

Upcoming temporary bridge closure – Hurlstone Park overbridge

Weekend and night works - commencing Thursday 27 March 2025

To secure the rail corridor and safe operation of Metro trains, we are replacing the existing rail overbridge railings at Hurlstone Park with screen barriers.

Major traffic changes will be implemented while removing and replacing the overbridge railings, delivering over sized equipment and lifting structures using cranes.

Temporary parking restrictions and detours will be in place during the day and at night from 7am Friday 28 March until 5am Monday 30 March 2025. Access will be changed for some residents. Taxi zones and bus stops will be temporarily relocated.

The Floss Street car park will be closed for public use while we use trucks to deliver equipment for the installation. By utilising the Floss Street car park we are able to reduce impacts to street side parking and impacts to residents driveways. Businesses remain open throughout construction. Crinan Street is open.

Work will be continuous across the weekend, however we will take breaks from noisier construction work.

Friday 28 March, 7am until 5am Saturday 29 March	Local access only on Duntroon Street up to Hampden Street while crane is delivered and assembled on Duntroon Street. Noise from removal of bridge rails.	Crinan, Floss and Duntroon Street. Crane located outside 112 Duntroon Street.
Saturday 29 March 7am until 5am and Sunday 30 March	Crane movements are expected to install over sized beams and bridge screens. Resident access on Duntroon Street managed by traffic control.	On Floss and Duntroon Street at one side of the overbridge.
Sunday 30 March from 9.30pm until 5am Monday 31 March	Removal of equipment and material using trucks. Reinstatement of overbridge and road.	Overbridge open.



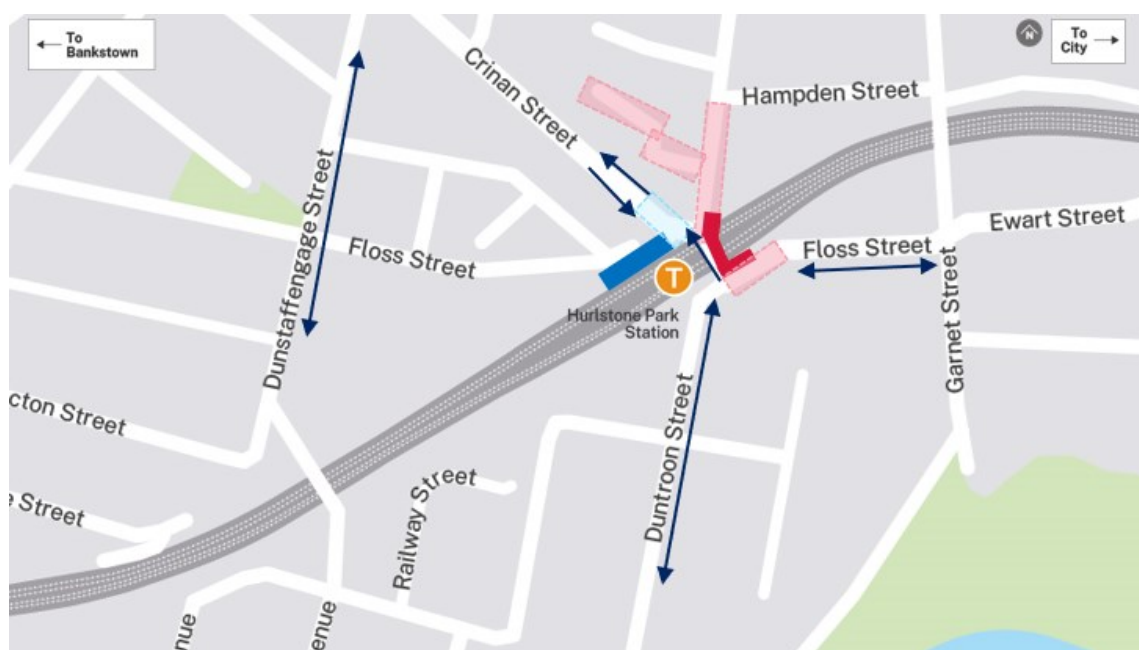
Deliveries may be noisy for short periods and will involve traffic controllers establishing signage and no parking areas, unhooking equipment, lights, and reversing beepers. We will be using crane equipment, hand held powered tools, elevated work platforms, truck mounted crane, tree trimming equipment, construction vehicles, over-sized trucks, delivery trucks, lighting towers and generators.

The team have carefully planned works to minimise impacts on local residents where possible, including adjusting the position of the crane to allow for the bridge to remain accessible, reduce access impacts to local businesses and residents by locating equipment to working during the day where we can, staging work to decrease commuter disruption, and ensuring bus services continue.

During these periods, Hurlstone Park overbridge will be reduced to one lane. Local access to Duntroon Street between Hampden Street and Crinan Street will be managed through traffic control. All other commuters will be detoured around the overbridge. Speed limits will also be reduced to manage the traffic flow during the work period.
