Out-of-hours work

North Strathfield metro station

21 August 2026

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, transforming Sydney for generations to come. Sydney Metro West will target an opening date of 2032.

Gamuda has been awarded the contract to design and construct the five new metro stations at Westmead, North Strathfield, Burwood North, Five Dock, and The Bays.

Sydney Metro has engaged John Holland to deliver the Linewide project. Delivering 60kms of track across the network, installation of rail systems and construction of Sydney Metro West's 38-hectare stabling and maintenance facility in Clyde.

Out-of-hours work

To minimise interruption to local traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers around the site, some work must be undertaken outside standard construction hours.

Out-of-hours work will be carried out from:

- **9pm Saturday 29 August until 6pm Sunday 30 August 2026**

This work is to facilitate the delivery of equipment, mobilisation and demobilisation of a 400-tonne crane, and lifting of plant and equipment into the station box.

Work includes:

- Gate and barrier adjustments
- Setting up traffic management, signage and detours around the area
- Delivery of machinery and equipment
- Mobilising and demobilising a 400t crane on Queen Street
- Lifting plant into the station box



Temporary road closure and traffic changes on Queen Street

The following temporary traffic changes are required on Queen Street between Wellbank and Waratah Street to support this work:

- **Temporary removal of the parking lane on Queen Street from 6pm Friday 28 August until 5am Monday 31 August 2026.** Traffic will continue to operate in both directions until 9pm Saturday 22 August 2026
- **Temporary closure of Queen Street from 9pm Saturday 29 August until 5am Monday 31 August 2026,** a detour will be in place. The road may open to traffic earlier pending progress of work.

In the event that vehicles are parked on Queen Street between Wellbank Street and Waratah Street, owners of the vehicle will be contacted by Police and the vehicles towed to a nearby parking spot in the area.

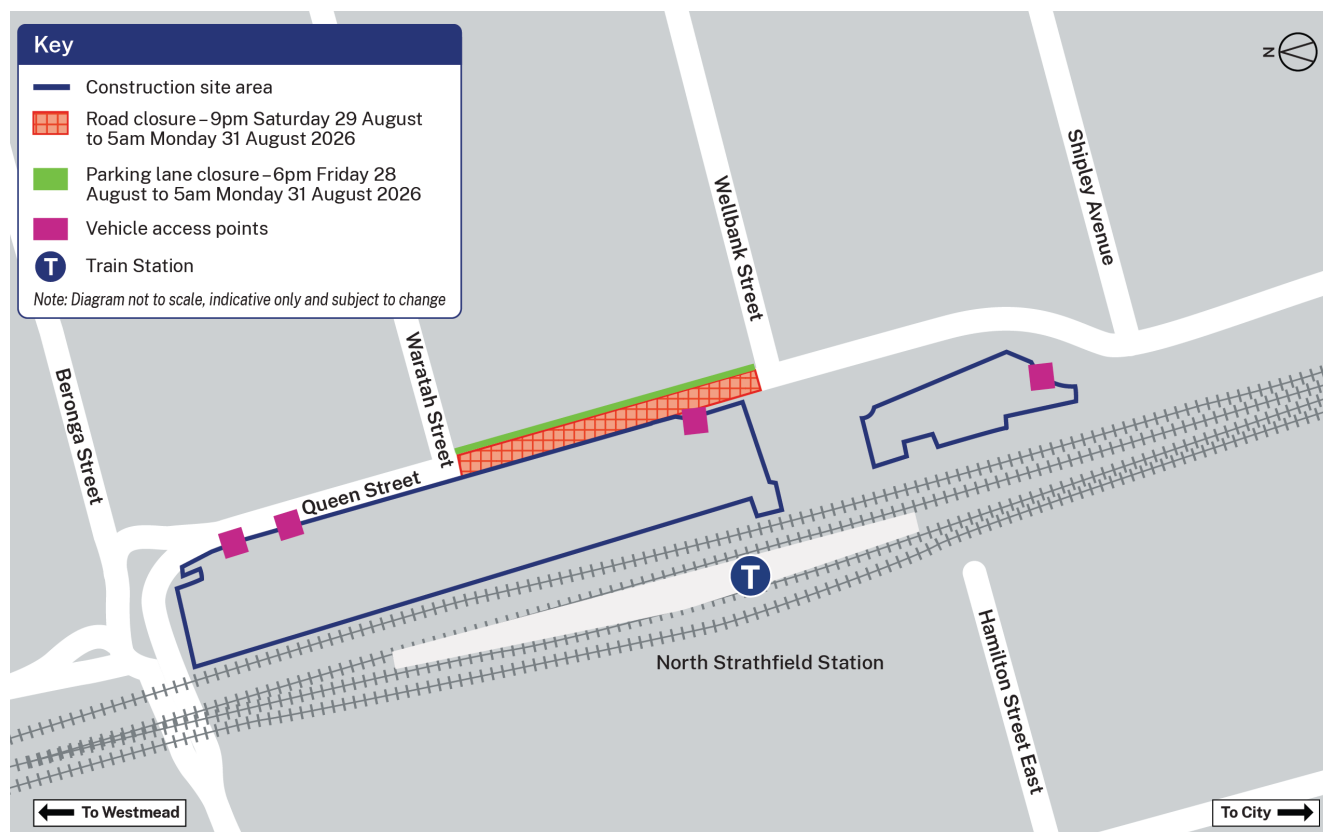
What will this mean for you?
