that there is no road closure, but traffic controllers are on-site to facilitate safe movement of heavy vehicles in/out of site and to ensure safe flow of local traffic. SC assured resident that she can drive her car from her property and leave any time next day if she needs to.

ER Inspections

MP-ISD

There was one ER inspection conducted by the ER on 25th March 2022 (ER inspections are on a four week cycle). One issue relating to storage of chemicals was raised during the inspection.

VC-ISD

Two ER inspections conducted by the ER on 1 Mar 2022 (Tuesday) and 23 Mar 2022 (Tuesday) (ER inspections are on a three weekly cycle weather permitting). The following issues were raised including actions for the Contractor to address:

- Some damaged sandbags noted (potentially from wet weather) within the site, near access gate
- Minor tagging observed on hoardings at Victoria Cross South
- Water from the concreting works was overflowing the controls and draining through a coir log and down the access
 road. While there is containment of the water at the front of the site in the surface drain (and pumped back to WTP),
 it is considered better management to contain the water used in the area at the source. Further, the coir log control
 had not been recently replaced which is likely to reduce its effectiveness.

CN-ISD

There was one ER inspection conducted by the ER on 16th March 2022 (ER inspections are on a fortnightly cycle weather permitting). The following issues were raised:

- Access to flammable liquids container storage cage at B4 was severely restricted by scaffolding and materials stored on the cage. AWE to ensure adequate access, unencumbered by storage of construction materials, to dangerous goods storage areas.
- Stormwater pit ERSED protections on Clark Lane South required ongoing maintenance.

PS-ISD

There was one ER inspection conducted by the ER on 15th March 2022 (ER inspections are on a 3 weekly cycle weather permitting). There were no issues raised during the inspection.

Discussed relocation of real-time noise monitors with Acoustic Advisor. Monitors to be relocated by acoustic consultant as appropriate.

WL-ISD

There were two ER inspections conducted by the ER on 10/03/2022 and 31/03/2022 (ER inspections are on a 3 weekly cycle weather permitting). The key points raised at this inspection were:

- Cope St Closure established including jersey barriers / screens fencing with noise blankets, and stormwater pits protected
- JHG report no issues with WTP and Turkeys Nest with heavy rainfall of past weeks
- Appropriately decant chemicals and dewater hazardous substance bund to restore bunding capacity
- Clean-out litter and food wastes from spill kit, and secure lid
- Lighting cable tied to existing fixtures (air vent and pipework) to prevent impact to heritage building fabric of the Church Annex
- Clean-up cementitious fines at Wellington St gate to mitigate tracking to road. Note leaking watermain is washing any tracked material to roadside drain
- Discuss upcoming activities of Capping Beam Demolition and proposed timings as submitted in Contractors OOHW
- Action (as advised by Acoustic Advisor) to extend noise blankets along gawk screens adjacent Linewide concrete deliveries to be passed on to Linewide Contractor by Principal Contractor (JHG)
- Replace broken silt sock at pit at Cope St North
- Acoustic Advisor request for Contractor to confirm the use of the building to the NW of the Botany / Henderson intersection that appeared to accommodate residential use, prior to planned OOHW

There were no non-compliances reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period.

- 25/3/2022: Resident called to complain about OOH Utility works on Hickson Road, approved under OOHWA-006.
- 27/3/2022: Resident called to complain about OOH Utility works on Hickson Road, approved under OOHWA-006. Under investigation.
- 28/3/2022: Resident called to complain about OOH Utility works on Hickson Road, approved under OOHWA-006.
- 30/3/2022: Resident called regarding an increase in truck movements OOH, due to the traffic diversion in place as part of the Hickson Road ROL. Upon investigation the deliveries were not thought to be related to the project. Stakeholder appreciated the call and did not require any further action.

The number of complaints had increased for the project due to the frequency of OOHW increasing. More complaints are expected once the demolition of Hickson Road commences in late April/early May.

Respite has been offered in the form of 2Hrs daytime respite, and no noisy works after midnight during OOH. OOH works are also scheduled so works are not conducted in the same location for more than two consecutive nights. Alternative Accommodation has not been triggered, though is available to be offered if required on a case-by-case basis.

ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections conducted by the ER in March 2022 (08/03/2022 and 22/03/2022). The key issues raised were:

- BEW: South Terrace, Bankstown: Three layers of boundary controls inside the rail corridor fencing had failed; dirty
 water could be seen leaving the site. To be replaced/refreshed to reduce risk of water pollution.
- Punchbowl Hi-rail Access Pad: Coir logs were in place along the gate/site boundary, though dirty water could be seen seeping through in a couple of locations. There was no evidence of dirty water entering stormwater gutters or drains.
- BEW: Stacey Street Bridge: Large unsealed ground areas had been covered with geofabric to reduce the risk of sediment- laden runoff leaving the site during recent large rainfall events. The site needs to be handed over to Line Wide in early April and the condition of the site needs to be consistent with the condition of the site prior to JHLOR works commencing.
- BEW: South Terrace, Bankstown: The condition of the site access from the bus layover to the southern down platform works was deteriorating. No tracking was evident.
