<u>Northern Sites and SMTF South – ER Inspection #174</u> – 30/01/2024 [Chatswood Weather (BOM Sydney Observatory) · 24.6 °C; Lowest 24.1 °C 2:57 am; Highest 24.6 °C 6:00 am; 0 mm of rain since 9 am · 24.7 °C; Lowest 24.1 °C 3:44 am; Highest 24.7 °C.

Marrickville Weather (BOM Sydney Observatory): 24.3 °C; Lowest 24 °C 2:32 am; Highest 29 °C 3:52 pm; 0 mm of rain since 9 am · 23.8 °C; Lowest 23.1 °C 3:26 am; Highest 30.7 °C]

- Chatswood: Offensive graffiti was observed at 2 locations on the hoarding around the corner of Pacific Hwy and Mowbray Rd which was promptly resolved by the contractor following the inspection.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPHI daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

No non-compliance was reported to the ER during the reporting period.

There was no incident for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. One Class 2 incident (classification C3 under SC's systems) was reported to the ER under A36 and A37 of SSI 8256 and is summarised below:

23/01/2024 - Dulwich Hill, Canterbury and Campsie traction substation sites Unexpected Asbestos Finds/Incident: A qualified occupational hygienist from SC conducted surface asbestos inspections at SM Linewide Traction Substation sites, confirming the presence of suspected bonded asbestos at Dulwich Hill and Canterbury. Laboratory analysis results confirmed asbestos in samples from these sites, while fragments at Campsie were deemed representative. No fibre cement fragments were identified at Lakemba and Punchbowl sites. The contractor immediately notified all relevant stakeholders including SM (who notified DPHI), ER, and Sydney Trains (who further notified NSW EPA, SafeWork NSW and Fire and Rescue NSW, Sydney Local Health District, Inner West Council and Canterbury Bankstown Council). Further investigations and actions continue, with further updates to be provided.



Complaints during this reporting period are summarised below:

16/01/2024 – A complaint received by the contractor via NSW EPA on 12 January regarding constant hum coming from Canterbury TSS. An update was provided to the complainant and NSW EPA by the contractor on 18 January noting the noise monitoring results (from previous monitoring undertaken in December 2023) being compliant to operational noise requirements.



Complaints are discussed where relevant for the Crows Nest ISD package below.

There were no non-compliances or incidents related to the project reported to the ER during this reporting period. There were no incidents reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400.

There were four Project related complaints during this reporting period, as summarised below:

- 09/01/2024 Noise (standard hours) The complainant was dissatisfied with the duration of capping beam removal works on Oxley Street between Pacific Highway and Clarke Lane.
- 10/01/2024 Notification of work, property–access and worker behaviour The complainant expressed dissatisfaction with work blocking across to their Pacific Highway building's driveway without notice.
- 14/01/2024 Traffic, transport & parking The complainant raised concerns about the visibility of Clarke Lane onto Oxley St (due to temporary works being undertaken on Oxley St), with site fencing on Clarke Street.
- 14/01/2024 Noise (OOH) The complainant expressed dissatisfaction with scaffold removal work occurring at 7 am on a Sunday. This is currently under investigation.

No ER involvement was requested in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas and ER Closing Comments

Core Focus Areas

- Continue to monitor OOHW and adjust as required.
- Risk-based inspections including Pacific Highway intersection OOHW and public domain work.
- Monitor public domain works for community impacts and appropriate sediment control.
- Monitor worker behaviour impacts on the community.

ER Closing Comments:

- The ER noted that the site controls had improved substantially.
- Improvement in Contractor understanding of approvals is still required, with related discussions held on-site with the Contractor during ER Inspection and weekly meetings.
- Ongoing ER inspections are targeted based on higher risk activities.

to be the busiest OOHW night observed. Notes during the inspection include:				
• PSS: Pitt St – Noted that minor dust was generated from the hammer during asphalt removal work.				

- CPB had water spraying set-up and increased the frequency of wetting down the area.
- PSS: Pitt St Noted that noise mitigation had minor gaps between noise blankets. CPB organised for the noise blankets /noise tent to overlap.
- PSN Pitt Street: Emergency work to replace the pedestrian road plate had commenced (ER noted these works were managed well). ER discussed with CPB that noise from compaction could be reduced by turning the compactor off on the sand. CPB agreed and discussed the practice with the site staff.



