

Monthly update – North Strathfield

23 December 2025

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West –a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, link new communities to rail services and support employment growth and housing supply.

Sydney Metro has engaged Syscon to install a new kiosk substation and undertake associated civil works, as part of ongoing construction for Sydney Metro West.

Site maintenance and demobilisation work will continue to be undertaken by Acciona Ferrovia Joint Venture (AFJV).

Construction activities: January 2026

Electrical kiosk installation work, site demobilisation and maintenance works within the North Strathfield metro station site and site compound will continue during January. Most of these activities will be carried out during standard construction hours:

- **Monday to Friday** between **7am to 6pm**, and **Saturday** between **8am to 6pm**

Work will involve:

- installation of an electrical kiosk within the site compound including internal cabling work
- installation of conduits and low voltage (LV) cables
- saw cutting for internal electrical work
- concrete removal of internal electrical trench
- relocation of switchboard and generator within site compound
- excavation of and electrical pits at trenching locations on Queen Street and Waratah Street
- modification of hoarding, excavation and concrete pours within the site compound
- setting up traffic management
- temporary and permanent restoration at trenching locations and within site compound

Sydney Metro station site maintenance and demobilisation work may involve:

- delivery and removal of machinery, equipment, and spoil from site
- traffic management for oversized deliveries and collections
- lifting operations in station box
- maintenance and upkeep of station, tunnel and local areas
- dewatering and water treatment
- facilities decommissioning
- crane mobilisation and demobilisation

Holiday period construction shutdown and Australia Day public holiday:

There are no major construction activities scheduled over the holiday period for **Saturday 22 December 2025** until **Sunday 4 January 2026**. Some minor station site maintenance works may continue over this period. No construction activities are scheduled to take place on the Australia Day public holiday on **Monday 26 January 2026**.

Out-of-hours work

To minimise disruption to local traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians, and workers, trenching and some site repair work must be undertaken outside standard construction hours. Out of hours work during this period:

- **Sunday, 4 January between 6pm and 7am** – installation of low voltage (LV) cables and utility pole and temporary restoration at trenching locations on Queen Street and within the site compound

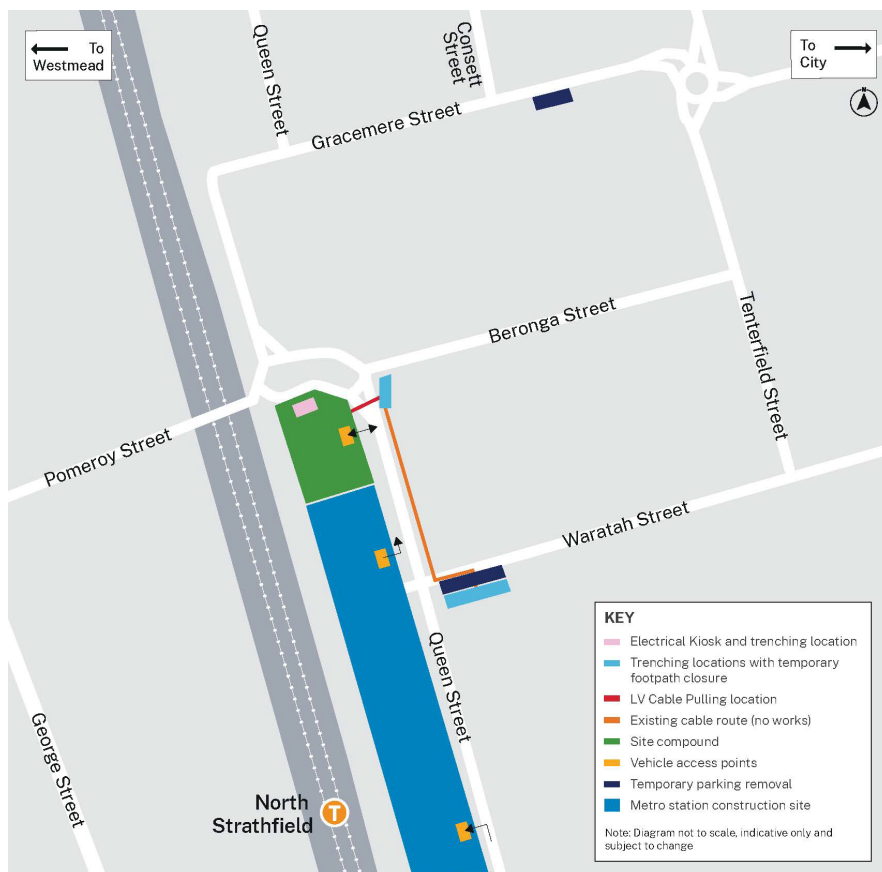
Changes to traffic and pedestrian routes:

To facilitate access to work areas and safely operate machinery, there will be:

- Temporary short-term parking removal on Gracemere Street and Waratah Street
- Temporary short-term footpath closures on Queen Street and Waratah Street
- Traffic controllers and signage to direct pedestrians
- Access to businesses and driveways will be maintained unless prior arrangements are made with affected stakeholders
- Parking will be reinstated and footpaths will be reopened after every working shift.

Equipment used: includes (but is not limited to) elevated work platforms, lighting towers, surveying equipment, excavator, tipper truck, roller, concrete pump, compressors, grinders, rattle guns, welding equipment, water cart, sweeper truck, anchoring rig, vac trucks, concrete saws, generators, tilt trays, bobcats, forklifts, hand tools, trucks, light vehicles and crane (when required).
