

ER Inspections

There were four ER inspections conducted by the ER in October 2022 (4/10/22, 11/10/22, 18/10/22 and 25/10/22). Key new actions raised are summarised below, with actions either closed out/ in the process of being closed out by SC:

<u>SMTF South and BPS works - ER Inspection #128</u> - 4/10/22 [Tuesday; Rainfall previous days to inspection – 0.0 mm (03/10); 1.6mm (02/10); 4.2 mm (01/10)]

 SMTF S – (Near Southern Dive – adjacent site shed) - Some damaged sediment controls to be replaced/tidied up along SC's controlled overflow strategy discharge location.

<u>SMTF South and BPS works - ER Inspection #131 - 25/10/22</u> [Tuesday; 22.8mm total rainfall recorded on 25/10 and rain (mm) previous days to inspection – 6.2 mm (24/10); 0.0mm (23/10) and 1.6mm (22/10)]:

- SMTF S (Sydney Steel Road) Apart from minor tagging on signage, no graffiti observed on non-branded blue shade cloth installed along section of Sydney Steel Road. SC to address in accordance with Project VAMP.
- SMTF S Some damaged ESC around drain near Administration Building and around drain near Gate S3 to be refreshed.
 Sydenham Station Minor (non-offensive graffiti) observed on shade cloth and Project Signage. SC to address in
- accordance with Project VAMP.
- Randle Ln Joint Bay Minor waste observed near the ATF at Randle Ln to be removed and disposed.

Northern Sites/Barangaroo laydown area - ER Inspection #129 - 11/10/22 [Tuesday; Rainfall previous days to inspection: 2.2mm – 10/10, 50.2mm - 09/10 and 5.6mm 08/10)]:

- Area between Spoil Shed, Logistics Shed and WTP Some silt observed at the exit of the Logistics Shed near the pickup sump of the water treatment plant. Discussed and agreed this would be tidied up from hardstand area.
- Northern Dive Building Noise mats installed in area to be re-installed such that absorbent side is facing SC site works.
- Northern Connection (adjacent to rail corridor) Section of shade cloth observed on ground and discussed with SC regarding removal and affixing shade cloth around extended worksite, where safe to do so.
- Brand St (drainage works) and Valetta Ln Compound Noise mats installed at worksite for Brand St Drainage works and within Valetta Lane site to be re-installed such that absorbent side is facing SC site works.
- Hill St Ancillary Facility (Roseville) Discussed with SC re extension of shade cloth installed to extent of SC stockpile /laydown area. Action raised.

<u>SW Corridor Traction Substation sites- ER Inspection #130</u> – 18/10/22 [Tuesday – Rainfall previous days: 4.6mm - 17/10; 0.0 mm 16/10 and 0.0mm on 15/10)]:

 Belmore St Compound - Minor rubbish and can observed in spill kit near designated chemical storage container within the Compound.

approved via the OOHW Work Procedure, prior to commencing. Also that unapproved out-of-hours works in the Chatswood dive area are not allowed. Toolbox of specific requirements around works in tunnel portals and dive areas, with applicable personnel was delivered by SC.

Complaints during this reporting period are summarised below:

Northern Sites:

