



# **Project Update – Crows Nest Station**

March 2024

# Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD in 2024, with new metro railway stations at Crows Nest, Victoria Cross, Barangaroo, Martin Place, Gadigal and Waterloo, and new metro platforms at Central, and then onto Bankstown in 2025.

A W Edwards is building the new Crows Nest Station. Rail track installation and the stations main structural works are now complete and fit out and exterior works are almost complete.

# **Key activities in March**

An out-of-hours work calendar highlighting planned work nights has been provided on page 3. Further information about this work including work locations has been included below and will be included in our weekly e-news.

# Pacific Highway intersection upgrade works (out-of-hours work)

Oxley and Hume Street intersection works will continue throughout March. This will include up to three nights of high noise work each week. High noise work will be carried out up to 12 midnight and will involve saw cutting and hammering, and road resurfacing. Works continuing past 12 midnight include concrete pours, trenching with an excavator, road compacting and use of a vacuum truck. Activities planned to occur on other nights include cable pulling and installing new line marking.

#### Utility connections (out of hours work)

Prior to installing new street lighting poles along Pacific Highway, we need to replace and encase certain sections of watermain between Oxley Street and 360 Pacific Highway. Most of this work will be carried out during the day, however, replacement and encasement of the watermain will need to occur under three Sydney Water outages which are likely to be scheduled at night.

Additional work will be required under power outages to cutover new streetlighting and power connections. This work is generally not noisy but there may be periods of noisier activity, and these too are likely to be at night. We will notify ahead of these night works occurring, and Sydney Water and Ausgrid will notify impacted customers directly.

#### Clarke Lane service installation work (day work)

In March, access to Clarke Lane (north of Hume Street) will change while we complete stormwater drainage at the northern end of Clarke Lane between 22-26 Clarke Street driveway and Oxley Street.

Rather than accessing the laneway via Oxley Street, vehicles will be directed to enter and exit the laneway via Hume Street for a number of days at a time. We will provide a notification with more information to residents and businesses closer to the work date, including a map showing the changes that will occur.

#### Hume Street cycle lane (out of hours work)

In March, line marking for the new cycle lane on Hume Street between Pacific Highway and Nicholson Street is likely to occur at night. This work will be noisy as it involves use of a grinder to remove existing line marking. We will be in touch with further information and exact dates once known.

# What to expect

\*Noisy work:

- **Footpath and intersection upgrade work -** requires cutting and digging into the road pavement and cutting and installing underground traffic signal cables.
- **Utility works within the road and footpath** involves saw cutting, hammering, and drilling into footpath, use of angle grinders to cut through pipes, excavators, and compacting equipment.
- **Capping beam, retaining wall and foundation pile removal** involves saw cutting and jackhammering into steel and concrete
- Equipment used will include, but is not limited to, handheld and electric tools, power drills, cranes, elevated work platforms, excavators, generators, compaction equipment, jackhammers, lighting towers, concrete trucks, mixers and pumps, light and heavy vehicles, vacuum trucks, pavement and pipe cutters, welding equipment. Works that are non-intrusive can occur outside our standard construction hours and without notice.

- Some work will block sections of footpath and road, and adjacent parking spaces will temporarily be removed. Businesses remain open during works. Traffic control and signage will be in place to safely direct motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists through these changes. Please plan and allow extra time for your journey.
- More information on start and end dates, progress and any other important updates or changes will be provided in our weekly e-news.
- **Please note:** in March we will be working up to three nights per week at either the Oxley Street or Hume Street intersection.
- Non-noisy work may occur on other nights. Site lighting may be in place and parking may be impacted. You are not expected to hear this work.
- Exact work locations, any cancellations, and use of contingency shifts will be advised via email communications.
