- SMTF S (Sydney Steel Road) Minor graffiti observed on non-branded shade cloth installed (near graffiti lane).

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

No non-compliances reported to the ER in this reporting period. There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256.

One minor Class 3 event reported to the ER, for this reporting period is summarised below:

27/09/2022- Class 3 - Resin applied to grout the water-leaking cracks at cross passage XP34 (within tunnel) near Blues
Point was, leaked out into the tunnels mixed with water. The slurry was noted to have solidified at cross passage XP32
within the tunnel and was noted to be not moving further. Impacted area was cleaned up and water leak fixed by the
grouting process.

Complaints during this reporting period are summarised below:

- 06/09/2022 Chatswood Dive Site Noise & vibration (OOHW)- Resident complained about metal clanging around 10pm at night. She requested follow up call on the next day. Work was ceased on complaint being relayed to Site Team. Complaint triggered SC to further review and revision of applicable OOHW on surface including toolboxing relevant site team.
- 12/09/2022 Blues point Cumulative impacts (Std hours) Resident complained about the ongoing construction
 work at Blues Point, stating that the loud noise from the works is excessive and has been going on for months. Further
 investigation by SC noted provision of respite hours by SC (for high impact noise activities) and noted other contractor
 [engaged by North Sydney Council (NSC)] have also been upgrading activities on-site which included jack hammering
 activities that concluded at 5:30pm whilst SC works conclude between 3-4pm. Further, SC also notified NSC of
 complaint and was advised that the works will be investigated to ensure completion with minimal impact.
- 16/09/2022 Blues Point Property Access Resident has sent a follow up email in regard to beach access being reinstated, stating that the commitment made to the community has not been reached and would like resolution ASAP.
- 19/09/2022 Crows Nest ISD (LWW) Worker behaviour Building owner emailed about workers sitting on the footpath outside the designated break areas and in front of the fire safety door. This is third complaint raising this issue from that area.
- 29/09/2022 Southwest Corridor (LWW) Cumulative Impacts resident emailed regarding garbage trucks being unable to collect rubbish from Railway St, Hurlstone Park as part of the pad mount lifts occurring.
- 30/09/2022 Campsie to Canterbury power upgrade (LWW) Traffic, Transport & Parking Resident concerned about the rectification and reinstatement of the traffic island/roadblock at the end of Onslow Ln onto Onslow St, Canterbury.
- 30/09/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood)- Traffic, Transport & Parking Resident called to express frustration that a truck was in the way of his driveway when he returned home. Asked that the truck please be moved. Resident later thanked the project team for their speedy response.

Complaints during this reporting period unrelated to SM activities:

- 15/09/2022 Waterloo (LWW) Noise & Vibration OOHW Resident emailed stating that for the last three nights, they have been hearing tunnelling noise and sensing vibrations. Further investigation of complaint deemed that works were not related to SM/SC activities based on resident's location, distance to SC works/Station works/tracks and that SC have concluded all civil work and have light mechanical & electrical fit out activities within the tunnels. At the location closest to the resident, no activities occurring overnight except for the operation of a high rail (low impact and consistent activity over the past 6 months).
- 22/9/2022 Campsie Substation Noise & Vibration OOHW -Resident called to complain about excessive noise from the construction site next to his house. Further investigation deemed that works were not related to SC/ Downer and that it could be local council works currently being undertaken.

Audits

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward

Key Points:

All complaints received in reporting period are summarised above. Further analysis of this shows only one of these
related to OOH Noise complaint regarding metal clanging around 10pm at night (related to Chatswood Dive Site). The

ER notes that this complaint triggered SC to act promptly, further review and revise applicable OOHW work practices on surface including delivering a toolbox to relevant site team.

- No OOH Noise/Vibration complaints received from the Southwest Corridor two-week shutdown that is in progress related to LWW works.
- Current works at LWW sites continue to be managed appropriately; ER Inspections across this month (including
 possession inspection) continued to identify generally minor actions and improvements.
- Overall, the Project performed well in the reporting period. The Project Team continue to be responsive to queries/comments raised in document reviews and recommendations made by the ER.