There was one Class 3 environmental incident reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period:

 Hickson Road spray paint_9 January 2024: The Hickson Road heritage wall was marked with spray paint by subcontractor, Whyte Civil while conducting service location for HV installation works. Hickson Road



wall is a part of the State Heritage Listed Dawes and Millers Point Precinct. The retaining wall was identified in the Watpac induction as requiring protection. The subcontractor attempted to remove the paint and was unsuccessful. Further/more vigorous cleaning attempts were stopped due to the potential to cause longer term damage to the wall. The incident was then reported to BW personnel. Specialist advice has been sought for the safe removal of the spray paint.

There were no non-compliances (NC) reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period.

The ER is not aware of any complaints received in January 2024 related to BESIX Watpac works.


ER Inspections

There was one ER inspection conducted in January 2024, 16/1/2024. Issues discussed and actions raised included:

- Light materials were observed to be stored under a tree adjacent to a site access in Keir Ave Hurlstone Park, and tree protection had not been established. Tyre marks indicated heavy vehicles were passing within the tree's drip zone with risk of impact to roots.
- The requirement for further clean-up / sediment removal from the hardstand at the North Terrace material storage compound, to reduce the risk of sediment entry to stormwater on North Terrace.
- Materials remained stored inside the unapproved proposed A17 Minor Ancillary Facility (MAF) in the Belmore Triangle. A Non-compliance was raised for this activity on 28/9/2023.







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Piling for the northern platform at Bankstown Station was complete and reo for beam installation had commenced. ERSED controls were in place and maintained in good condition to protect the open culvert below.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for SMC.

There was one non-compliance reported to the ER during the period:

Unapproved discharge, Bankstown (3/1/2024): Water that had accumulated in the excavation of a high voltage (HV) trench at Bankstown Station was pumped out and discharged into the cess within the rail corridor without testing the water quality or obtaining approval. Water did not reach the nearest stormwater drain or go off site. No material harm to the environment occurred. The water within the trench was subsequently tested and the pH was within EPL requirements. JHLOR raised the NC against water discharge procedures.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A36 of SSI 8256.

There were three Class 3 environmental incidents reported to the ER during the period:

- Tree damage, Bankstown (2/1/2024): While reversing a vacuum truck came into contact with two of the branches of Tree 1672, a large significant fig tree adjacent to the Bankstown Station work area. Post-incident actions included holding a Toolbox with onsite management (completed 31/12/23), and a spotter will be required in the future for all high vehicles entering the area. The Arborist was engaged to trim the damaged branches. All actions were verified and closed.
- Oil Spill Woolley Lane, Marrickville (16/1/2024): A concrete pump leaked ~40L oil into a plastic lined drip tray under the concrete line. Oil was cleaned up into buckets however the remaining 2L (on the plastic) was spilled to the surrounding ground during the final transfer of oil from plastic to bucket. Absorb was sprinkled over the surface. A shallow slice of soil was dug up down to a depth where there was no sign of oil. 20L of spoil was placed into plastic bags and disposed of. All actions were verified and closed.
- Slurry Spill Victoria Bridge, Marrickville (24/1/2024): The back door seal on the underside of a large mud bin failed when lifting the full bin onto the truck for transport offsite. ~200L of mud slurry (from piling activities) spilled to the road and footpath, entering the stormwater pit. The pit in the roadway was already protected with geofabric and a coir log. An estimated 2-4L of slurry seeped under the controls and into the pit. JHLOR reported the outlet pipe of the pit was blocked a third of the way up the pipe. The level of water/slurry inside the pit was lower than the top edge of the blocked pipe. No water/slurry moved into the pipe and no slurry went off site. The downstream open culvert was checked with no visual sign of the of slurry ingress.

