Construction update – Orchard Hills

Station Boxes and Tunnelling

23 November 2023

Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport is the new metro railway line which will service Greater Western Sydney and the new Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport. A city-shaping project, the 23-kilometre new railway will connect the Western Sydney Aerotropolis in the south with St Marys in the north – where customers can connect to the existing Sydney Trains suburban T1 Western Line. The NSW and Australian governments have a shared objective of having Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport operational when the airport open for passenger services.

CPB Contractors Ghella are completing the station boxes and tunnelling works for Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport.

Construction activities

Tunnelling contractor CPBG continues work over the next two months at the Orchard Hills Station site. Please see the map overleaf for work locations.

Most work will be carried out during standard construction hours **Monday** to **Friday 7am** to **6pm** and **Saturday 8am** to **1pm**. Some out-of-hours work activities will be carried out to mitigate quality and safety risks, and in line with the project Environment Protection Licence, Road Occupancy Licences, and Transport for NSW requirements. Surrounding residents and businesses will be notified in advance of any out-of-hours work.

The Orchard Hills site will continue with some work activities over the Christmas period, from **Saturday 23 December 2023** to **Monday 1 January 2024** and resume standard operations from **Tuesday 2 January 2024**. Over the Christmas period, works will include tunnel excavation, concrete works, concrete deliveries, crane and water treatment plant operation and spoil removal via haulage trucks. Regular security, environmental and safety monitoring of the worksite will also continue during this time.

Tunnelling work started at Orchard Hills in July 2023 and is progressing to Claremont Meadows. This work will occur up to **24 hours a day, seven days a week**. Follow the tunnel boring machines progress at <u>sydneymetro.info/journey-sydney-metro-western-sydney-airport-tunnel-boring-machines</u>

Out-of-hours work in December and January will include:

- Oversized plant and equipment deliveries including tunnel segment deliveries, survey, utility adjustments and concrete formwork
- Concrete pours and associated works up to six days per week from Monday to Friday 6pm to 10pm and Saturday 1pm to 4pm
- Tunnel boring machine component assembly
- Station box and tunnel excavation, and ground support installation
- Low impact work in the station box 24 hours a day, seven days a week





• Spoil removal via haulage trucks from Monday to Sunday 7am to 10pm

Standard construction hours work in October and November will include:

- Site wide concrete works, including formwork, for various structures
- Tunnel boring machine segment deliveries
- Commissioning and operation of a water treatment plant
- Installing tunnel dive structure drainage and concrete formwork
- Delivering and removing plant and equipment
- Safely removing hazardous materials, in line with SafeWork NSW and Environment Protection Authority guidelines, and Sydney Metro health and safety procedures
- Site photography using drone cameras above the construction site.

Out-of-hours work six-month lookahead:

Activity	Timing
Tunnel segment deliveries	December 2023 – May 2024
Concrete formwork, concrete, oversized plant and equipment deliveries	December 2023 – May 2024
Tunnel and cross passage excavation	December 2023 – May 2024

What to expect:


- Work activities will generate noise, vibration, dust and potential light impacts at night. Mitigation measures will be in place to minimise these impacts including noise and vibration monitoring, noise blankets, respite periods, dust suppression and directing lights away from residential properties
- Increased worker and vehicle movements in and around the work site.

Equipment used:

Includes (but is not limited to) traffic management devices, drone cameras, vacuum excavation vehicle, excavators, heavy vehicles and trailers, ride-on mower, drilling rig, profiler, asphalt roller, concrete agitators, water carts, mist-sprayers, pneumatic drills, concrete saws, mobile cranes, bobcats, chain saws, telehandler, power generators, compaction rammers, mulchers, light vehicles, specialist survey vehicles and equipment, spoil trucks, earthworks equipment, concrete pumps, piling rigs, bolting rig, shotcrete rig, tower crane, lighting towers, roadheader, tunnel boring machine components and tunnel segments.

Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes:

During these works, there may be some impacts to roads including increased heavy vehicle movements. For the safety of road users, traffic control will be in place when required to assist with any changes to traffic conditions.