- Water/ERSED management from wet weather
- Two week shutdown continuing along Southwest Corridor (24 September 9 October 2022)
- Chatswood Station rail possession October 2022(3 9 October 2022)

- Canterbury to Campsie BPS works Cooks Ave Joint Bay backfilled and worksite demobilised in Aug 2022. Sealing works (Anzac St and South Parade joint bays) to avoid water ingress, further testing for water leakage and determining further actions for management.
- Contingency OOHW for dewatering (dependant on wet weather) extended with anticipated completion in mid-November 2022. To date SC has reported no OOHW undertaken for dewatering.

Complaints / Incidents / Non-compliance

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to complaints have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Complaints are discussed where relevant for each package below.

There were no incidents for any of the ISDs reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. Where the ER is aware of minor events and non-compliances, these are as documented below.

Three (3) potential or actual non-compliances were reported to or identified by the ER:

- 21 September At an ER inspection the ER observed Clarke Lane North Minor Ancillary Facility (MAF) was extended north beyond the approved limits, and materials were not stored in accordance with REMM LV1. Non-Compliances with Conditions of Approval (CoA) A18 and A19, as well as, with REMM LV1. An NCR has been received for ER review.
- 28 September Non-Compliance with Condition of Approval (CoA) E44. Stakeholder expressed concern over loud noise (self-measured at 70 dBA) from concrete hammering on Level 0 occurring outside her window at 18:15 (outside construction hours). ER awaiting additional information.
- 28 September Stakeholder communicated she heard drilling noise at 57 dBA (self-monitored) after standard construction hours (19:25). Upon investigation AWE confirmed that "drilling" was going on Pacific Highway due to a. internal miscommunication. AWE indicated that a Non-Compliance (NCR) was raised in the project complaints log. The ER is awaiting additional information.

There were twelve (12) complaints during the period, as follows:

- 7 September Complaint related to TSS rather than the Crows Nest ISD Project
- 12 September Clarke St Stakeholder expressed dissatisfaction with no prior consultation on delayed reopening of Clarke Lane (south) due to crane extended boom install delays due to windy conditions during works. AWE provided paid parking until wind dropped and install was completed.
- 12 September Stakeholder complaint about water turned off without no prior notification. Upon investigation complaint was considered unrelated to Crows Nest station works.
- 14 September Stakeholder expressed concern over vibration levels felt at property last week between the hours of 12am -1am. Work was not occurring at Crows Nest during this time. Complaint forwarded to Systems Connect. Possible works from council, Ausgrid, Sydney Water etc.
- 14 September Stakeholder expressed dissatisfaction with noise levels during standard hours, respite hours, and OOH. Stakeholder has an infant who is having trouble sleeping. Her residence faces the Cranes. AWE informed stakeholder this is being investigated with internal team, provided stakeholder with current communications, and added stakeholder to conman for future work updates, and offered ear bud respite offer to stakeholder. Awaiting additional information
- 19 September Building owner sent an email to the Crows Nest station team about workers sitting on the footpath
 outside the designated break areas, and in front of the fire safety door. Upon investigation AWE found the issue to be
 connected to Linewide works, not ISD.
- 20 September Stakeholder expressed concerns in Clarke Lane (north) around traffic management and worker behaviour including workers being in the middle of the laneway, and forklift driver not being guided by traffic controller(s). AWE included complaint/topic in general toolbox talk and toolbox talk for forklift drivers, placed two traffic controllers on Clarke Lane (north) at all times and communicated to workers to keep laneway clear at all times, with forklift activities to be reduced unless required. The ER noted similar issues on Clarke Lane north during the inspection of 21 September.
- 21 September Stakeholder expressed discontent with not receiving her request of noise cancelling headphones (as requested during initial consultation on Tuesday 20 September for upcoming potholing OOH work (scheduled 26 and 27 September). AWE Rang back stakeholder and offered respite offer of personalised earbuds. Offer was declined. Stakeholder only wants noise cancelling headphones and requested her complaint be escalated. AWE then responded in writing with possible solutions and next steps should she want to escalate the matter. Note that the works have been re-scheduled to early October. ER awaiting further information on the matter.
- 23 September Director of Kids' childcare centre in park across the road from utility works on Clarke Street approached subcontractor team member to enquire on approved noise levels during respite hours (12pm -2pm) as it was inconveniencing children's nap time. AWE advised the stakeholder that the noise during respite hours is within approved noise levels. Reportedly the stakeholder was comfortable with work to continue, and AWE advised they will monitor noise levels Clark St utilities work moving forward.
- 28 September (17:03) Stakeholder expressed concern over loud noise on site (self-measured at 70 dBA) occurring
 outside her window. Stakeholder has a 3-month-old baby who's bedroom faces Clarke Lane north. Upon investigation
 AWE confirmed it was jackhammering of a slab. AWE informed stakeholder that noise is acceptable for less 6 hours in
 any given day, provided assurance the noise would stop at 6pm, and organised in house noise monitoring for the
 following week. ER awaiting further information.
- 28 September (18:15) Stakeholder called to complain that noisy work (jackhammering of the slab) was continuing until approximately 6.30pm when it was supposed to stop at 6pm as informed. AWE rang back to apologise and