- 3/10/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Traffic, Transport & Parking Resident texted photos of car parked in a no stopping zone and another vehicle close to the resident's driveway making local reversing difficult. SC's Stakeholder Engagement Coordinator (SEC) responded to confirm the vehicles were removed.
- 3/10/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Traffic, Transport & Parking Resident emailed about large utes and private cars parked on the narrow Raleigh Street, causing congestion, making it difficult for residents to access their properties. SC's SEC responded to resident apologising and confirming the site team will reinforce the "no parking" for SC staff and sub-contractors' rule via toolbox at prestart. Traffic controllers are advised to monitor the situation.
- 8/10/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Traffic, Transport & Parking Resident in Smith Rd complained about not receiving a notification about the Brand St detour and also that workers are parking legally and illegally in Elizabeth St (adding to the traffic congestion in the area) and don't appear to be doing much work. SC's SEM apologised for the inconvenience of the traffic detour, provided copies of recent notifications to explain the nature, duration and reasons for the work and related detour. Provided more details about the communication approach and TMP. Added the resident to the project email list for future updates. Explained steps toolbox being taken to address the parking concerns, particularly any illegal parking.
- 12/10/2022 Chatswood Dive Site Noise and Vibration OOHW Resident complained about a saw being used "over the road" at 1am. NCR raised by SC following further investigation of this complaint (reported above within this reporting period). 13/10 - Resident emailed back to say that he was satisfied with the response and outcome.
- 13/10/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Noise & Vibration Standard hours; Notification of work -Resident describing experiencing low frequency noise and asking for how long it will continue. The resident also asking to be confirmed that the upcoming track investigation works will not be noisy, as it was outlined in the community notification. SC called the resident to provide information of flashback welding work being undertaken along the rail corridor during standard construction hours and is planned to finish by 6pm. Resident thanked SC for the update.
- 13/10/2022 Chatswood Dive Site (CDS) Worker behaviour; Traffic, Transport & Parking Resident has complained about what he claims to be several instances where vehicles have left CDS during the morning or afternoon peak and driven straight on to Hampden Road instead of turning right on to Mowbray Road.
- 20/10/2022 CDS Worker behaviour; Traffic, Transport & Parking Resident provided evidence (video) of a driver today not following the rules and driving out of the CDS straight on to Hampden Road, instead of turning right on to Mowbray Road. SC's developed corrective actions to address above two complaints on 13/10 and 20/10 from CDS, including counselling identified driver, expectations and the road rules. Disciplinary action will be taken if it happens again.
- 24/10/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Notification of work; Respite & AA Respite Resident claiming RO for work happening between 24 to 28 October suggested the window to take up RO is too brief and as a result he has missed out on previous ROs.

Southern Sites:

- 4/10/2022 Dulwich Hill TSS Property Damage/prevention resident's son making representations on behalf of the resident concerning allegations that two panels of their fence have been knocked out during installation of substation walls. The resident alleges contact has previously been made however there are no records of previous contact.
- 12/10/2022 Campsie to Canterbury power upgrade Worker behaviour Resident raised concerns about the hired security leaving rubbish and cigarette butts across the BPS Campsie-Canterbury site at Anzac Street Canterbury.
- 20/10/2022 Dulwich Hill TSS Property Damage/Prevention; Flora and Fauna- Resident raised concerns about tree being trimmed as well as damage to the fence after the work was undertaken. The resident supplied photos showing this damage and asked for the fence to be repaired and an explanation on why they were not notified. SC confirmed the shrub was trimmed as a result of assessing that the overhanging branches into the rail corridor would affect the plant using the area. The fence has since been repaired by the site supervisor as a gesture of good will and resident confirmed they were satisfied with the repair work.

Complaints during this reporting period unrelated to SC/SM activities:

 08/10/2022 - CSW - Surry Hills power upgrade (LWW)- The stakeholder emailed their concerns regarding driveway being blocked and insisted the driveway was blocked by a crane that was doing cable pulling from the joint bay despite there being no work occurring over the weekend. SC SEM contacted the site supervisor who confirmed no work was undertaken over the weekend and this was confirmed by the engineer. Upon further investigation, it was

confirmed that LOR (Central Station contractor), undertook work over the weekend. The complaint was subsequently forwarded to them for their investigations. Complaint deemed unrelated to SC.

