

Notification – Southwest Metro

Belmore - October 2021

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. There will be new CBD metro railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central.

In 2024, Sydney will have 31 metro railway stations and a 66 km standalone metro railway system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. There will be ultimate capacity for a metro train every two minutes in each direction under the Sydney city centre. The upgrade of the T3 Bankstown Line to metro standards between Sydenham and Bankstown received planning approval on 19 December 2018.

In October, work will continue along the corridor and at Belmore Station (weather and site conditions permitting). Access to the rail corridor will be via existing rail corridor/pedestrian access gates. **Day work will be undertaken Monday to Friday 7am-6pm and Saturday 8am-6pm.** All work activities are subject to relevant approvals and will be tailored to the evolving Covid-19 situation at the time. Around Belmore Station and at the services building site (off Redman Parade, adjacent to the rail line)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivery and removal of material to and from the Redman Parade site compound • Drainage and utility works at the services building site on Redman Parade • Installation of electrical contaminants at station concourse area • Piling work for radio repeater mast • Internal fit-out & mechanical work for station platform building • Removal of Billboard on Redman Parade • Installation of ATF on either side of Belmore station • Work in the Services building site including stormwater drainage, utilities work, installation of building elements and combined services route work.
Lakemba substation, north of The Boulevarde, west of Taylor Street	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Installing a temporary power connection, site amenities and commencement of excavation • Delivery and removal of materials • Vegetation removal and tree clearing • Formwork reinforcement and concrete pouring • Traffic controllers to facilitate trucks movements on The Boulevarde

Out-of-hours work

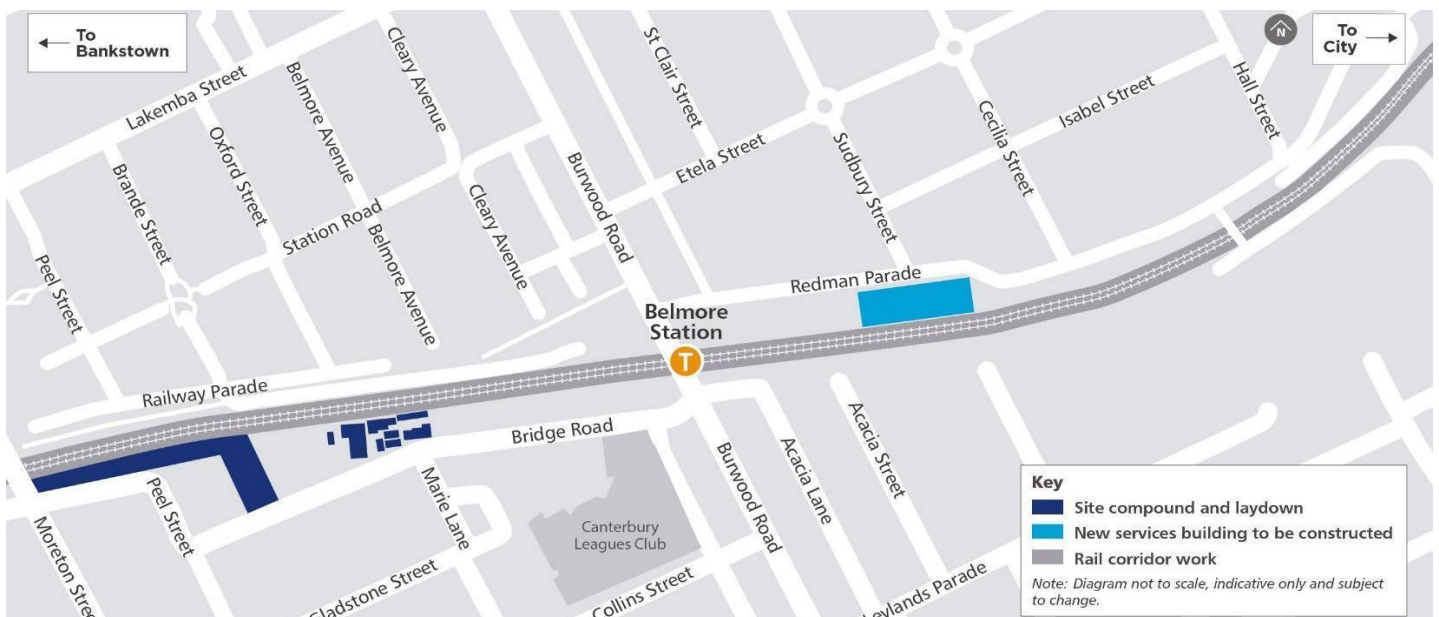
Due to the nature of some activities and for the safety of workers, some work will occur outside standard construction hours when trains are not running. Some equipment will also be delivered outside standard construction hours in line with Transport for NSW requirements for the movement of oversized vehicles. Properties in proximity to scheduled works will be notified prior to works starting. More information about this work is provided below and over the page.

Mid-week works between 6pm and 7am Friday 1 October to Friday 29 October 2021 for no more than 3 nights per week (in addition to daytime work)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Installation of signal equipment and cable pulling • Various site investigations and surveys including but not limited to non-destructive digging, soil assessments, geotechnical investigations and surveys for drainage, utilities, and fencing

<p>October rail possessions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • From 8pm Friday 15 October to 5am Monday 18 October 2021 • From 10pm to 4am Monday 18 October to Thursday 21 2021 • From 8pm Friday 22 October to 5am Monday 25 October 2021 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Installation of cable service routes and galvanised steel troughing (GST) • Modification work associates with overhead wire structures • Excavation and pilling in preparation for new retaining wall within rail corridor • Piling work on Burwood Road for installation of anti-throw screens (there will be a single lane closure and pedestrian detours will be in place) • Tree trimming within the rail corridor • Non-destructive digging work for GST pile on post • Piling for the installation of GST posts • Closure of Redman Parade and Tobruk car parks • Foundation work for trackside equipment and track survey mark installation • Piling for light posts on the station platforms • Installation of electrical containment station and light fittings on platform 1 & 2 • Surveying and non-destructive digging at the substation site

Equipment used for all the above work will include excavators, jack hammers, vacuum trucks, slashers, motorised saws, concrete trucks, sucker trucks, delivery vehicles, borehole drillers, rollers, generators, whacker packers, dump trucks, wood chippers, mulchers, grass cutters, telehandlers, drilling rigs, lifting machinery, elevated work platforms, bobcats, concrete pumps, cranes, cable pulling equipment, road sweeper, compactors, lighting towers, forklifts, chainsaw, water carts, vibrating plates, and hand and power tools.

Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained at all times. There may be some noise, dust and vibration impacts associated with these works which at times will be loud and disruptive. We will take every possible step to minimise noise such as switching off equipment when not in use and using non-tonal reversing beepers. **Where temporary footpath changes, car parking removal or lane closures are required for works, traffic control, pedestrian detours and signage will be in place to assist the community.**
