

The scope of works conducted during the reporting period was small and low risk. The project is winding down with most project scope complete, with mainly defects remaining. The ER is waiting on the completion of all scope and materials removal from laydown areas before handover and condition completion is finalised. With the non-award of the Bankstown Station and Additional Corridor (BAC) contract, SSJ laydown areas are unlikely to remain in use by JHLOR.



Nil non-compliances reported to the ER in this reporting period. There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256. No minor Class 3 events reported to the ER, for this reporting period.

### Complaints during this reporting period are summarised below:

- 09/12/2022 –Southwest corridor (LWW) Canterbury Noise & Vibration (OOHW); Respite & AA Respite Resident raised concerns about noisy work in the middle of the night on Charles St, Canterbury. The resident said they had not been notified of the work and the work was noisy.
- 23/12/2022 -Campsie to Canterbury power upgrade (LWW) Property Access; Worker behaviour LWW Complaint regarding the joint bay work on Gould St, Campsie. Complainant raised concerns about the length of time the work was ongoing, the access to the front of his property with limited street parking, and rubbish left by contracted security.

One (1) potential or actual non-compliances was reported to or identified by the ER:

Discussions are ongoing in respect of potential non-compliance with AWE, either against A8 or E33.

#### **ER Inspections**

#### Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for Barangaroo Station.

There were no incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period.

There was one potential incident for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER for the period (which was later reported as a Class 3 environmental incident on 6 January 2023):

24/12/22: At approximately 2pm on Saturday 24th December 2022 an INSW ranger noticed that there was a sediment in the water to the west of Dukes Pier and Nawi Cove was discoloured and appeared brown. An investigation was conducted and concluded the discolouration was due to a combination of a very low tide and the discharge of the WTP at 16.5l/s in the shallow water locally disturbing the sediment on the seafloor at the discharge point.

Actions required for closure are related to the reduction of WTP discharge velocity to reduce the disturbance of the sea floor during very low tide events to prevent a recurrence. The contractor has also been advised to review the Water Discharge Impact Assessment to ensure compliance with the nominated flow rates.

There were no non-compliances reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period.

The ER is not aware of any complaints reported during December 2022 related to BESIX Watpac works.

#### Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

#### Summary of Environmental Performance

The management of stockpiles and waste classification remained an ongoing issue and in December 2022, with the ER and Sydney Metro still awaiting records requested to verify compliance with waste classification and hazardous waste transport and disposal requirements, as well as compliance with the National Environmental Protection Measure (NEPM).

Conditions of approval and legislative requirements associated with site contamination and remediation are reportedly still in the process of being reviewed by the contractor's contamination consultant, though the results of the review and remediation approach has still not yet been communicated to Sydney Metro or the ER.

The following general observations were made during the period:

- WTP and surrounds including hardstand, filter cake and IBC storage well maintained
- Western civil pit installed using crane and diver successfully without any discharge to harbour required
- Dust mitigation is ongoing and improvements in dust suppression controls have been noted
- Out of hours works in Zone 6 Hickson Road have been managed well with very few complaints; which is thought to be attributed to good communications as well as good on site management by the project team
- Confirmation of the remediation approach for the site remains outstanding; awaiting advice from contamination consultant

- Proposed plans to relocate the WTP were discussed at the end of 2022; this may involve interim measures to comply
  with the planning approval, meet water quality objectives for discharge to harbour etc. Potential update or addendum
  to the WDIA required
- EPA attended site on 16/12/22 to sight the implementation of measures post-incidents raised in relation to discharge to harbour reported to the EPA. The EPA has since closed the investigation and is understood to have been satisfied with the information provided to them.

#### Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Relocation of the WTP and the design and implementation of water management requirements associated with this process
- Compliance with water quality parameters in the WDIA during discharge from the WTP
- Options considered for the ongoing treatment and discharge of B3 groundwater
- Dust control, particularly across the hardstand and stockpiles
- The management of works in zones with high-moderate archaeological potential and the reporting of unexpected finds
- The management, storage and disposal of coal tar and asbestos-contaminated spoil
- Completion of the Compliance Tracking Report (CTR) Q1 and Q2 2022.

#### **ER Inspections**

There were no ER inspections conducted in December 2022 due to very limited activities and low environmental risk, as determined by JHLOR and Sydney Metro in consultation with the ER.

A Pre-Christmas Shutdown inspection was conducted by JHLOR with a copy provided to Sydney Metro and the ER on 23/12/22. A summary of the inspection outcomes was also provided as follows:

- Soil Surface being stabilised at Wairoa Street bridge with Jute Mesh (under the bridge) and Turf (outside the bridge)
- Soil Surface being stabilised at Belmore T by Spraygrass
- Soil Surface being stabilised at Punchbowl by Spraygrass
- Livingstone Road Bridge and Marrickville Avenue, site area secured and no bare soil.

Ewart Street new site entrance:

- Inside the fence, soil surface covered with DGB
- Outside the fence, bare soil covered with Jute Mesh and seeded.

#### Summary of Environmental Performance

Planning is underway for the WE32 Possession. The possession scope is anticipated to be limited, though the full scope is to be determined and confirmed with the Sydney Metro enviro team and the ER.

Environmental risks on site are generally low and mostly confined to erosion and sediment (ERSED) control at site accesses, and the stabilisation of batters and site surfaces.

The Bankstown Station and Corridor Works (BAC) contract was not awarded to JHLOR so all scope under the DPE approved CEMP and Sub-plans has been cancelled, this includes all plans for the establishment of ancillary facilities and track slab installation.

Tree removal within station precincts and compliance with tree numbers in the SPIR remains an ongoing focus, particularly in relation to security fencing design. The scope and details for construction of this element is also pending.

- Management of ERSED controls generally
- Management of noise during OOH Work, e.g. WE32 Possession

#### Non-Compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for MCL.

The ER is aware of one new NCRs for the month and three complaints relating to MCL works. There were no incidents for MCL reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

The NCR is summarised as follows:

NCR045 – Unapproved OOH work area (Broughton Street Compound) at Canterbury (SM ID Evt-0001520). The area was not included in the approved OOHWA for the Canterbury Road works. Note due to the shutdown period, this has been raised by Sydney Metro during their January Report. Actions taken in response to the NCR included:

- There was a toolbox undertaken to ensure that the HSEJV environmental team are informed of all work areas and plant to be used earlier in the planning process. This also included timeframes for OOHWA to be submitted (internally 4 weeks prior to works), location maps matching scope maps, updated ECMs, TCP's and justification for the OOH work in accordance with the period prioritisation list.
- Specific to this NCR, the Toolbox raised that internal communication had not occurred for the work area to be included in the OOHWA and that no areas are to be used that are not in the OOHWA.

The complaints are summarised as follows:

- One noise and light spill complaint at Canterbury for OOH noise at the Broughton Street Compound (raised as NCR045)
- One complaint at Canterbury for OOH noise and request for RO for Canterbury Road works (note that RO was not triggered, and noise monitoring supported this)
- One complaint at Canterbury for OOH noise that was not related to Sydney Metro works