Audits

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward

Key Points:

- All complaints received in reporting period are summarised above.
- No OOH Noise/Vibration complaints received from the Southwest Corridor two week shutdown that continued into October (1-9 October 2022) and the Chatswood Station rail possession October 2022 (3 – 9 October 2022).
- Following parking related worker behaviour complaints at the Northern Connection (Chatswood) sites during the Chatswood Station rail possession October 2022(3 – 9 October 2022), the ER requested/followed up with SC of records/measures implemented to address complaints received. SC provided records of pre-start briefing delivered to Northern Connection crew. In addition to reiterating the message at the prestart briefing, SC confirmed that SC's Construction Lead had written to the traffic control company engaged by SC to patrol local streets to request vigilance in preventing construction vehicles parking and additional signage was implemented in response to the complaints.
- One OOH Noise complaint noted in the reporting period at Chatswood Dive Site. The ER notes that this complaint triggered SC to act promptly - raise a non-conformance following further complaint investigation and toolbox specific requirements around works in tunnel portals and dive areas, with applicable personnel.
- Current works at LWW sites continue to be managed appropriately; ER Inspections across this month continued to identify generally minor actions and improvements.
- Overall, the Project performed well in the reporting period. The Project Team continue to be responsive to queries/comments raised in document reviews and recommendations made by the ER.

ER Inspections

There was one ER inspection on 19 October 2022 (ER inspections are on a fortnightly cycle weather and health permitting. 1 inspection was cancelled due to health constraints). The inspection was conducted by the ER. The following issues were raised:

- Storage of materials and equipment on Hume Street footpath outside the SSID boundary and outside hoarding/ fencing not consistent with REMM LV1 and CoA A17, A18 and A19. AWE to provide information on what approval/s have been received that permit the activity
- Secondary sediment controls and maintenance of existing ones required at Clark St. utilities works
- Observation of Clarke Street utility works indicated that insufficient acoustic blankets were used, and where used
 acoustic blankets appeared incorrectly oriented. AWE Environmental team to monitor use and provide guidance on
 appropriate use and installation of acoustic blankets
- Empty and partly filled fuel containers were observed without adequate bunding. AWE to provide designated fuel container storage areas and provisions for bunded storage away from those designated locations



There were no incidents for any of the ISDs reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. Where the ER is aware of minor events and non-compliances, these are as documented below.

One potential or actual non-compliance was reported to or identified by the ER:

6 October – two (2) stakeholders communicated they were complaining about noise happening in the street adjacent to the CNS construction site. They felt the noise levels were unacceptable and that greater respite should be offered. Upon investigation, SM and the ER concluded an approval was not in place for the works. Although an OOWH application had been submitted, ER comments in relation to community notifications had not been closed-out and the ER was awaiting satisfactory resolution of these. The OOHW works were approved on 7/10/22 at around 16:15. SM informed that given the common root cause, this Non-compliance and that identified on 28 September 2022 will be consolidated into one Non-Compliance Report relating to Condition E44.

There were six (6) complaints during the period, as follows:

- 6 October 20:53 Stakeholder phoned expressing concern about OOH noise happening after 6pm. AWE informed that Public Affair Manager and Place Manager were both aware of the approved planned works and confirmed with stakeholder that the potholing was taking place on Pacific Highway at 8pm 5am was approved and notified. Noise monitoring at site of work during work was within approvals Notification issued 29 September and email sent 30 September to stakeholder. AWE indicated that noise monitoring at residence was previously agreed with stakeholder and was rescheduled for Wednesday 12 October. The ER notes that as described in the Non-compliance details above the OOHW had not been approved at the time of the complaint.
- 6 October 22:52 Stakeholder phoned stating they were complaining about noise happening in the street adjacent to the CNS construction site. Caller said she has an email stating that there would be no heavy works in the evening and there is a loud noise in or around the site. Stakeholder stated there were two trucks across the road (one a dry vac) and that the noise was "unbearable". On further discussion with stakeholder confirmed that they felt the noise levels were unacceptable and that greater respite should be offered. AWE informed that works were approved and notified by AWE and phoned back stakeholder with that information. The ER notes that as described in the Non-compliance details above the OOHW had not been approved at the time of the complaint.
- 21 October 11:16 Stakeholder expressed discontent with noise impacts to his business on Clarke St. AWE visited the stakeholder to apologise for the inconvenience and confirm work would be completed on the day. AWE committed to updating the stakeholder of further works in this location and entered stakeholder into the distribution list to receive future communications.
- 21 October 11:23 Stakeholder expressed dissatisfaction with levels of noise occurring outside property. AWE called the stakeholder to apologise for the inconvenience and confirm work would be completed on the day. AWE committed to updating the tenants of 6-8 Clarke Street of further works in this location and entered stakeholder into distribution list to receive future communications.
- 21 October 13:00 Stakeholder expressed discontent with noise impacts during the day to his business on Clarke Street. AWE visited the stakeholder to apologise for the inconvenience and confirm work would be completed on the day. Committed to updating the stakeholder of further works in this location.
- 27 October Stakeholder expressed concern on their water being turned off during underground infrastructure upgrades, and not turned back on, and not receiving the community notification. AWE identified that Sydney Water did not identify property of complaint in their scope for this work. The complaint was to be referred to Sydney Water.

