

## Notification – St Marys

1 August 2022

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport is the new metro railway line which will service Greater Western Sydney and the new Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport. A city-shaping project, the 23-kilometre new railway will connect the Western Sydney Aerotropolis in the south with St Marys in the north– where customers can connect to the existing Sydney Trains suburban T1 Western Line. The NSW and Australian governments have a shared objective of having Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport operational when the airport opens for passenger services.

CPB Contractors Ghella Joint Venture was awarded the tunnelling contract for Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport in December 2021.

### Changed traffic conditions: Station and Gidley Streets

As part of the final traffic arrangement, Station Street will be permanently one-way westbound with a new access road linking Station Street and Phillip Street for the duration of construction. Changes to the traffic management will be staged. As part of this work, street parking on Station Street will be removed. Please see the map overleaf for the changed traffic management.

Once the new access road is constructed and open to traffic, Station Street will be converted to allow westbound traffic only via Lethbridge Street. Gidley Street will be closed to traffic and pedestrians, and will become part of the St Marys construction site. Work is expected to start from **Monday 8 August 2022** and take up to three months to complete, weather and site conditions permitting. Work will be carried out during standard construction hours **Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 1pm**. No work will be carried out on Sundays or public holidays.

### Out-of-hours work: Chesham and Glossop Streets

Work to install new utilities is carried out during standard construction hours. To minimise impacts to essential services and traffic some work will also be carried out outside standard construction hours, **Sunday to Thursday 8pm to 5am from Monday 29 August to Friday 16 September 2022**, weather and site conditions permitting.

#### Work will include:

- Installation of site hoarding
- Excavation and earthworks
- Construction of new road pavement including kerb and gutter
- Setting up temporary sites and temporary equipment such as generators and lighting towers
- Trenching and installing conduits
- Disconnection and reconnection of utilities

#### What to expect:

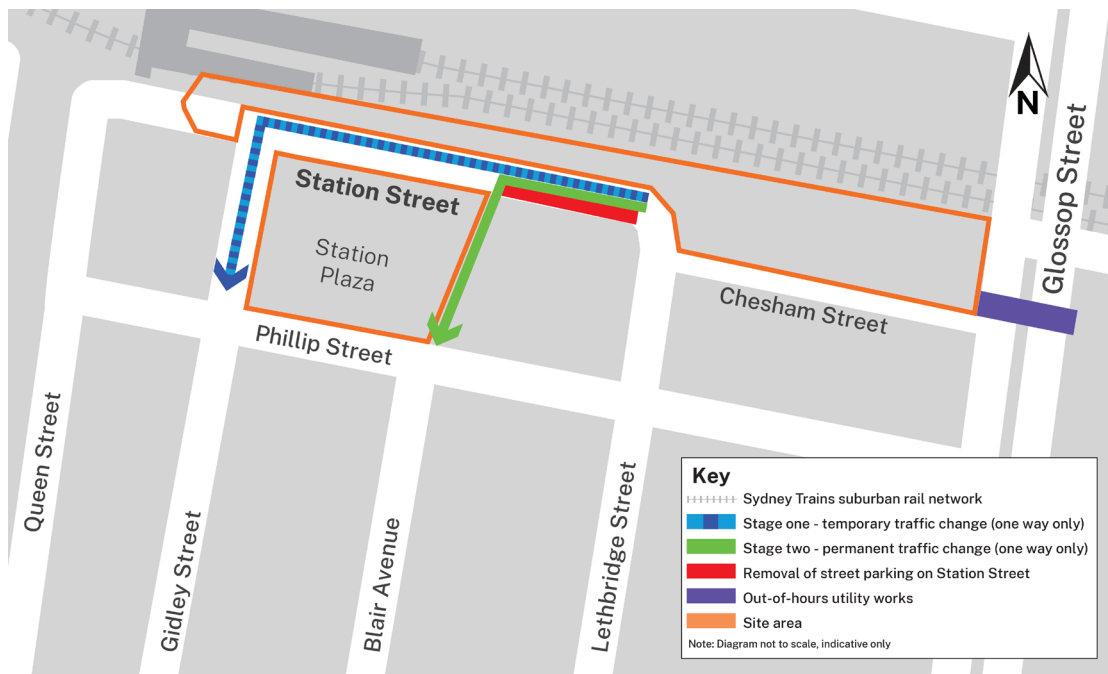
- Some work activities will generate noise. Mitigation measures will be in place to minimise these impacts including noise monitoring and respite periods
- Increased personnel and vehicle movements in and around the work areas
- Traffic control and electronic signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and traffic safely around work areas
- Affected residents will be separately notified of interruptions to power supply
- Removal of parking on Station Street

**Equipment used:**

Equipment for this work includes but is not limited to barriers, traffic management devices, vacuum excavation vehicles, excavators, compaction rollers, heavy vehicles and trailers, water carts, mist-sprayers, drills, concrete saws, rock crusher, mobile cranes, asphalt paving equipment, bobcats, chain saws, generators, compaction rammers, mulchers, survey equipment, light vehicles, concrete pumps.

**Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes:**

During the work, traffic control and signage will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists with any changes to traffic conditions. This may include intermittent lane closures and stop-slow traffic controls. The times of these changes will vary and are dependent on road authority approvals. Access to driveways and buildings will be maintained at all times.
