Notification – Orchard Hills

March 2024

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport is the new metro railway line which will service Greater Western Sydney and the new Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport. A city-shaping project, the 23-kilometre new railway will connect the Western Sydney Aerotropolis in the south with St Marys in the north – where customers can connect to the existing Sydney Trains suburban T1 Western Line. The NSW and Australian governments have a shared objective of having Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport operational when the airport opens for passenger services.

CPB Contractors and United Infrastructure Joint Venture (CPBUI JV) are completing the surface and civil alignment works contract for Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport.

Work in March 2024 will include:

- Earthworks for the track alignment between Lansdowne Road and the Warragamba Pipelines
- Deliveries and placement of oversized infrastructure and sandstone material at Blaxland Creek,
 Patons Lane and Unnamed Creek
- Out-of-hours the Underslung Temporary Beam (UTB) will be relocated to Blaxland Creek to commence with installing the viaduct segments
- Out-of-hours construction of the concrete Viaduct abutments (on/off ramp) at Patons Lane South
- Concreting and formwork for the viaduct structures over Unnamed Creek
- Stormwater drainage installation and basin construction
- Finishing works including topsoiling, landscaping and installation of open drains and fencing
- Installation of permanent barriers and fencing
- Ongoing construction of access roads
- Transportation of excess spoil material from the project site
- Ongoing landscaping maintenance within the project boundary
- Fortnightly aerial land surveys of the surface alignment to inform the construction design and planning of the project.

What to expect:

- Work will be completed during standard construction hours Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 1pm. Nearby residents and businesses will be notified in advance of any likely out-of-hours work
- An increase in heavy vehicles entering and exiting the project alignment site via Patons Lane off Luddenham Road and Lansdowne Road and surrounding roads
- Surveying works will occur from a vehicle-mounted camera, surveyor on foot with a camera and tripod, and a drone to capture aerial data from construction sites