Core Focus Areas

Feasible and reasonable mitigation measures and methodologies proposed for upcoming capping beam removal works, upcoming utilities investigation and installation works, and noise intensive works on Level 0.

ER Closing Comments:

It appears that some communication breakdown between the community relations and construction personnel, and the environmental team continues to exist.

There was an overall decline in noise and vibration related complaints for the period.

There were no incidents for any of the ISDs reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. Where the ER is aware of minor events and non-compliances, these are as documented below.

There were no non-compliances/incident reported to the ER this period.

There were six (6) complaints during the period:

11 October - Princeton resident advised of noise complaint received regarding sawing, cutting or drilling at 9pm from Pitt Street South Site. Upon investigation CPB sent an email to the resident providing details of work activities that took place, tools used, and work hours. Provided reasoning on why work needs to take place at night (this work

requires a footpath and traffic lane closure), and also advised that noise monitor data was reviewed and that the work would be completed in one more night

- 18 October Customers staying at Castlereagh Boutique Hotel complained about noise from jackhammering and sawcutting on Castlereagh Street (North Site). Upon investigation, CPB informed the Hotel General Manager that high noise works were completed before midnight, as previously notified. Also advised that data from noise monitoring was assessed, and that works would require 2 more nights, however, noise levels would be lower.
- 25 October Resident complained about noise the previous night from North site. Following investigation, CPB emailed the resident providing information on work hours, the requirement for extended work hours, the work that took place the previous night at the north site and mitigation measures that are in place for night work activities. CPM also provided a copy of the November 2022 OOH community notification and extended offer to add resident to their distribution list so she can start receiving weekly project. email updates.
- 26 October Kimpton Margot Hotel (South site) representatives spoke with the site supervisor to advise of complaints received the previous night. Investigation concluded that that high noise utilities installation activities including saw-cutting and jackhammering were completed before midnight and all works were completed before 5am.CPB spoke with the hotel representatives about the noise and their work. CPB confirmed that was utility work scheduled for the next night, however, it was postponed and moving forward, CPB will attempt to schedule their utility work on nights where they are least busy. CPB also advised that there was an external contractor working in Pitt Street who were not associated with their work, and this was logged by their Site Supervisor. CPB provided contractor name to the Hotel representatives, who then proceeded to call the contractor.
- 27 October Eurotower resident complained about workers talking and making noise near her property. An early
 morning concrete pour was underway at the South site, per an approved OOH work permit. CPB apologised for the
 disturbance and advised the resident that CPB will raise this issue of noise/talking near properties with the team in
 toolbox talks. CPB will continue to address this issue and ensure the team are aware of site requirements and being a
 good neighbour with an ongoing commitment to continuously raise it with the team via toolbox talks.
- 29 October Resident complained about tools being used on the South site before 7am on Saturday morning and workers having a conversation and using swear words near her property. noise the previous night from North site. Investigation concluded that form workers were potentially on site prior to 7am but it is uncertain whether works were being conducted. CPB informed resident to discuss type of noise heard on Saturday morning. Resident said she heard tools being used, however, wasn't sure what type of work was being completed. She said she heard some deliveries taking place. CPB explained that they are able to have deliveries 24/7 on the project. Resident understood the requirement for 24/7 deliveries and said she understood that worker behaviour is going to be addressed in toolbox talks. Resident would like further information on what is specifically being built next to their balcony glass panels. CPB suggested to meet with the resident and strata committee to discuss scope of works. Resident appreciated the offer to meet with the team and will coordinate with other residents and strata. CPB to include details of work hours and worker behaviour in the next South site toolbox talk. Investigations are ongoing to determine the nature of works being conducted, if any.



