

Notification – The Bays, Rozelle

20 January 2023

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, with a target travel time of about 20 minutes between the two centres.

Sydney Metro has been granted planning approval to construct twin underground rail tunnels between Westmead and Hunter Street in the Sydney CBD for Sydney Metro West. Acciona Ferrovial Joint Venture (AFJV) has been awarded the contract to deliver 11 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate five new metro stations, including a station at The Bays.

Revised Out-of-hours work update: Robert Street, Rozelle

AFJV is carrying out utility installation work along Robert Street. **Lane closures and detours are in place to facilitate the work.** Utility connection work within the White Bay Power and The Bays construction site is also being carried out. Some of this work must occur outside standard construction hours to minimise impacts on traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers.

Night work on Robert Street and the corner of Crescent Street will occur between **8pm and 5am on Sunday, Monday and Wednesday nights from Sunday 22 January until Monday 27 February 2023.** This work will likely continue in March and further information will be provided in late February. Noting no work will take place Wednesday 25th January due to the public holiday the following day.

Night work in the area between The Bays construction site and White Bay Power Station will occur from **6pm Friday 27 January until 6am Monday 30 January 2023.** After this weekend, it will continue on **Sunday, Monday and Wednesday nights, between 6pm and 6am until Monday 27 February 2023.**

Night work will include:

- Saw cutting the road surface
- Excavating a trench (will be covered at the end of each shift)
- Installing new pipes to connect to the existing watermain
- Cleaning and testing the watermain
- Backfilling the trench and reinstating the road surface

What to expect:

- Noise blankets will be used to minimise disturbance
- Saw cutting and hammering work will be completed by midnight
- There will be no disruption to supply of utility services
- There will be lane closures on Robert Street during the night work and vehicles will not be able to turn into Robert Street from Victoria Road. A detour will be in place via Darling Street and minor traffic delays may be experienced (see map overleaf)
- There will be no access to Crescent Street from Robert Street during the night work
- Access will be maintained to all properties and businesses
- The bus stop on the northern side of Robert Street will not be operational during the night work only. An alternative bus stop is located on Mullens Street (see map overleaf).

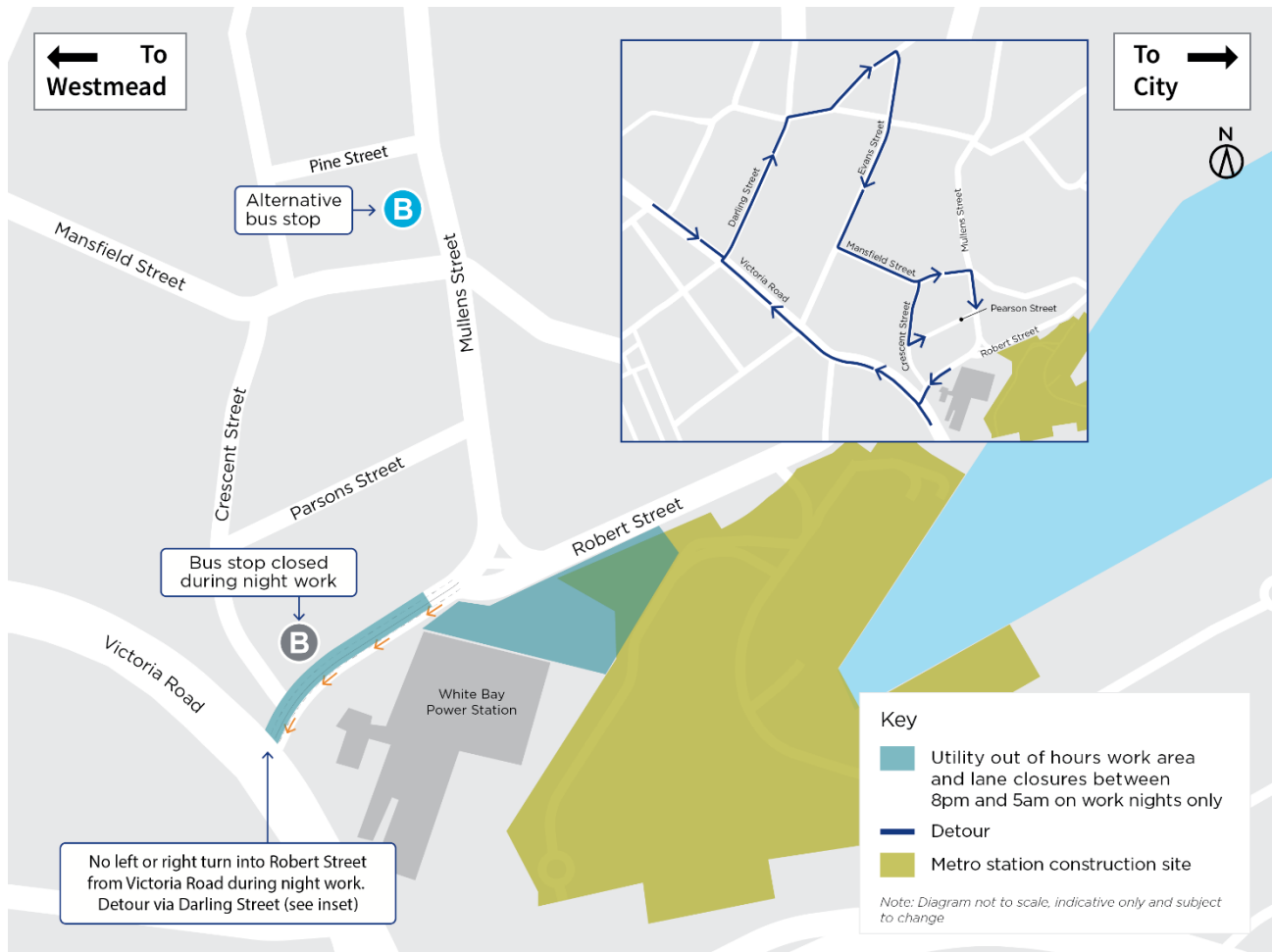
Equipment used:

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to: trucks, light vehicles, road saw, rattle guns, hammer drills, jackhammer, vacuum trucks, line marking truck, bobcat, excavator with hammer attachment, concrete trucks, drill rig, wacker packer, roller, generator, vibration plate, lighting tower and hand tools.

Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes:

Temporary lane closures and detours will be in place on Robert Street during the night work (see map below). Access to Crescent Street from Robert Street will be closed off during the night work only. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists with these temporary night-time changes to traffic.
