

Notification – St Marys, Claremont Meadows, Orchard Hills, Bringelly and Aerotropolis

15 February 2023

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport is the new metro railway line which will service Greater Western Sydney and the new Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport. A city-shaping project, the 23-kilometre new railway will connect the Western Sydney Aerotropolis in the south with St Marys in the north – where customers can connect to the existing Sydney Trains suburban T1 Western Line. The NSW and Australian governments have a shared objective of having Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport operational when the airport opens for passenger services.

CPB Contractors Ghella was awarded the tunnelling contract for Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport in December 2021.

Update to construction hours

Our project's construction hours are **Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm** and **Saturday 8am to 1pm**. Most work is carried out between these hours, however some work activities may be carried out after-hours to mitigate quality and safety risks, and in line with the project Environment Protection Licence, Road Occupancy Licences, and Transport for NSW requirements.

Our notification dated 16 December 2022 outlined extended construction hours to allow for the completion of continuous concrete pours and associated activities under a variation to the project Environment Protection Licence. This variation has now been extended to the completion of the station boxes and tunnelling works.

The extended construction hours will continue to be **Monday to Friday 6pm to 10pm and Saturday 1pm to 4pm**, for the completion of continuous concrete pours and associated activities to meet quality compliance requirements. Ensuring quality during concrete pours reduces the risk of rework and will enable the project to reduce the duration of shaft and station box construction. Work during these extended construction hours will occur up to six days per week. All high impact activities will cease at **8pm**.

What to expect:

Work activities will generate noise, vibration, dust and increased vehicle movements in and around worksites. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to surrounding neighbours, including noise and vibration monitoring, respite periods and dust suppression measures.

Equipment used:

Equipment for this work includes but is not limited to concrete pumps, concrete vibrators, concrete trucks, light vehicles and radios.

Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes:

During the work, traffic controllers and signage will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists safely around work areas. Traffic changes will include lane closures, contraflow traffic flow and stop-slow traffic controls. The times of these changes will vary and are dependent on road authority approvals. Property owners will be separately notified if access to driveways will be affected.