stakeholder confirmed the noisy work stopped at approximately 6.30pm. The ER is awaiting further information on the matter.

28 September (19:25) - Stakeholder (no location provided) communicated she heard drilling noise at 57 dBA (self-monitored) after standard construction hours (19:25). Upon investigation AWE confirmed that "drilling" was going on Pacific Highway due to a. internal miscommunication. AWE indicated that works were stopped immediately, and it was recorded in the communication log that a non-compliance (NCR) was raised. ER awaiting additional information.

The consistency of community consultation and engagement declined during the period due to various changes in community relations personnel and, it appears, some communication breakdown with the environmental team. An appreciable increase in noise and vibration related complaints was noted as a result.

Two minor (Class 3) event and nil non-compliances (NC) were reported to the ER during this reporting period. Summary of minor events provided below:

Incidents:

- 12/09/22 Class 3 WL ISD Cope St After refuelling Crane whilst packing up, leak from connection point on truck tank occurred leading to minor spill (~9L) on-site (hardstand). Equipment was shutdown, leak stopped and spill kit materials used to clean spill.
- 28/09/22 Class 3 WL ISD Waterloo Site Station Box Level B3 leak in radiator of Melrose crane leading to minor spill (around 1-2L) on-site (hardstand). Equipment was shut down and spill kit material used to clean up spill.

Complaints during reporting period are summarised below:

- 2/09/2022 Worker behaviour Caller made a complaint regarding security guard at the Waterloo Project
- 20/09/2022 Noise & Vibration -OOHW Caller advised they are 70m from the Metro station and there are currently works taking place. Appears to be concrete being cut with a saw or a chainsaw running and that its nearly 23:00. Resident was contacted and advised that all saw cutting was now complete as of 10.40pm. Works (approved OOHW) would continue but noise levels would be lower. Resident was also advised that there would be work tomorrow night but its further down Wellington St towards Botany Rd, which should lessen the noise.
- 21/09/2022 Noise & Vibration OOHW Excessive noise past Midnight. Sounds like cement cutting or some motorised machine. Intermittently going off and on. OOHW approved and AA offered to residents close by however, this property was not triggered by AA. Contacted resident to advise no works are planned for tonight. Note this resident complained previously on 20/09 about the same noise (refer above complaint).
- 21/09/2022 Noise & Vibration Standard hours/ Worker behaviour: Noise complaint re: works. Issue occurred approximately at 16:30 on 21/09. Caller advised that a van which caller believes belongs to the workers had music blaring very loudly and disturbing residents for approximately 30-45 minutes. Caller stated that it happens periodically. S&CLM spoke to resident and apologised for music and worker behaviour and advised resident that JHG speak to workers in induction regarding music and behaviour and will also re-toolbox workers on these topics. Resident sent though footage but van could not be identified nor workers; could just hear music through a tree.
- 27/09/2022 Noise & Vibration OOHW Complaint regarding noise at night after 11pm and effects on community and sleep. Resident described the noise as sheet metal banging. CSM apologised for disturbance and offered ear moulds and explained some works (approved under OOHWA) need to be done at night and JHG try and minimise noise where possible at night.