There were no incidents for any of the ISDs reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. Where the ER is aware of minor events and non-compliances, these are as documented below.

Two minor (Class 3) events and nil non-compliances (NC) were reported to the ER during this reporting period. Summary of minor events provided below:

Incidents:

- 12/10/2022 Class 3 WL ISD Within Site compound on Cope St (hardstand) Minor oil spill of approximately 4L from forklift whilst working on Cope St. Spill cleaned up using spill kit materials
- 27/10/2022 Class 3 WL ISD Minor hydraulic oil spill (approximately 500ml on pavement/hardstand) from scissor lift on Level B5. Spill cleaned from area using spill kit materials

Complaints during reporting period are summarised below:

- 13/10/2022 Noise and Vibration Standard Construction Hours Noise complaint at Wellington St during standard hours that Vacuum Truck in use for non-invasive digging of services at 10am. Vac Truck commenced at 8.30am and was completed by 10.30am and left site.
- 20/10/2022 Noise and vibration (out of hours work)- Noise complaint on hammering and drilling noise from station since 9PM. General Super advised works included the use of hand tools only and no drilling was being undertaken.
 Works would cease within 30mins. E&SM contacted stakeholder and informed them works were approved under an OOHW permit, notified and would cease within 30mins.
- 21/10/2022 Noise and vibration (out of hours work) Noise complaint on hammering and drilling work since 9PM. Caller has called the last two nights re the same issue (refer above complaint). No drilling was occurring. The activities included the removal of large steel temporary structural beams that can only be removed at night time due the safety constraints during the day. E&SM contacted the stakeholder and explained the activities occurring on site were approved under an OOHW permit and would continue until early Saturday morning. Caller was advised that additional noise blankets had been installed to assist in minimising the noise from the activities.

Complaints unrelated to WL ISD/SM activities during reporting period:

 24/10/2022 – Caller advised that there is concrete cutting taking place at the corner of Wellington and Cope Street. No efforts to mitigate the noise, ongoing issue re lack of mitigation reported before. Further investigation identified concrete cutting for installing comms pit and the work was not associated to Waterloo ISD works/scope.



Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for Barangaroo Station.

There were no incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period. There was one Class 3 incident for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER for the period:

Sandstone blocks adjacent to Nawi cove outside of the Cutaway, used as heritage interpretation by INSW, were being relocated to allow for condensed water installation. The relocation was being carried out in accordance with a methodology which had been agreed with INSW and their nominated heritage consultant, Stratti. Stratti were not on site when the incident which is the subject of this report occurred. One of the sandstone blocks being relocated had a pre-existing fissure through it. As the block was being offloaded from the truck carrying it to the storage area on site the fissure split open The block was secured with a ratchet strap to prevent the spit from opening any further, and stored in a secure location, labelled and wrapped in plastic in accordance with the agreed removal / storage methodology. A heritage consultant will develop a methodology to repair the split sandstone block, in consultation with INSW. A report demonstrating that the repair was undertaken in accordance with the repair methodology will be prepared.

There were no non-compliances reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period.

