Key Construction Activities During the Period

Following the completion of Sydney Metro construction work at Central Station, the new metro platforms have now been handed over to the operator Metro Trains Sydney (MTS).

Works conducted during the reporting period included:

- Metro Station Handed over to Metro Trains Sydney.
- Central Walk Opened and handed over to Sydney Trains and in use by the public. Some defect works ongoing.
- Platforms 16 to 23 In use by Public. Some minor defect works ongoing.
- North-South Concourse Opened and handed over to Sydney Trains and in use by the public. Some minor defect works ongoing.
- Northern Concourse Opened and handed over to Sydney Trains and in use by the public. Some minor defect works ongoing.
- Eastern Entrance Opened to the general public and handed over to Sydney Trains. Ongoing defects work.
- Sydney Yard Most of the Yard has now been taken over by other contractors working for Sydney Trains. Ongoing removal of plant and materials related to the Sydney Metro works by LOR. Ongoing removal of site sheds not required by Sydney Trains or their contractors with a few remaining which will be handed over to Sydney Trains. Some containers on-site storing various products. Most equipment and materials have been taken off-site or handed over to Sydney Trains contractors.
- Devonshire Street Tunnel In operation and used by commuters.
- ESR Concourse Works completed.
- Ghost Platforms (above ESR Platforms 24-25) Works completed.

Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

Sydney Metro have stated in a community notification that *In July at Central Station, MTS will be carrying* out *Trial Running* – one of the final stages of testing before metro services start in August. In the *Trial Running phase, MTS will prepare* for operations by running a range of field-based scenarios which are designed to imitate real-life timetable services and operational situations. This will involve running the trains to a timetable to ensure they are reliable, practising operational processes and procedures, and carrying out emergency exercises to assess the response to unplanned situations. MTS will not be carrying out any construction activity either inside or outside the station.

It is understood the following will still take place by LOR, the station construction contractor:

• Minor defects works are scheduled out to October 2024 at least, and will include OOHWs, often during weekend possessions when other contractors will also be working. The works will generally be minor in nature and include roof defects, drainage, tiling, painting, SYAB bridge defects. An OOHWs Application has been approved for the works with much of the work understood to be low impact.

ER Inspections

Given the low level of works remaining and that the project has been handed over, no ER inspection was conducted in June 2024 and no further ER Inspections are planned or scheduled.

The last ER Inspection for Central Station in March confirmed that most of the area is now managed by other Sydney Trains Contractors, with minimal plant and equipment left on-site relating to Sydney Metro. A small number of site sheds were still being used intermittently by Sydney Metro and LOR personnel.

– WL ISD Incident Report on 29/05/2024: For context, the Site Auditor identified that the contamination validation report noted that waste soil (approximately 130 t) left site on 25 and 27 March 2023 and was taken to a sub-contractor (Ferrycarrig's) depot and subsequently disposed by the sub-contractor to Met Recycling. Waste went to the sub-contractor's depot, where EPL did not allow for the storage of GSW and the facility that waste was disposed to (based on the dockets provided by the sub-contractor), the waste results exceeded the CT1 /Other Limits threshold of the receiving facility for some analytes.

It is understood from JHG that the Site Auditor has notified the EPA of above on 29/05/2024, and EPA requested further information on dockets and waste classification on 19/06/2024 and 25/06/2024. Requested information has been provided to the EPA, with no further information requested since.

JHG considers that the above incident has not resulted in environmental harm. It was agreed with JHG on 4/07/2024 that above incident is also recorded as an NCR against their CEMP and will be included further in next reporting period with actions implemented to address NCR.






