

Monthly update – The Bays, Rozelle

March 2024

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, link new communities to rail services and support employment growth and housing supply.

Sydney Metro has been granted planning approval to construct twin underground rail tunnels between Westmead and Hunter Street in the Sydney CBD for Sydney Metro West. Acciona Ferroviaria Joint Venture (AFJV) has been awarded the contract to deliver 11 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate five new metro stations, including a station at The Bays.

John Holland CPB Contractors Ghella Joint Venture (JCG) has been awarded the contract to deliver 3.5 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Hunter Street and excavate the Pyrmont and Hunter Street metro stations. Both projects have established separate construction sites at The Bays with joint activities covered in this monthly update.

Construction update: The Bays Station site

Tunnelling and site establishment activities are continuing at The Bays Station site during March.

Work for Central Tunnelling Package (CTP) includes:

- Tunnelling activities
- Hoarding installation on Port Access Road
- Delivery and removal of materials to site

Work for Eastern Tunnelling Package (ETP) includes:

- Delivery and assembly of a tower crane and tunnel boring machines (TBM)
- Installation of tunnelling facilities including construction of a TBM slurry treatment and grout plant
- Construction of gantry cranes
- Scaffold, excavation, and ground support work
- Steel work, concrete deliveries and pours
- Utility, geotechnical investigation, instrumentation and monitoring work
- Installation of an internal pedestrian bridge over Port Access Road
- Delivery and removal of machinery and material to site

Work hours

Standard construction hours for the site are **Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm and Saturdays from 8am to 6pm** however some low impact work and deliveries of oversized machinery and equipment will occur outside these hours. Activities associated with tunnelling will operate **24 hours a day, 7 days per week**. Some work is also required outside standard construction hours to minimise traffic impacts or to ensure the safety of pedestrians, motorists, and workers. This out-of-hours work will take place between **6pm and 7am Monday to Sunday** in March. Work includes:

- Installation of an internal pedestrian bridge over Port Access Road
- Delivery and assembly of a tower crane and tunnel boring machines (TBM)

What to expect

- There may be some noise associated with the work, but we will try to minimise this as much as possible

- Strict safety and environmental controls will be in place for all work
- Vehicles will be parked within the construction site

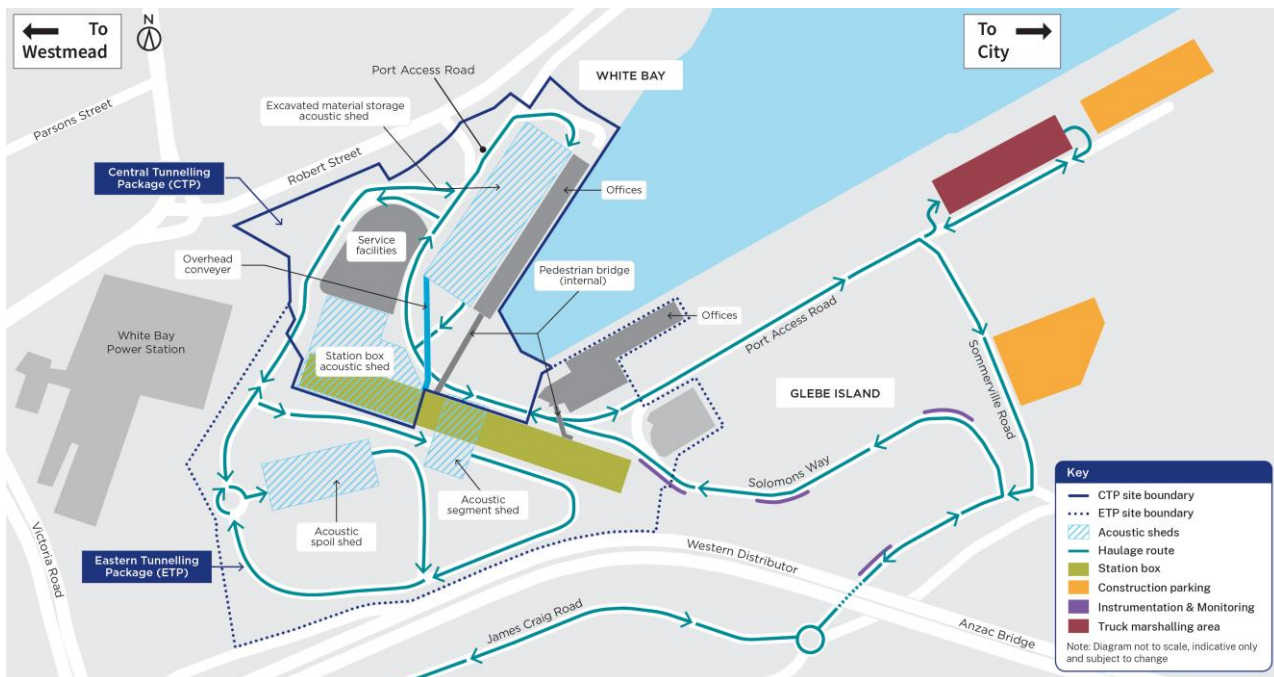
Equipment used

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to trucks, light vehicles, tunnel boring components, specialist tunnelling plant, watercarts, telehandlers, vacuum trucks, rollers, concrete trucks, concrete pumps, saw cutters, excavators, rock hammers, hand tools, lighting, cranes, elevated work platforms and drill rigs.

Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes:

Lane and road closures will be required on Port Access Road during some of our work. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists. Internal traffic management measures will be in place for work within The Bays construction site.