Complaints unrelated to SM activities during reporting period:

 6/09/2022 - Waterloo Station – Noise and vibration OOH - Caller advised excessive noise from works occurring on Botany Rd, Waterloo. Caller declined to leave details. JHG checked site hive data for noise levels and activities - noting only traffic noise was reported before and after call was received. No activities taking place on Botany Rd by JHG. Deemed unrelated to SM/JHG activities.

 reminded not to have music on in the early hours, never at excessive volumes and that music will be banned from

- 26/09/2022 Noise & Vibration OOHW Complaint from resident regarding loud construction noise, trucks and concrete cutter noise coming from Miller Street. Wanted to understand how long/how many nights the work will take place and that the noise had finished as he was on the call. SCLM confirmed these noisy works will take place again tonight however the concrete cutting (loudest works) had been completed and if resident would like to be added to the upcoming works emails (resident declined).
- 27/09/2022 Noise & Vibration OOHW Complaint from resident regarding noise and that it was occurring for more than one night in a row. Wanted to know when the late nights will stop. SCLM outlined the nature of the Miller St (utilities investigation) works to the resident, confirmed that the works had been completed and that the site will go back to normal hours, with low noise OOH activities from 6pm to 10pm.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for Barangaroo Station.

There were two reported non-compliances reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period:

- 2/9/2022: A non-compliance with CoA E6 was raised by the contractor on 2/9/22. The NCs resulted when trees located in The Cutaway were pruned before the Flora and Fauna Management Procedure (FFM-P) in the CEMP had been approved to incorporate the tree pruning and removal scope, and before upload of the document to the project website. The pruning was not carried out by a suitably qualified arborist, which forms a requirements of CoA E6: "Any approved pruning and/or tree removal work is to be carried out by an arborist with a minimum AQF Level 3 qualification in Arboriculture". Notwithstanding the above, the necessary updates to the FFM-P had been made at the time that the pruning occurred, and the document was in the process of being finalised and approved. As such a secondary non-compliance with CoA B15 has also occurred.
- 2/9/2022: A non-compliance with A8 was raised by the contractor. Demolition of the temporary Hickson Road concrete structural supports using a hydraulic hammer was observed during the ER inspection on 2/9/22. The CNVMP and Civil Works CNVIS sets a safe working distance from an excavator with *hydraulic* hammer to a reinforced structure of 5m. The activity was within 5m. It was also confirmed that vibration monitoring was not being undertaken as required by the CNVMP. The CNVIS for civil construction activities is to be revised to nominate that attended vibration monitoring should be carried out when working within 1 metre of the Hickson road wall (rather than 5 metres). The CNVMP will also be updated accordingly.

The ER is aware of one complaint received during September 2022 related to BESIX Watpac works:

ID 28/9/2022 (reported 4/10/2022): Customer complained about lack of wayfinding signage for diverted pedestrian
access from the Barangaroo ferry and on Hickson Road. The customer wasted time on their journey re-routing around
the foreshore. Opportunities for additional signage are being reviewed.