The ER is aware of the following complaints received in January 2024 related to the SMC works:

- Complaint ID 5286 (Received 1/1/2024): Resident of Hurlstone Park complained about noise and light coming from the corridor. Respite had been offered but not accepted. Respite was again offered retrospectively, and the resident accepted and was happy with the outcome.
- Complaint ID 5290 (Received 3 & 4/1/2024): Resident of Hurlstone Park complained about noise and vibration. An offer of respite was confirmed and Alternative Accommodation (AA) was verified as not triggered. At the time of the first complaint, JHLOR works had not commenced. Videos and SMS messages were received throughout the night from the resident, but the data received was unable to be verified as accurate. Meta data times did not match times the resident was claiming the videos were taken. When this was discussed with the resident they became abusive.
- **Complaint ID 5299 (Received 8/1/2024)**: The same resident from Hurlstone Park above complained about the presence of a generator at the rear of their property. Noise modelling for the generator confirmed respite and AA was not triggered. The location of the generator is currently under review to determine whether a more appropriate location is available.
- Complaint ID 5301 (Received 5/1/2024): Resident complained about a work vehicle parked on the street. JHLORJV CRM rang the resident and advised that the vehicle was parked legally however have requested that workers park on corridor side of the road where possible to avoid parking in front of residents property.
- Complaint ID 5303 (Received 5/1/2024): Resident from Dulwich Hill complained about generator noise from the station. The generator is required for lift and lights on the Dulwich Hill Station overpass which links to the Light Rail. Noise modelling had been conducted and monitoring confirmed noise was within predicted limits. Noise attenuation was in place. It is understood the generator has since been removed.
- **Complaint ID 5297 (Received 7/1/2024)**: Resident from Dulwich Hill complained about generator noise from DH station. Refer above.
- Complaint ID 5303 (Received 9/1/2024): Resident from Canterbury called at about 7.30pm to complain about noise from rail activities (tamping conducted before 10pm). Noise was confirmed not to trigger additional mitigation.
- **Complaint ID 5302 & 5306 (Received 9/1/2024)**: Another two residents from Canterbury called at about 7.30pm to complain about noise from rail activities. Refer Complaint 5303 above.
- **Complaint ID 5308 (Received 12/1/2024)**: Resident from Marrickville was concerned about truck staging and associated noise. A new location for truck staging was being investigated.
- Complaint ID 5309 (Received 11/1/2024): Resident from Punchbowl complained of noise from works ongoing 24hrs a day and was unable to sleep. The resident had accepted respite and may be suffering the effects of construction fatigue. JHLOR and DTI were not working OOH on the 11 January and no deliveries to the area were received; the source of the complaint could not be verified.
- Complaint ID 5323 (Received 21/1/2024): Resident from Canterbury complained of OOHW, and enquired about Respite and AA. JHLOR CRM reviewed the noise model and trigger list and confirmed that the resident was eligible for AA but was not transferred to trigger list which notifies resident of offer. Respite was offered and accepted retrospectively.
- Complaint ID 5324 (Received 21/1/2024): Resident from Hurlstone Park complained about noise from rail activities. Noise monitoring was conducted and confirmed the resident was offered and accepted the correct additional mitigation measure of RO.
- Complaint ID 5326 (Received 21/1/2024): Resident from Canterbury complained of noise from rail activities and enquired about RO. Resident was eligible for AA but was missed in compilation of trigger list/ letters. Respite was offered and accepted retrospectively.
- **Complaint ID 5328 (Received 22/1/2024)**: Resident from Marrickville complained about traffic controller behaviour. An apology was issued and toolbox talk conducted with the subcontractor.
- Complaint ID 5329 (Received 22/1/2024): Resident from Hurlstone Park complained about rubbish disposal and worker behaviour. An apology was issued and toolbox talk conducted with workers.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.



Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks are consistent with out of hours works during possessions and maintaining compliance with the Tree Report process during security fence installation. The next possession with large scope is planned for the WE34 Possession (17-18th February). JHLOR and the SM comms team will need to focus on ensuring the correct level of respite is offered to residents, where triggered.

JHLOR are progressively being handed PC for stations along the S2B alignment and will need to manage environmental compliance / EPL arrangements as well as WHS arrangements effectively during this transition. It is understood that PC will be shared with other contractors until the handover process is finalised.

JHLOR should ensure ongoing that the use of any area is approved prior to activities commencing, including areas outside the project boundary that may require approval as ancillary facilities.

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Management of ERSED controls generally.
- Management of noise during OOH Work ongoing during possessions.
- Management of tree impacts during construction of security fencing along the alignment, and maintenance of the buffer zone.
- Management of PC and EPL obligations in station areas, particularly where PC is shared with other contractors.
- Compliance with the planning approval for the use of land outside the project boundary, including ancillary facilities.
- Defining new scope for new packaged awarded and ensuring CEMP and Sub-plans remain updated to document associated risks.