The ER is aware of one complaint reported during October 2022 (but received in September) related to BESIX Watpac works:

ID 4050, 28/9/22 (reported 4/10/22): Customer complained about lack of signage at Barangaroo Ferry and that they
wasted time of their journey re-routing around the foreshore. The matter has been referred to Sydney Metro to review
wayfinding in place.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Focus has been made in the implementation of corrective actions raised as a result of non-compliances, ER inspections, and as documented in meeting minutes. To provide additional assurance that compliance is being managed effectively, and adequate planning and assessment of environmental risks is taking place, ER inspection frequency has been increased temporarily to weekly. ER inspections are now being attended by members of the BESIX Watpac senior leadership team. The management of stockpiles and waste classification remained an ongoing issue and in October 2022, though improvements in stockpile management were noted, including a greater focus on stockpile numbering, waste classification

and tracking. Ongoing assurance is being sought to confirm that waste tracking processes are being managed in accordance with legislative and other requirements.

Conditions of approval and legislative requirements associated with site contamination and remediation are in the process of being reviewed by the contractor's contamination consultant, though the results of the review and remediation approach has not yet been communicated to Sydney Metro or the ER.

Issues with compliance at The Cutaway were resolved in October 2022, with assurance provided to Sydney Metro and the ER that measures were in place and being implemented in relation to sandstone block removal, archaeological monitoring, waste classification, ERSED, landowner consent and project approvals. Significant improvement in the communication of upcoming works from the contractor to the environment team, including the ER and Sydney Metro was noted.

Meetings have been held and discussion has been ongoing around planning for the discharge of water from the western civil pit (direct to harbour) and compliance with the approved DPE CEMP & Procedures including water quality monitoring and contingency. It is understood this activity is unlikely to occur at this stage.

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Contingency plan for dewatering of the western civil pit direct to harbour, and focus on the implementation of mitigation measures in the CEMP and Soil and Water Procedure
- Compliance with water quality parameters in the WDIA during discharge from the WTP
- Options considered for the discharge of B3 groundwater
- Dust control, particularly across the hardstand
- The transfer of water from Line Wide to BESIX Watpac from the surface and Level B6
- The management of works in zones with high-moderate archaeological potential and the reporting of unexpected finds
- The management, storage and disposal of coal tar and asbestos-contaminated spoil
- Completion of the Compliance Tracking Report (CTR) Q1 and Q2 2022.



ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections conducted in October 2022 (4th and 18th October). Actions raised during the inspections were related to maintenance of levels on slurry bins, maintenance of ERSED controls, hazardous chemical storage, and visual amenity. Corrective actions were addressed by the contractor and evidence of close-out provided.



Belmore Triangle: One of the two slurry bins was full with risk of uncontrolled release with predicted rain. Water was pumped to another bin with additional capacity.



Bankstown Station: The sediment fence between the works and the North Terrace culvert had not been installed properly, increasing the risk of sediment entering the culvert during the next rain event. Controls were fixed prior to the next rain event.



Loftus Street, Campsie: Ballast reconditioning was underway adjacent to the hi-rail access pad



Loch Street, Belmore: GST installation under the Loch Street Bridge had commenced.

North Terrace Compound and culvert, Bankstown: Tree removal was complete under PCMWA-005 along the stormwater culvert and within the station precinct.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with followup actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for SMC, BEW and BAC.

There were no non-compliances reported to the ER during the period.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A41 of SSI 7400.

There were two Class 3 environmental incidents reported to the ER during the period:

- SMC-INC-028, 8/10/2022: During the Weekend 15 rail possession at 1400 a hi-rail trolley was discovered with an oil leak below the flat deck. The volume of the leak was approximately 3L and it was a thin surface streak over 250m of track on the up ARTC Line. Leak did not flow below the surface ballast. The surface between the ARTC track is already smeared with a layer of grease deposits. When the leak was spotted, it was immediately reported and investigated. The leak was concluded to be a surface leak with no harm done to the environment. The fittings below the plant were tightened and 7L of Oilgone200 was sprayed over the leak on the sleepers and ballast.
- SMC-INC-029, 9/10/2022: Dirty water observed in the street kerb and gutter, downgradient of an access gate in use by JHLOR during the WE15 rail possession. Prior to the event, ERSED controls were installed - the access track

stabilised with ballast and sediment sock check dams placed in kerb and gutter, downgradient of the access. Overnight rainfall of 50.8mm was received, and dirty water created at interface with the in-street destabilised spoon drain and ballast access ramp. Dirty water drained from the interface area through sediment sock check dams. Clean-up commenced immediately with on site sweeper running vacuum along the kerb and gutter until flow of dirty water stopped. Ballast access track reinstated.

