Project update

May 2023

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

By 2030, Sydney will have four metro lines, with 46 stations and a 113-kilometre standalone metro railway system. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre.

Lendlease will deliver the new Sydney Metro Victoria Cross integrated station development at North Sydney, including the metro station, commercial building above and enhancements to pedestrian connections, retail and public spaces.

Upcoming work – Victoria Cross Station sites

Below is an indicative table of activities scheduled at the Victoria Cross Station sites in May.

Victoria Cross Station North site	 The following works will be conducted within the project site and may include but not be limited to: deliveries and concrete pouring via concrete pumps within project work zones tower crane and hoist operations delivery and installation of formwork, reinforcement, concrete, block work and structural steel delivery and installation of services, internal fit-out of components and facade rock hammering and excavation facade installation including: drilling glass installation steelwork installation crawler crane movements brickwork mixing and installation. 		
McLaren Street, adjacent to Victoria Cross Station North site	 During the month of May, B-Class hoarding will be removed along McLaren Street. Works may include but not be limited to: implementing pedestrian diversion in place for 12 weeks preparation of hoarding area for removal of existing B-class hoarding on McLaren Street removal of remaining B-class hoarding on McLaren Street. 		
Along the McLaren Street side of the Victoria Cross Station North site	Commencing 10 May, during standard working hours, works will include: delivery of equipment use of light excavator rock hammering and excavation saw cutting. 		

Victoria Cross Station South site	 Works may include but is not limited to: formwork and steel fixing works installing scaffolding within the site and along hoarding edge to create safe access for onsite workers tower crane and hoist operations workers accessing tunnels for fit-out of cross passages deliveries received at the Miller, Berry and Denison streets work zones structural steel installation concrete pouring via concrete pumps within project work zones delivery and installation of services and internal fit-out components façade waterproofing and installation. 		
Denison and Miller streets stormwater works	 Stormwater works will include: traffic and footpath access changes use of a small excavator for excavation, saw cutting, hammering and hand tools delivery of materials final connection of stormwater pits and pipes. 		
Adjoining tunnels	 The following works are being completed by Systems Connect and MTR Corporation in the adjoining tunnels: completing mechanical and electrical works in the tunnels installation of tunnel ventilation system and drainage equipment, cables and terminations, trackside equipment in the tunnels and platform completing acoustic noise treatment works in the tunnels testing and commissioning activities of electrical services, including track, power and communications and signalling equipment and systems. 		

What to expect

- Equipment used will include concrete pumps, elevated working platforms, mobile cranes, tower cranes, trucks, hand-held drills and light vehicles.
- Traffic, street parking and pedestrian changes to surrounding streets. Access to buildings and driveways will always be maintained.
- Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers, pedestrians and the community.
- Some of these activities will be noisy. The project team will limit these impacts where possible. Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used. Workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum.

Extended work hours:

Lendlease will continue working extended hours at both Victoria Cross Station sites from 7am to 6pm on Saturdays and Sundays. During the extended hours on Saturday 7am to 8am and Sunday 7am to 6pm, there will be no high noise activities such as rock breaking, rock hammering, sheet piling and pile driving occurring. These extended working hours are reviewed and approved under the standard out-of-hours works approval process.

Systems Connect work at Victoria Cross Station

Systems Connect (an unincorporated joint venture between CPB Contractors and UGL Limited) is delivering line-wide work including installing metro rail track, power systems and infrastructure to turn the excavated tunnels into a working railway between Chatswood and Sydenham.

Systems Connect will be accessing the tunnels through Victoria Cross Station sites and will be completing works in line with the Victoria Cross Station hours of operation. Work within the tunnels is approved to take place 24 hours a day, 7 days per week. Additional out-of-hours works may take place in the station box and adjoining track level for mechanical and electrical works. These are low noise works with no impact to the neighbouring community.

MTR Corporation is delivering the Trains, Systems, Operations and Maintenance (TSOM) work, which includes trains, signalling and communications systems, platform screen doors, and testing and commissioning of these systems for the Sydney Metro project between Chatswood and Sydenham.


