

08/02/24 – WL ISD (Report only – C5); For context, documentation had been provided by the supplier of DGB material that it was in accordance with the RRO and had not identified asbestos in the samples taken and that materials were suitable to be imported to site. While sampling/testing the imported recycled DGB material in accordance with the RAP, for site validation purposes into area B6 (north station box adjacent to Raglan St near station entry), Asbestos Fines/Friable Asbestos (AF/FA) was identified in one sample (in the form of loose fibre bundles) of the imported DGB material. Further additional sampling, testing and analysis of samples was undertaken for asbestos; whilst asbestos was detected in one sample out of other samples collected, it was concluded that the ACM detection did not conform with the definitions of friable ACM, was below the reporting limit of the AS 4964 (2004) method and below the NEPM screening level. No further asbestos was identified visually or analytically in the follow up sampling with no further testing recommended and area considered safe for reoccupation.




One formal ER inspection was conducted during the reporting period on 14 February 2024. One action was raised relating to the use of a tonal alarm on an EWP at Martin Place South.



The ER is aware of one complaint received in February 2024 related to BESIX Watpac works:

 Complaint ID 5352 (5/2/2024): Complainant reported a rough road surface under Argyle Street at Dalgety bridge. The road in that section is temporary and has been certified by an independent road safety auditor.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks continue to reduce as excavations are filled in and more of the public domain and above-ground works near completion. ERSED remains a focus given the proximity of remaining works to the harbour. Water treatment remains a focus as long as the WTP is managed by the Construction contractor. The project is not currently assessing out of hours noise impacts from third party utility works, engaged as part of the CSSI. This is considered a risk and ER advice provided has indicated that OOH noise impacts should be assessed using the Sydney Metro Out of Hours Protocol, and appropriate additional mitigation applied, as a matter of due diligence regardless of the party undertaking the works.

- Weeds had become established in various areas within the Canterbury Compound. JHLOR has since prepared a plan of management for implementation.
- Materials remained stored inside the unapproved proposed A17 Minor Ancillary Facility (MAF) in the Belmore Triangle. A Non-compliance was raised for this activity on 28/9/2023. It is understood a lease agreement has been drafted and is with TAHE for signature. Once evidence of landowner consent is received the use of the area can be endorsed by the ER.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for SMC.

There were three non-compliance reported to the ER during the period:

- NCR A19 Use of Hurlstone Park MSB prior to approval (27/2/2024): A complaint was received on 27/2/2024 about the use of a generator at the Hurlstone Park MSB Minor Ancillary Facility (MAF). Upon investigation it was found the area was in use prior to endorsement of the MAF Assessment, which did not allow for the use of a generator.
- NCR REMM TC20 Temporary blocking of driveway (24/2/2024): Access to a resident's driveway near

the works at Livingstone Road, Marrickville was blocked temporarily. Traffic controllers offered assistance for the homeowner if she wants to get her car out. The restricted access resulted in a formal complaint. Road restoration works are now complete.

■ The third NC is associated with an incident at Belmore Triangle — refer to incident below, dated 3/2/2024.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A36 of SSI 8256.

There was one Class 3 environmental incidents reported to the ER during the period:

Tree Damage Belmore Triangle Wedge (3/2/2024): A tree in the Belmore Triangle Wedge was knocked down by reversing loader during stockpile maintenance and was unable to be salvaged. JHLOR was not approved to work in the area at the time, so a Non-Compliance with Condition A17 was raised, associated with the incident. The area is the proposed A17 Ancillary Facility, the assessment for which has not been endorsed due to pending issue of landowner consent.

NB: Minor spills to ballast and contained on site are reported in a register maintained by JHLOR.

The ER is aware of four complaints received in February 2024 related to the SMC works:

- Complaint ID 5368 (Received 18/2/2024): Canterbury resident complained of noise in the early hours
 of Sunday morning. Noise modelling confirmed the residence did not trigger respite, though as
 verification monitoring was unable to be conducted the resident was offered discretionary respite.
- Complaint ID 5371 (Received 19/2/2024): Query regarding respite, which resident had confused with a previous possession offer.
- Complaint ID 5384 (Received 24/2/2024): Resident called to complain about work taking place on Saturday on Livingstone Road bridge that was blocking access to their driveway. The Supervisor confirmed the driveway was blocked for a short period of time. JHLOR have raised a NCR with REMM TC20 in relation to the restricted access resulting in a complaint.
- Complaint ID 5387 (Received 27/2/2024): Resident complained about worker parking and the use of a caravan generator prior to 7am. Upon investigation JHLOR confirmed there was one worker's car parked on Railway Parade at the time of the complaint, and the generator was not switched on before 7am. The Ancillary Facility should not have been in use as the assessment had not yet been endorsed by the ER, and the use of the generator was not included in the assessment. A Non-Compliance was raised.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks are consistent with out of hours works during possessions and maintaining compliance with the Tree Report process during security fence installation. The next possession with large scope is planned for the WE39 Possession.

JHLOR are progressively being handed PC for stations along the S2B alignment and will need to manage environmental compliance / EPL arrangements as well as WHS arrangements effectively during this transition. It is understood that PC will be shared with other contractors until the handover process is finalised.

JHLOR should ensure ongoing that the use of any area is approved prior to activities commencing, including areas outside the project boundary that may require approval as ancillary facilities.