The ER is aware of five complaints received during October 2022 related to the SMC_BEW_BAC works:

- ID 4074, 4/10/22 (reported 5/10/22): Complaint regarding generation of noise during standard construction hours. Telephone contact was attempted with the complainant, though no response received.
- ID 4075, 4/10/22 (reported 6/10/22): Resident concerned about the removal of trees at Bankstown Station. Telephone contact was attempted with the complainant, though no response received.
- ID 4098, 8/10/22 (reported 10/10/22): Complaint was in regard to a worker moving residential bins to make way
 for contractor parking. The vehicle was moved and the team toolboxed on parking, particularly moving private
 property.
- ID 4099, 8/10/22 (reported 11/10/22): Complaint regarding parked vehicles causing congestion near Close Street, Canterbury Findings and actions: At start/handover of shifts during possessions some vehicles are parking in this zone. At other times there are private vehicles so difficult to identify ownership or if connected with project. Raised concerns with Construction team. For Possession work - traffic controller to direct workers not to park on the road. Parking issues to be raised at future pre-start meeting. To be highlighted in White Board slides. Complaint actions still open.
- ID 4101, 8/10/22 (reported 11/10/22): Resident complained about OOHW construction noise near Close Street, Canterbury. It is understood segregation fence works were underway in the corridor at the time. The resident had been offered AA for both Friday and Saturday night. Resident states acknowledgement and prompt response sufficient and declined further AA offer.

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits. JHLOR has scheduled an Internal Environmental Audit for 8/11/2022.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Erosion and Sediment (ERSED) control remains a focus, particularly at site access points to reduce risk of dirty runoff and tracking. Site access points are generally well established and maintained throughout JHLOR PC areas along the Sydenham to Bankstown corridor. Erosion and Sediment Control Plans (ESCPs) are consistently reviewed and updated for new work areas and changed activities. The ESCPs demonstrate that ERSED issues have been reviewed in detail before applying required controls.

The BAC CEMP and Sub-plans have been approved by DPE, and works will be able to commence under the Plans once the PCCR is submitted to DPE. Sydney Metro is waiting on the finalisation of the Utility Management Strategy prior to submission. Low impact works for BAC were ongoing during the possession in October 2022, including track slab investigations at selected station (which has since been postponed to after the Christmas Shutdown). Tree removal within station precincts and compliance with tree numbers in the SPIR remains an ongoing focus, particularly in relation to upcoming security fencing design.

Review of proposed sites for use as ancillary facilities for BAC was ongoing during October.



Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for DCP and HBW.

The ER is aware of no non-compliances for the month and 12 complaints relating to DCP and HBW works. There were no incidents reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

The complaints are summarised as follows:

- There were four complaints that were not related to Downer's work including requests for AA post-holidays, Council
 works and an unknown generator at night that was not related to Metro activities.
- One noise complaint from Hurlstone Park from a resident returning home during their AA period.
- One complaint about sediment in the gutter at Hurlstone Park (noted to be a sandbag that had been run over).

- One noise complaint at Dulwich Hill (noted resident returned home after being away for six weeks and missed notifications).
- One parking complaint from Wiley Park.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

The ER discussed potential environmental issues with Downer throughout the month, in particular preparation for rain events and upcoming possessions over WE19 (5th to 7th October) and Shutdown 5 (24 December 2022 to 13 January 2023). Community and contractor construction fatigue is an ongoing issue for the project, with the ongoing reduction in scope due to industrial action outside of Sydney Metro's control.

It is proposed that landscaping works may commence over the next month, however, the availability of landscaping supplies has been raised as a potential delay due to recent flooding in NSW.
