



Project update – Pyrmont

27 March 2023

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, with a target travel time of about 20 minutes between the two centres.

Sydney Metro has been granted planning approval to construct twin underground rail tunnels between Westmead and Hunter Street in the Sydney CBD for Sydney Metro West. John Holland CPB Contractors Ghella Joint Venture (JCG) has been awarded the contract to deliver 3.5 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Hunter Street and excavate the Pyrmont and Hunter Street metro stations.

Pyrmont Station will be located between Pyrmont Bridge Road and Union Street and will feature two separate ground level entrances, designated as Pyrmont East and Pyrmont West.

Activities during April 2023

Geotechnical investigation, building investigations and utility relocation work will continue in Pyrmont throughout April 2023. Tree trimming and removal will also start at Pyrmont East from Tuesday 11 April with driveway construction at both Pyrmont East and West sites starting mid-April. Work during standard construction hours will include:

- Continuing geotechnical investigations and building investigations
- Continuing relocation of overhead power to underground on Paternoster Row
- Delivery of materials, machinery and equipment
- Continuing initial demolition of Pyrmont West which involves stripping internal areas of the building and installing site hoarding.

This work will be undertaken during standard construction hours between **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm Saturday**.

Work during out of hours will include:

- Tree trimming and removal outside the Pyrmont East and West sites
- Driveway construction on Edward Street and Pyrmont Bridge Road
- Low impact site surveys and installation of instrumentation and monitoring equipment

Out of hours work will commence Monday 3 April 2023 with work taking place between **6pm and 5am Monday to Friday.**

Low impact surveys and inspections will continue to be completed outside standard construction hours to minimise impacts on traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers. Noise from this work is expected to be minimal. These activities will continue to occur between 6pm and 6am Monday to Friday.

Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists with temporary changes to traffic conditions on local roads and footpaths during this work. Property and driveway access will be maintained at all times.