Audits

An internal environmental audit was conducted by BESIX Watpac on 20/9/22. The ER did not attend, and no Independent Environmental Audits have been scheduled.
Summary of Environmental Performance

Focus has been made in the implementation of corrective actions raised as a result of non-compliances, ER inspections, and as documented in meeting minutes. To provide additional assurance that compliance is being managed effectively, and adequate planning and assessment of environmental risks is taking place, ER inspection frequency has been increased temporarily to weekly. ER inspections are now being attended by members of the BESIX Watpac senior leadership team.

The management of stockpiles and waste classification remained an ongoing issue. Further assurance is being sought to confirm that waste tracking processes are being managed in accordance with legislative and other requirements. Conditions of approval and legislative requirements associated with site contamination and remediation are in the process of being reviewed by the contractor's contamination consultant, though the results of the review and remediation approach has not yet been communicated to Sydney Metro or the ER.

September saw a reduction in the number of complaints received, which aligned with a reduction in out of hours works, and noise and vibration intensive work in general, with the majority of the current demolition scope (Hickson Road bridge deck and Shark's Fin) complete.

Issues with compliance at the new works area at The Cutaway were ongoing in September 2022 and relate to sandstone block removal, tree removal, landowner consent and project approvals. The contractor needs to communicate upcoming works to the environment team, including the ER and Sydney Metro, and environmental issues need to be raised ahead of time to allow for an assessment of environmental risks, review of approval mechanisms etc. This has been communicated to the contractor and new methods for communication of this information have been minuted and will be implemented in October 2022.

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Plan for dewatering of the western civil pit direct to harbour and focus on the implementation of mitigation measures in the CEMP and Soil and Water Procedure.
- Compliance with water quality parameters in the WDIA during discharge from the WTP
- Landowner consent, approvals, biodiversity, contamination and heritage management for planned seawater cooling water installation works at Nawi Cove
- The transfer of water from Line Wide to BESIX Watpac from the surface and Level B6
- The management of works in zones with high-moderate archaeological potential and the reporting of unexpected finds
- The management, storage and disposal of coal tar and asbestos-contaminated spoil
- Completion of the Compliance Tracking Report (CTR) Q1 and Q2 2022.

ID TBC, 26/9/2022 (not yet reported): Resident at Loftus Street, Belmore called about noise affecting their sleep (shift worker) during daytime hours. It is understood a vacuum truck was in use at the time of the complaint. The complainant was contacted by Comms and closed-out.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Summary of Environmental Performance

The avoidance of impact to mapped TECs, and identified threatened species as defined in Revised Environmental Mitigation Measure (REMM) B4 remains an ongoing focus. All TEC and threatened species locations inspected during ER inspections have been appropriately barricaded and sign-posted and workers tool-boxed at pre-start as required.

Erosion and Sediment Control Plans (ESCPs) are consistently reviewed and updated for new work areas and changed activities. The ESCPs demonstrate that Erosion and Sediment (ERSED) issues have been reviewed in detail before applying required controls.

The BAC CEMP and Sub-plans have been approved by DPE, and works will be able to commence under the Plans once the PCCR is submitted to DPE. Low impact works for BAC were ongoing in September 2022, including tree removal at Bankstown Station. Tree removal within station precincts and compliance with tree numbers in the SPIR remains an ongoing focus, particularly in relation to upcoming security fencing design.

Review of proposed sites for use as ancillary facilities for BAC was ongoing during September.

The ER is aware of one new NCR for the month and 30 complaints relating to MCL works. There were no incidents for MCL reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

The NCR was summarised as follows:

NCR041 (under investigation) - Unapproved out of hours work at Canterbury Station. Contractor informed the ER that a concrete overpour had occurred at Canterbury and the contractor had used a hammer attachment during the night period contrary to the approved OOHWA.

Regarding the previously raised NCR041 – Community bike facilities were not reinstated on Charles Street, Canterbury - this had been re-numbered to NCR039 by the contractor after the previous monthly ER report was issued.

High impact noise and vibration works post Shutdown 4 are likely to be reduced from the Sydney Metro sites. Looking forward:
